



## History of St. Ann Parish

St. Ann Parish has a long history and a rich heritage beginning with a donation of land from the family of Madame Anne Lucas Hunt, who inherited a sizable portion of land at the death of her brother, Charles Lucas. Their father, Jean Baptiste Charles Lucas, who had been attorney to the King of France, had emigrated to the United States and served as a congressman from Pennsylvania. In 1805, he was appointed by President Jefferson to serve as land commissioner of the Louisiana Purchase Territories. It was he who named the area Normandy, because the terrain reminded him of his home country. His son Charles had an opportunity to purchase 1150 acres in this area, which he willed to his sister Anne.

In 1854, Madame Lucas Hunt donated funds and ten acres of land to the Jesuit Fathers on the condition that they “attend to the congregation and open a school for the children.” A small temporary chapel built in 1855 was succeeded the following year by a larger frame structure, named in honor of St. Ann, the patron saint of Anne Lucas Hunt. Father Peter DeSmet, S.J., the famous missionary to the Oregon Territory was at this time at his home base in Florissant. He was appointed the first pastor of St. Ann Church. He served in this position for two years, during which time he supervised the construction of the stone church. Then he headed west again to resume his missionary work.

In 1858, Fr. Adrian Van Hulst, S. J., succeeded Fr. DeSmet as pastor. He lived at St. Louis University and traveled by horse & buggy to celebrate the Sacraments at St. Ann on every Sunday and holy day. He enlarged the church to accommodate the large congregation in 1872, and served as pastor until 1880.

By the 1940's the stone church could no longer hold the burgeoning population, and the construction of the present church began in 1949. The auditorium of the school was converted into a temporary chapel in the interim. The original stone church was torn down and its stones became the retaining wall around the present structure.

1860 marks the oldest burial in St. Ann's Cemetery. St. Ann's Parish was administered by the Jesuits until 1889. The Passionist Fathers were then given the administration of the church, as they had just built the monastery at Lucas and Hunt and Natural Bridge. They administered the parish until 1948 when the St. Louis Archdiocese assigned diocesan priests to the parish. Monsignor Fred Sprenke was named the pastor.

The cornerstone of the present church was laid Nov. 26, 1950, with Archbishop Joseph E. Ritter officiating. The first Mass was offered in the new Church on October 6, 1952, and with proper ritual and ceremony, St. Ann Church was dedicated by Archbishop Ritter. Msgr. Sprenke served as pastor until his death in 1971. He was succeeded by Fr. Robert Ottoline who was followed by Fr. John Vogler, Fr. Richard Neumann, Fr. James Edwards, Fr. William Kempf and Fr. Nicklaus Winker. Fr. Nicklaus Winker is the current Pastor.

# History of St. Ann School

In 1858, St. Ann School opened. It taught all of the children in the area, regardless of their religion. The Sisters of Mercy, who had their novitiate just behind St. Ann Cemetery, were the first religious teachers at the school. In 1884 this order transferred their novitiate, sold their property and gave up their work at the school. For a short time, the Good Shepherd Sisters, whose property also adjoined St. Ann, taught in the school. In September 1896, the Sisters of Loretto started teaching in St. Ann School.

The school grew and the number of Sisters grew. In 1905 a new 5 room frame school house was completed. In the autumn of 1913, Father Stephen, C.P., requested that the teachers of St. Ann be permitted to reside in Normandy. Since 1899, they had traveled back and forth each day, by streetcar, from Florissant. The old parsonage at the right of the church was converted into the convent for the teaching nuns.

Still the school was growing and on March 22, 1926 a new brick building was completed. At that time it comprised nine school rooms, an auditorium and a parish hall. With a larger school came the need for more teaching Sisters, and the need became greater for a larger convent. December 16, 1928 was open house for the parishioners to visit the new convent. Additional classrooms were added to the school in 1931.

The Sisters of Loretto served the school for many years. In 1971 the school had a lay principal for the first time. The school has classes in kindergarten through eighth grade and offers a before school and after school program.

