About Our Parish

St. Julie Billiart Parish was formed in 1989 when St. Stephen, St. Mary and St. Veronica parishes merged. The Parish that emerged was built on the rich heritage of the three.

Our parish is named after the foundress of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, in honor of all the teaching Sisters of Notre Dame who taught thousands of Hamilton's children who attended parochial schools.

Our church building dates from 1854 and in 1982 was listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The beautiful building lends itself to worship that strives to be engaging and sensitive to the diversity of age and culture represented in the Parish community.

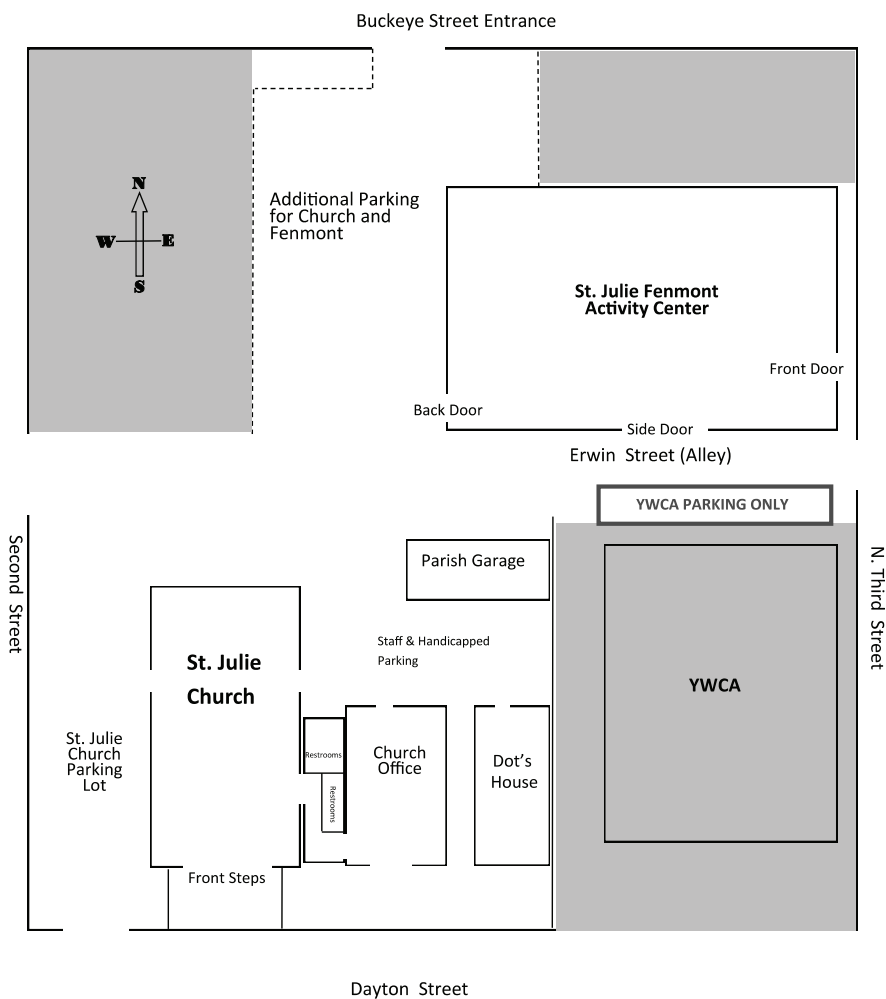

Parish Religious Education Program (PREP)



The Saint Julie Billiart Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) is committed to a dynamic partnership with parents in the religious education of their children. Parents are the primary educators of their children. Parents model the saving love of Jesus Christ in their actions and words and teach their children from infancy throughout their lives. At Baptism parents make a promise to God and the church to undertake the responsibility

of providing Christian formation for their children, and the church promises to assist the parents in this responsibility. The Religious Education Program tries to assist parents to build on and continue Christian formation with formal classes. This partnership between parents and the religious education program requires ongoing communication, collaboration, and trust in God's love and guidance. Parents and children attend several class sessions together throughout the year.

Children and teens anticipating reception of First Communion and Confirmation should participate in a religious education program at least one year prior to the celebration of the sacrament. For instance, if a parent wants his or her child to receive First Communion in second grade, the child must attend class for all of first grade and second grade. Children who are preparing to receive the sacraments and are home schooled will be asked to participate in retreats or other special programs designed to help in faith formation of all the children in the parish.

PREP meets on Sunday mornings, 10:20-11:30 AM, at the Fenmont Center. Classes are held for K-8th grades. High School PREP classes for youth in grades 9 through 12 are also offered. These classes may be held at different times.

Registration for the following school year is held in April with classes beginning the following September. Registration before August 1st is \$50.00 and after August 1st is \$60.00. During COVID 19 classes are held online through ZOOM.

Together with parents, the St. Julie Billiart Religious Education program staff hopes to instill and nurture a love for Jesus Christ and His church, a growing understanding and lifelong participation in the sacraments and a habit of regular prayer and Christian Service.

