



General Information

PARISH REGISTRATION

Parish registration is available in several ways. Registration packets are available in the Welcome Center and Gathering Space or in the Parish Office. They may be mailed to you by calling the Parish Office, or you may register online at the parish website. If you are over 25 years of age and still listed your parents file, please register on your own.

RESTROOMS

Women's and Men's restrooms are located down the hallway on the left corridor off the Gathering Space, (near the cry room) as well as on the lower level of church (Wooldridge Center), at the bottom of the stairs.

CRY ROOM

The cry room is located at the end of the hallway near the Women's restroom, down the left corridor off the Gathering Space.

CHILDCARE DURING MASS

Complimentary childcare during 10:00 AM Mass is available in the Early Education Center. Enter the west school entrance, closest to 9 Highway. No age restrictions or registration is required.

LOST AND FOUND

Marked cabinets and drawers in the Usher's Room store lost and misplaced items. The Usher's Room is located down the right corridor off the Gathering Space. These items are purged annually in the fall.

OUR LADY'S GIFT SHOP

The gift shop, located down the right corridor off the Gathering Space, is open before and after all weekend Masses.

The church AED is located in the Gathering Space, along the south wall. Training for this, as well as for CPR, is provided regularly through the parish.

Parish History

Driving up Highway 9 in Southern Platte County, two miles north of the small, centuryold town of Parkville, is the community of St. Therese Catholic Church and School. Established in 1950, it has grown from a small congregation of 75 people to a parish of over 3,000 families. In the past 50 years, the parish has encountered the many challenges facing any large organization. With new companies relocating employees within the parish boundaries and established businesses occasionally laying off personnel, the parish sees an average of 50 families being added or dropped on a monthly basis.

The formal establishment of St. Therese Parish was authorized by Bishop LeBlond after careful consideration. He sent Fr. Thomas Brett, who celebrated the first official Mass on Easter Sunday, April 9th, 1950, in the chapel of the former Leland Francis Funeral Home, now the Heritage Funeral Home. The families were delighted with their first pastor, as his goal was to have a permanent church, with room for future expansion. The present property, consisting of 12-13 acres, was purchased from Noble Johnson, a former Platte Countian. The acreage was perfect - setting high, with a beautiful view and room to grow. Plans were made and the first of several groundbreaking ceremonies were held on February 11, 1951, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The first building was the parish center, with a church and school located upstairs, and nun's quarters downstairs. This original building served for 20 years as the church.

Though most of the people were poor, they were strong in spirit. They struggled and sacrificed to give their children a Catholic education. No child was refused into the school and the number of Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth teaching at the school climbed as the parish grew rapidly. Expansion was on the minds of many. A convent was built in 1955 to house the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth, and later the Sisters of Francis of Savannah came to St. Therese. Eventually both orders left as a result of a decline in the number of those entering the religious teaching order. Peak growth between 1973 and 1976 commanded that additional space be built to the school. In 1977, a new wing added 11,000 sq. ft. allowing for 6 classrooms, library, administrative offices, faculty and music rooms, as well as religious offices.

The next expansion to the complex, in 1965, included a rectory for the resident priests, which at one time housed as many as five priests and a housekeeper. Just as Platte County experienced steady growth, so did the parish. There became a real need for a new church, as the gym was small and inadequate and needed for what it was - - a gym. A church, seating about 650 persons, was dedicated on March 12, 1972 by Bishop Helmsing. Little did anyone realize then that within another 20 years, this facility would again be outgrown.

With the increase in outside-the-home working mothers, the need arose for loving, Christian childcare. A three-story building, housing a Child Care Center, Pre-School and Kindergarten classrooms and meeting space was added in 1991. The Early Education Center, as it is now called, has grown steadily in enrollment reaching a capacity of 260 children.

The Catholics of Southern Platte County have shown persistence and determination as they have continued to strive for a place to worship and education their children. Today, the parish of the "Little Flower," as St. Therese is sometimes known, is extremely large, encompassing the entire southern half of Platte County.

After a couple of years of overflow Masses the time had come to decide on the future of the St. Therese community - divide the area and start another parish or build to accommodate the crowds. After research, discussions and several Town Hall meetings, the decision was made to build on the present grounds. The convent was eliminated and a new 1,500 seat church was constructed. All anticipated with great pride and joy the dedication and blessing of the new worship space by Bishop Raymond Boland on January 14, 1998.

