

# Opportunities To Serve Ministry of Administration

Each parish has a Parish Pastoral Council.

The overall goals of Parish Pastoral Council are:

- To serve as a vehicle of dialogue and communication among members of the Parish Family;
- To encourage communication among all members of the parish and resolve conflicts in the practical working out of programs of various committees, associations, and commissions;
- To provide advice and counsel to the Pastor.

#### Parish Fund Raisers

**Fish Fry Committee:** This committee coordinates the annual St. Paul Parish Fish Fry, which is held every year. Responsibilities of our ministry include: calling on volunteers to work the Fish Fry, soliciting for donations for our gift baskets, and, of course, preparing food and spirits for the night of the event. **Reverse Raffle Committee:** This committee coordinates the annual St. Rita Parish Reverse Raffle, which is held every year in February. Responsibilities of our ministry include: calling on volunteers to work the Reverse Raffle, soliciting for donations for our gift baskets and Silent Auction, and, of course, preparing food and spirits for the night of the event. Holiday Bazaar Committee: This committee organizes and coordinates with local crafters and gifters for this annual event for holiday shopping purposes, many of whom are our own parishioners. They are also involved with the sale of live Christmas wreaths, handmade crafts, Christmas cards, the Second Hand Holiday Booth, and the Cookie Walk. # **Ministry Of Worship**

**Altar Servers** assist the priest during the liturgies. Their roles include carrying the processional cross and sometimes incense and candles. They hold the proper liturgical book for the presider and perform other functions that enable the celebration to flow in a reverential manner. This ministry is open to all youth and adults, 5th grade or older. Training is required and provided. **Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist** distribute the Body and Blood of Christ to fellow Catholics at Mass. They assist with set up of Communion vessels prior to Mass, assist Mass celebrant with the distribution of Holy Communion, and properly clean and store the vessels after Mass. This ministry is open to those who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Training is provided. - **The Lectors** proclaim the Scripture at all Masses, Sundays and weekdays, and special liturgies, such as Vespers. The ministry of the Lector is of utmost importance to the life of the Church, for the Lector proclaims God's living Word. A training session is provided after which Lectors are scheduled on a rotating basis. - **Mass Coordinators** make sure all Liturgical Minister are signed in five minutes before Mass begins and finds replacement in the congregation for ministers not accounted for. - **The Ministers of Hospitality/Ushers/Greeters** are there to greet those attending Mass, to distribute the Worship Aids, and to answer questions. They are also there to help with members of the congregation who require special assistance. During Mass they take up the offering. At the end of Mass they distribute bulletins and wish the departing friends "a good day." - **In Music Ministry** there are many ways parishioners of all ages can become involved, primarily through the singing assembly. Below is a description of how one can participate. If interested in any one of them please contact the Office of Liturgy and Music 937-276-5954 at Precious Blood.

**Adult Choir:** This choir leads the sung prayer of the community regularly for Sunday and major holydays throughout the year.

**Instrumentalists:** Parishioners who play musical instruments are invited to consider sharing their talent with the community. Instrumentalists are always welcome, especially during the Christmas and Easter seasons.

**Cantoring:** The role of the Cantor is to support and lead the singing assembly and to proclaim Psalms. To this end Cantors must be competent not only as singers but as leaders of prayer. Persons interested in becoming a parish Cantor need not be members of any choir. Cantors provide leadership in singing Sunday and Holy Day Masses as well as parish celebrations of the Liturgy of the Hours.

**Handbells:** Hand bell ringers contribute to our worship at Precious Blood by periodically playing during Mass.

**Sacristan/Environment Committee** takes care of the Sacristy, altar linens, candles; wash and iron the albs or have dry cleaned the vestments and keep them in repair; clean and polish all the sacred vessels; and order supplies. The Environment Committee oversees everything that has to do with the church environment and what is used in it. The committee members take care of enhancing the church and narthex (entrance) for the liturgical seasons and ordering flowers for feast days. #### Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy is offered at Precious Blood Church and St. Paul Parish. All children age 5 through Grade 5 are invited to be dismissed following the Opening Prayer in church. A trained catechist will lead the children with the Sunday readings from the Children's Lectionary, which is then followed by discussion. The children return to church during the Offertory.

The Funeral Committee sees that all is in order and ready for a Funeral Mass/service. They prepare the altar and church for a Funeral Mass, serve as altar servers, and toll the bells. Other duties include preparing the pall for the casket, handing out the liturgy aids, being Eucharistic ministers, and ushering.