St. Ann also has a preschool, which operates from the former convent building. Our formal education for our youngest members can now begin as early as age 2, our emphasis on computer skills and search for new tools for learning continues as we seek ever fresh ways of proclaiming the gospel to all creation.

The community served by St. Ann School has undergone tremendous changes throughout the years. In the late 1800's and early 1900's the community was rural and fairly isolated from neighboring communities. After World War I and II the Normandy community grew into a wealthy and middle-class suburb of St. Louis. Housing in the area included exclusive and middle class homes. St. Ann community remains a very tightknit, close community. Some of the children in St. Ann School are the second and third generation in their family to attend the school.

# St. Ann Early Childhood Center

St. Ann's Early Childhood Center began as a vision in 1996 to incorporate an early childhood education program into the St. Ann School curriculum and its K-8 program. Many volunteer hours and dollars raised by parishioners and other donors turned the vacant convent building into a beautiful, age-appropriate facility for children 2-5. The doors opened in September, 1998 and since then our school has grown into a full-day center enrolling both part-time and full day students with a goal of creating a loving atmosphere where children are excited about learning. SAECC is proud to have been continuously accredited by state agencies since its opening nineteen years ago.

## Ministries

### **ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL WORKER**

Each May the Archdiocese of St. Louis conducts the Annual Catholic Appeal campaign. At the parish level we need volunteers to help distribute pledge cards and follow up with parishioners to ask for their support.

### **ALTAR SERVER**

Young people in the fifth through eighth grades and beyond assist the liturgy as altar servers. They enhance the dignity of the celebration and help the service to run smoothly.

### **ART AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE**

The Art and Environment Committee works for the beautification of the church interior and exterior. If you have an interest in architecture, liturgical space designing, this committee is for you.

### **ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION/COACHING \***

St. Ann is proud of our youth athletic programs. We have teams for soccer, volleyball, track, basketball, baseball, golf, softball, and chess. We are always in need of good coaches and of people with organizational skills.

### **FAITH ALIVE IN THE HOME\***

The Faith Alive in the Home program encourages faith development among families with young children. Facilitators visit families and their children in their homes and bring a variety of faith activities. Facilitators receive training and resource. Families with toddlers or pre-school children are encouraged to take advantage of this resource.

### **BUILDING COMMITTEE**

Maintaining buildings is a relentless task. There is a maintenance committee whose members are always open to new workers, especially those with some skills.

### **CHOIR/INSTRUMENTAL**

Music is provided at all Sunday liturgies and important celebrations. We encourage participation of the entire congregation. Can you sing or play an accompanying instrument? We could use your skills at our Sunday and holy day liturgies.

### **EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION**

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament happens periodically. Volunteers are needed to commit to an hour. In the future we hope to return to starting after 8:00 a.m. Mass and concludes with Benediction at 3 PM on the second Friday of each month. Dates and times are announced in the Parish bulletin.

### **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION**

A special privilege presenting to the people the Lord's Body and Blood. At large liturgies members of the assembly assist in the distribution of communion to the faithful. ### **FIELD TRIP CHAPERONES/DRIVERS \***

The classes in school go on several field trips during the year to enhance their learning. Parents assist the teachers as chaperones and drivers, but other volunteers are welcome.

### **FINANCE COMMITTEE**

Do you have expertise in accounting, money management, or marketing? The Finance Committee advises the pastor on the administrative realm of parish life. Members are appointed by the pastor.

### **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**

St. Ann has a council of the Knights of Columbus. This fraternal organization can do great works for our parish and beyond.

### **LECTORS**

Lectors are members of our parish who volunteer to proclaim the Word of God, clearly and from their hearts, for God's faithful people. Information may be obtained by contacting Fr. Nick Winker.

### **LITURGY COMMITTEE**

The Liturgy Committee helps lead the members of the parish to a more effective expression of faith in worship through the Sunday and special liturgies throughout the year. Would you like to use your talents to enhance the liturgical celebrations? Contact Fr. Nick Winker.

