

Saint Anselm Parish Mission Statement

Our mission is to imitate Jesus Christ by loving and serving all people in and outside our community. In cooperation with the Abbey, the Priory School, and the Archdiocese of St. Louis, we strive to share the love of God.

Brief History of Saint Anselm Parish

St. Anselm Catholic Church is in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Parish origins and present life are closely linked to the Benedictine community of St. Mary and St. Louis Abbey.

In the early 1950s, a delegation representing Archbishop Joseph E. Ritter delivered a formal invitation to the Benedictines at Ampleforth Abbey in England to establish a monastery and a college preparatory school for boys in St. Louis. The invitation was accepted, and the first monks (Frs. Columba, Luke, and Timothy) arrived in October of 1955.

On March 19 of the same year, the Priory of St. Mary and St. Louis was incorporated. After some searching, the firm of Hellmuth, Obata & Kassabaum was chosen to design Priory buildings, including the church now shared with the parish.

When Cardinal Ritter established the parish of St. Anselm in August 1966, he chose Rev. Robert P. Slattery as pastor to serve the rapidly increasing population of West County.

Fr. Columba invited Fr. Slattery to use the monastic church until a new church could be built on Ladue Road. A relationship that began as a temporary accommodation deepened and, in May of 1968, representatives of the Archdiocese and the Benedictine community signed agreements that the parish of St. Anselm be formally constituted on the grounds of St. Louis Priory. At this time, agreements concerning the sharing of expenses and buildings were drafted. In 1972, Monsignor Slattery built a Parish House and, later, a Parish Center that contains offices, classrooms, assembly rooms, and a kitchen.

In March 1981, Msgr. Slattery was appointed Director of Catholic Charities and, in accord with the agreements of 1968, Archbishop May offered administration of the parish to the Benedictine community. Fr. Timothy Horner, O.S.B. was appointed pastor and confirmed by the Archbishop on May 31, 1981. On June 16, 1989, St. Louis Priory became an abbey, and Prior Luke Rigby was elected the first abbot. On reaching retirement age. Fr. Timothy submitted his resignation as pastor. Fr. Benedict Allin, O.S.B. was appointed Parish Administrator for one year starting July 1, 1995. Fr. Thomas Frerking, O.S.B. was elected abbot of the Benedictine community to succeed Abbot Luke in June 1995. On July 7, 1996, Fr. Gerard Garrigan, O.S.B. was appointed pastor. In a letter to members of the parish dated March 28, 2012, Abbot Thomas Frerking, O.S.B. with approval of Archbishop Robert Carlson, announced the appointment of Fr. Michael Brunner, O.S.B. as pastor effective November 1, 2012. Our current pastor is Fr. Aidan McDermott, O.S.B., who was installed as pastor on January 26, 2019.

Fr. Gerard was appointed Pastor Emeritus and Fr. Benedict became Senior Priest in Residence of the parish.

Several monks of St. Louis Abbey also assist in the pastoral care of the parish, including Fr. Finbarr Dowling.

Saint Anselm Facilities

The many activities of an active parish require facilities for meetings, social gatherings, and athletics. To maintain our facilities and coordinate their use requires guidelines, which are intended to best serve the needs of all.

Our facilities include:

PARISH CENTER - This building houses the Parish Offices and offers use of the auditorium and various classrooms for parish or Archdiocesan-sponsored events for religious, educational, or charitable purposes. **PARISH HOUSE -** This facility is used for adult small group gatherings.

Permission to use the facilities must be obtained from our Director of Business Administration in the event of a non-parish affiliated event. The normal procedure for use of the parish facilities is to call the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 to communicate the day/time/facility requested, or email parishoffice@stanselmstl.org to start the process.

Parish Administration

THE PASTOR, Fr. Aidan McDermott, O.S.B., acting on behalf of the Archbishop, has the spiritual care of the parishioners. As a leader of the people of God, he works to help them become a living community of faith through worship, community life, service, and instruction in the faith. THE PASTOR EMERITUS, Fr. Gerard Garrigan, O.S.B. remains involved in the pastoral work of the parish. THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR Fr. Francis Hein, O.S.B. serves the parish with the pastor by celebrating the Mass and other sacraments, visiting the sick and overseeing various parish ministries, among other responsibilities. The pastor should be consulted about funeral arrangements upon the death of a parishioner. The priests are also available for spiritual guidance and counseling. **PERMANENT DEACONS** have both a liturgical role and a service role, which may be exercised in or beyond the parish.

PERMANENT DIACONATE - Permanent deacons are clerics who can perform all of the functions associated with their order. These include proclaiming the Gospel, preaching the homily, assisting the priest at Mass, celebrating Baptism, distributing Communion, presiding at funeral and burial services (but not celebrating the funeral Mass), acting as the official witness at weddings, and exercising certain ecclesiastical offices. Men 32 years of age or older who wish to consider this service should consult the pastor. Deacon Charlie Durban is our permanent deacon.