Planning for the future was at the forefront of many minds, as a diocesan-wide millennium study and the arrival of a new century showed that Platte County was still in line with anticipated growth. Needless to say, expansion was a high priority. Families faced with the thought of limited Catholic education, pushed for improvement and some type of development.

Again, Town Hall meetings and gatherings provided insight to what many wanted - - a NEW SCHOOL!! Excitement was building with groundbreaking underway in July of 2002. Plans called for the first phase to be completed for the start of the 2003 school year. Final occupancy took place in December of 2003. Eventually, demolition included the elimination of several buildings - - the old church, school, and rectory - - making a property regrade possible to accommodate additional parking. The following year, a central fountain was placed in the courtyard, located where the old church was.

Many outstanding pastors and associates have served our parish family since its founding. Among them - Msgr. Thomas Brett, founding Pastor; Msgr. Denis A. O'Duignan; Msgr. Victor G. Moser; Rev. Frank Lackamp; Rev. T. James Hart; Rev. Michael Roach and our present pastor Rev. Joseph I. Cisetti, who has been an associate several times.

Serving as associate pastors have been; Rev. Bernard Branson; Rev. Lloyd Opoka; Rev. Lawrence Walsh, J.J.; Rev. Francis McGlynn; Rev. Terry Bruce; Rev. James Healy; Rev. David Schwartze; Rev. Harold Powell; Rev. Rick Dierkes; Rev. Michael Roach; Rev. Jerry Schuster; Rev. Bradley Offutt; Rev. Francis Carey; Rev. Michael Arciga; Rev. John McCormack; Rev. Philip Watanabe; Rev. Joseph Cisetti; Rev. Justin Hoye; Rev. Duc Nguyen; Rev. Evan Harkins; Rev. Kevin Drew; Rev. Patrick Tobin and currently assisting is Rev. Randolph Sly. With a parish of this size, as with any large institution, it may seem difficult to have a personal congregation, but the various clubs and organizations, numbering around 50, attempt to bring people together in Christian activities. Making Platte County a better place to live is what many St. Therese parishioners strive for - - many through their works and deeds, while others succeed through their words and prayers. All in all, the people that belong to St. Therese are a dedicated group: sincere and devout, they are as intent as their predecessors to give themselves and their children the best they can. We live out this mission through our prayer, worship and ministry.

Administrative Community Pastoral Council

This group assists and advises the Pastor, primarily through the development and implementation of a parish vision and a Pastoral Plan. The Pastoral Plan is aimed at achieving long-term strategic goals that focus on enhancing the Seven Essential Elements of Parish Life - Community, Liturgy, Faith Formation, Stewardship, Leadership, Pastoral/Social Ministry and Spiritual. The Pastoral Council gathers information from throughout the parish, its ministries, and its parishioners to develop the strategic goals and the objectives that will help the parish achieve them. This information also assists the Finance Committee in developing annual budgets.

The Pastoral Council meets twice a month, typically on the first and third Wednesday evenings from 6:30-8:30 PM in the Birkel Meeting Room. Council members are selected through a process of discernment and must be willing to make a 3 -year commitment. The current council members are Marilee Altenhofen, Julie Carnes, Pam Devling, Jo Dixon, Kathe Menown, Mary Noland, and Michael Rucereto. If you would like to discuss an issue with the Pastoral Council, feel free to contact any member or the Parish Office.

Finance Committee

This committee meets monthly to review fiscal matters of the parish and school. Periodically, they report to the parishioners and school families on such matters. In July, they review and approve the Annual Finance Report which is submitted to the diocese. Its members serve in an advisory capacity to the Pastor and Business Manager. Current members, serving 3-year terms are: Linda Braun-Anderson, Dale Chaney, Dan Cummings, Brad Grill, Joe Mandacina, and Ann McCoy.

A parish-wide calendar is maintained through the Education & Parish Center and Parish Office to ensure coordination and communication of all parish events and activities. Bulletin - The weekly parish bulletin is a tool for providing information and faith formation in (and beyond) our parish. **Printed without cost** to St. Therese (the expense is covered by the ads taken through the publisher/printer by local businesses and benefactors), the "deadline" for submitting requests to the bulletin is Friday afternoon, 8 days before the publication date. Prayers for Sick Bulletin List - The names of those listed in the bulletin are **parishioners** who have requested prayers for **themselves only**. This list is added to or removed from periodically, based on the improved health of the parishioner. A call to the Parish Office must be made by the individual or family member, to comply with HIPAA guidelines. Prayer requests for friends and family members who are not parishioners will be forwarded to the intercessory prayer chain.