### **MARKETING COMMITTEE**

The Marketing Committee is a group of school staff and parents working to communicate a vibrant and positive image of the school community to both current and potential school families. Using events like the New Parent Social, Open House, Back to School Night, and more, the Marketing Committee highlights the best St. Ann has to offer and works to promote interest and enrollment at St. Ann.

### **MEALS ON WHEELS**

Volunteers are needed to give a few hours of time to deliver lunchtime meals to the elderly and housebound or convalescent people who cannot prepare a hot nutritious noon meal. Drivers and workers are needed. Volunteers interested in giving a few hours of time, as well as persons in need of these services are urged to call Mary Lou Krueger at 385-0586.

### **MEN'S CLUB**

The Men's Club gives financial support to the entire athletic program for boys and girls of St. Ann Parish. It sponsors the Monsignor Sprenke Soccer Tournament. The club is active in social functions of the parish as well as assisting other organizations with their projects. The Men's Club meets on the last Wednesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. Please do not feel that you need an invitation to attend one of the meetings. All men of the parish are welcome and encouraged to be members of the Men's Club.

### **PARISH COUNCIL**

The Parish Council consists of 9 members who serve a three-year term. New members are chosen each year from among volunteers. The parish council meets on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. They do not meet in July, August, or December. They deliberate the challenge of calling St. Ann to be a community of faith and a leaven in the neighborhood.

### **PRO-LIFE COMMITTEE**

The Pro-Life Committee promotes life from conception to death. Pro-Life is active in seeing that all pro-life issues are brought to the parish for action.

### **RCIA**

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, also known as the Catechumenate Program is always looking for sponsors to assist those desiring to enter the Church to live a vibrant Catholic life. When there are enough interested people classes meet weekly from September through Easter to instruct adults interested in learning more about the Catholic Faith. Private instruction is also available. Anyone who would like to share the gift of faith with others can be a helper in this program.

### **ROOM PARENTS \***

Each classroom in the school and preschool has at least one parent (fathers are welcome to apply if they are available during the school day) who coordinates extracurricular classroom activities such as holiday parties.

### **CHURCH CLEANERS**

This group volunteers take on various jobs clean the sanctuary and wash and iron the altar linens and assist the maintenance staff in cleaning the church and making it presentable for the weekend.

### **SCHOOL BOARD**

There are nine members on the school board who are elected to serve a three-year term. We need three new members each year. They advise the pastor and school principal in making policies for the parish elementary school.

### **SPONSORS' DINNER DANCE AUCTION COMMITTEE**

The Sponsors' Dinner Dance Committee plans and executes the biggest parish celebration and fundraiser of the year. Alumni, parishioners, and friends gather for an excellent night of dinner, shopping and dancing to celebrate the St. Ann parish family and raise funds to secure its future. Since 1970 when it was just a Sponsors' Dinner Dance it has grown to include a very successful auction and a place of prominence on many peoples' social calendars. Parishioners have the opportunity to be involved in a variety of ways from serving on the committee to just giving an hour or two. Volunteers are needed to ask for donations, set up, decorate and participate in the event on any level or as many levels as they would like. ### **SCOUTING \***

Scouting is a unique opportunity for our young people to experience nature, good health habits, crafts, etc. Brownies, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts all need strong adult leadership. The scouting program provides training in service as well as life and leadership skills.

### **ST. PATRICK'S CASSEROLE PROGRAM**

As a part of a wider outreach of services, St. Ann parishioners prepare casseroles on a timely schedule to be delivered to St. Patrick Parish in downtown St. Louis, where they are served to the hungry.

### **ST. VINCENT DEPAUL SOCIETY**

The purpose of the St. Vincent DePaul Society is to fulfill the two great commandments of love of God and love of neighbor. The primary function of the organization is to assist needy families without regard to race or creed. The members of St. Vincent DePaul Society meet one evening each week, 7:00 p.m. to be angels of charity, to administer the resources contributed by our parishioners to help those in the greatest need.

### **VOLUNTEERS\***

Many tasks come up in the parish, school or preschool which are not the clear responsibility of any one staff member. If you have office skills, could help with a mailing, help to supervise the playground during recess, or with other occasional tasks, we could use your help.