Parish Committees

- **THE PARISH COUNCIL** is a consultative body, mandated by the Archbishop of St. Louis, whose purpose is to consider all important matters in the life of the parish and to advise the pastor in matters concerning the good of the parish community. For Your Information

- **COMMUNION CALLS** Any parishioner who is unable to attend our Sunday liturgies may receive Holy Communion at their home. Please contact the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 or *parishoffice@stanselmstl.org* if a member of your household is seriously ill or incapacitated in some manner.
- **FUNERALS** Our parish wants to assist you in whatever way we can in such a time of great need. Normally a Mass is celebrated at St. Anselm followed by burial at the chosen cemetery. The pastor generally presides; other priests are welcome to concelebrate. Funeral arrangements are made in consultation with the family, the funeral home, the parish priest, and the Director of Music. Ministry members are available to house-sit during the wake and/or funeral, as well as serve a catered or home-cooked meal following the funeral. For more information, please contact Fr. - **HOSPITAL VISITS** Hospitals are no longer allowed to inform us of admissions. Please call the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 or *parishoffice@stanselmstl.org* when family members are admitted to the hospital.
- **JONAH PRAYER MINISTRY** Jonah Prayer Team Ministers are trained by the Archdiocese of St. Louis. All prayer requests are kept confidential. For more information, contact Helaine Boland at helaineb@ymail.com.
- MARRIAGE LAW Marriage is a covenant by which a man and woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, which of its very nature is ordered to the well-being of the spouses and to the procreation and upbringing of children. Many times going through the divorce process can be as painful as death; a divorced person needs the comfort and strength received from Reconciliation and Communion, as well as the support from other Catholics. Divorced Catholics who have not remarried and are in full communion with the Church can receive the sacraments. Divorced Catholics who remarry before their previous marriage is annulled should not receive the Sacrament of Communion. Catholics in these situations are still members of the Church and should attend Mass regularly and be involved in the prayer life of his/her parish.

All divorced Catholics have the opportunity to seek an annulment of their marriage, no matter the length of the marriage or the number of children involved. The annulment is *not* an effort to assess blame for marital breakdown, but to understand its root causes and to determine if a sacramental marriage truly existed.

- **ENGAGED -** The first step is to call the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 or *parishoffice@stanselmstl.org*. The parish makes the basic arrangements, takes the couple through the pre-nuptial inquiry and FOCUS, and discusses the ceremony itself (readings, music, etc.). The next step is one of the following preparations: Engaged Encounter, Weekends for the Engaged, weekend programs, Preparing for Christian Marriage, or a series of videos and talks at various parishes. Precepts of the Church

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in its Compendium, enumerates the following five precepts or commandments of the Church:

- You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and remain free from work or activity that could impede the sanctification of such days.
- You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- You shall receive the sacrament of Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
- You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

Sacraments

BAPTISM – In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in His wisdom. Baptism takes away original sin and gives us a new birth in the Holy Spirit, Who moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever-deeper love. Dates and times for baptism, as well as baptismal preparation sessions for parents anticipating the baptism of a first child, are arranged by contacting the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 or parishoffice@stanselmstl.org.

CONFESSION (SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION) -

Confession is an experience of the gift of God's boundless mercy. Through Confession, if we are sorry for our sins, we receive God's forgiveness and healing grace through absolution by the priest. This sacrament is offered in the Abbey Church on Sundays 30 minutes before Masses; on Tuesdays/Thursdays at 5:00 p.m.; and on Saturdays after the 7:30 a.m. Mass or at 4:30 p.m. It is also offered once each semester for PSR (Parish School of Religion) students and their parents. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is also available on request by contacting the Parish Office at 314.878.2120 or parishoffice@stanselmstl.org.

HOLY COMMUNION – The celebration of the Eucharist in the Holy Mass is the "source and summit" of our faith. In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist, "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained." (Catechism of the Catholic Church) Our PSR students prepare for and receive their First Communion in the 2nd grade.

CONFIRMATION – In the Sacrament of Confirmation, a baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit", and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ. Confirmation is celebrated at the parish annually. 8th graders must attend the program designed to prepare them for this sacrament. Confirmation Teachers - These catechists, under the direction of the Director of Religious Education, assist in the preparation of the 8th graders to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Classes begin in September; the Confirmation Mass and ceremony is usually celebrated in April. MARRIAGE – Marriage is a covenant, which is more than just a contract. The commitment of marriage implies mutual support and affection, and total faithfulness to one another in body and spirit. A couple intending marriage should approach the pastor or a deacon as soon as possible after engagement. St. Anselm follows the common policy of the Archdiocese of St. Louis that requires an assessment phase and a preparation phase for individuals before their marriage. A minimum of six months will be needed between initial contact and the marriage. The priest or deacon will outline the different options available, and the Director of Music will assist the couple with wedding music preparation. HOLY ORDERS/RELIGIOUS LIFE – Discernment is the prayerful process of discovering what God's plan is for your life, and the unique way He has called you to love and serve Him, either through marriage, religious life, or the consecrated single life. ANOINTING OF THE SICK – This sacrament unites a sick person's suffering with that of Jesus and brings forgiveness of sins, as well as the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties of serious illness or old age. Anointing of the Sick may be administered to a Catholic prior to a serious operation, in the event of serious illness, for anyone who needs the Lord's healing power, or because of the immediate possibility of death. The sacrament may be received at church, in the home/ hospital, or wherever circumstances dictate. 



St. John Baptist de La Salle was proclaimed patron saint of teachers in 1950.