In the name of Jesus, we ask you, heavenly Father, to bless our endeavors, so that our children may grow in wisdom and grace.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process for both adults and children to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist – by nurturing their conversion in the Christian way of life and belief. The RCIA is for adults and school-aged children, age 6 or 7 and older, who are not baptized or have been baptized in another Christian tradition. This is a year-round process so that anyone can begin at any time of the year.



The RCIA intends catechesis (education in the Catholic faith) to be more than classroom learning of Catholic dogma. Based on the rhythms of the Church's life of worship, particularly the Lectionary "cycle of readings," teaching consists of examination of the Church's creed, engagement in the life of the parish, participation in the parish's prayer and an active involvement in the parish's apostolic life.

The RCIA team invites people who desire to share their Catholic faith, life and gifts to join the RCIA team as sponsors, greeters/hospitality, catechists, and Breaking Open of the Word session leaders.

Music Ministry

Members of the music ministry lead the sung prayer of the assembly. There are opportunities for psalmists, cantors, singers, guitarists, percussionists, brass players, woodwind players, and other instrumentalists. This ministry does assume a basic ability to sing or play. Choir practices are Thursday nights at 7:00 PM in the church. Additional practices are added as needed near Christmas or Easter. Additionally, the choir has a concert as part of the German Village Christmas walk. As a separate ministry, there is also a funeral choir that provides music at funeral liturgies. Altar-Rosary Society

The Altar Rosary Society is a ministry of the St. Julie Billiart Church whose primary purpose and goal is to increase devotion to the Blessed Virgin and to support and enhance the parish's liturgical needs by cleaning and replacing articles in the sanctuary area (including the altar, altar linens, candles, votive candles, and vestments) as needed for liturgical celebrations, to supply the bread and wine for all Masses, and to render assistance when necessary. A member of Altar-Rosary leads the rosary before all Masses at our church.

Covered dish luncheon meetings are held in February, April, June, August, October, and December (birthday party for Baby Jesus) on the first Monday of the month in the Fenmont Center following the 12:00 NOON Mass. Officers include the president, vice president, secretary and treasurer.

New members (men and women) are invited and welcomed from all age groups. Dues are \$10.00 per year and are due the first of the year.

Baptismal Preparation for Parents of Young Children

The Church in general and St. Julie Billiart in particular, looks forward to the baptism of children of the Parish. We hope to share in some way in the excitement of parents. At the very beginning of the Rite of Baptism the priest or deacon reminds the parents that, in asking that their child be baptized, "You are accepting the responsibility of training them in the practice of the faith."

The Parish also has the responsibility to nourish the developing faith life of the child through our own witness to the Catholic faith. Parents seeking baptism for their child will be accompanied on this journey by members of the parish. In this sense, it takes a full community, parents, godparents, and parish, to raise a child in the faith.

To help parents and godparents better understand and reflect upon this two-fold responsibility, parents are expected to be active Catholics and participate in the baptism preparation program. You certainly may participate in this preparation prior to the birth of your child. Preparation for a first child consists of two classes on the first and third Saturday of the month. Registration with Lisa Stricker in advance is necessary.

Godparents are asked to present signed documentation from their current parish attesting that they are actively practicing our Catholic faith. A date of baptism is not set until the parish office has received the forms from the Godparent's parish. Godparents are invited to attend the Saturday morning classes with the parents.

Bereavement Ministry

The Church calls each member of Christ's Body to participate in the ministry of consolation: to care for the dying, to pray for the dead, to comfort "those who mourn." (Order of Christian Funerals, #8)

The goal of this ministry is the continuing development and implementation of a parish bereavement ministry that answers the need to serve grieving people in a special way.

At the present time the bereavement ministry consists of liturgy planning, the presence of a choir, greeters at the liturgy and St. Julie's Heavenly Kitchen.

The Heavenly Kitchen helps coordinate and host a reception at our Fenmont Center or at the home of the family in need, following a funeral liturgy conducted by our parish for one of our members. Volunteers of this committee, The Angel Brigade, prepare food, host the reception, or drop off food to the family home. This committee is a great way to reach out to fellow parish members in their time of need. For more information about this group contact one of the Chairpersons listed below.

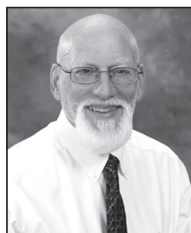

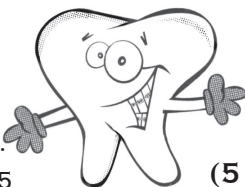

Marriage Ministry



Marriage is the unique Sacrament which binds one man and one woman together in a covenant under God and His Church. It is a Sacrament of vocation, a response to a specific calling that God has placed in the hearts of a couple. It is a bond that lasts for life which is permanent, faithful, and fruitful. Marriage is not just about two people, but is the foundation of the family, the “domestic church,” the most basic and

foundational structure, not only for the Church, but for all of society.