Intercessory Prayer - A large group participate in this ministry, receiving prayer requests via phone or email and start praying for this intention. Prayer is in private and with whatever time you can give and no request is too small or too big for Jesus. He has answered many prayers and blessed not only those who are prayed for, but for the person praying as well. Sacramental Prep

Baptism - The Baptismal Preparation class is held on the THIRD MONDAY of the month, at 7:00 PM in the Birkel Meeting Room. (There is no class in December.) This class prepares parents for the Sacrament of Initiation. First-time parents are required to attend. Parents who have had over a 3-year interval between baptisms are encouraged to attend. Baptisms are scheduled on Saturday, following the 4:30 PM and on Sunday, following the 12:00 PM Mass. To register for the class or to schedule a baptism, contact **Susan Tomelleri**, 741-2800, ext. 213.

First Communion & Reconciliation - These sacraments are typically prepared for and celebrated by children in second grade, both those attending St. Therese School and those in the Religious Education program. Preparation is shared between the parents and the child's religious formation class. Children in grades three through eight, who are baptized Catholic but have not yet received these sacraments, will receive instruction from parents in the home also and through a special class in the Religious Education program. Preparation for First Reconciliation begins in the fall and is received by children when parents determine they have sufficient knowledge and understanding of the sacrament. Preparation for First Eucharist begins in January and the celebrations are held during weekend liturgies throughout the Easter season. Parents assist in the preparation of these sacraments by attending adult formation sessions to receive catechesis on these sacraments. Confirmation - Is a Sacrament of Initiation and completes Baptism. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are increased to provide the strength to live out God's call to serve the Church in various ways, especially through faithful witness (CCC 1285).

Youth preparing for this sacrament begin fall of their freshman year and are confirmed within six months. The program used is called *Chosen: Your Journey Toward Confirmation*. The goal of the program is to offer your teen a powerful, lifechanging experience as he/she prepares to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is our hope that *Chosen* will not only offer your child a thorough knowledge and understanding of the Catholic Faith, but will also win over their heart at this critical time in their life. The program has been carefully designed to address and answer their fundamental questions about life, and to challenge him/her to embrace a life of faith. Let's face it - our world is full of distractions and detours that can easily set a young person on the wrong path. Nothing can take the place of a strong faith in God: not friends, money, or education. It is our faith that gives us our identity and our direction in life. Marriage - Registered members of the parish are welcome to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage in our church. Couples are asked to contact the Parish Office a minimum of 9 months prior to a desired wedding date, or as soon as you become engaged. Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) - is the process by which adults are fully initiated into the Catholic faith community. This program, offered on Thursday, 7:00-9:00 PM, encompasses four formation periods: Pre-catechumenate (Inquiry), Catechumenate, Purification & Enlightenment and finally, Mystagogia. Pre-catechumenate begins with sessions familiarizing inquirers with the process and giving them the opportunity to ask questions about the Catholic Church. Inquirers meet once a week to receive catechesis about the Catholic faith and church. After a period of time, inquirers celebrate the Rite of Acceptance/Welcome. They are then called catechumens (those not baptized) and candidates (those baptized in another Christian tradition). After this Rite is celebrated, catechumens are dismissed from Mass each weekend to reflect on the Word of God proclaimed during that Mass. The formation process culminates with the candidates making a profession of faith and receiving sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist when they are ready. Catechumens are fully initiated into the church by receiving sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Mystagogia, a time of reflection on the mysteries of the Church, is held after Easter for a period of a few weeks. Children's Initiation into the Church - Children who have reached catechetical age (seven years and older) who have not been baptized or who have been baptized in another Christian tradition will attend the Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC) along with parents and, if possible, godparents/sponsors. Weekly instruction will be given to these children based on their age. Parents are also required to provide opportunities for prayer in the home and especially by attending Mass with the children each weekend. Children will participate in the special rites of the RCIC process, the Rite of Acceptance/Welcoming and the Rite of Election. Children will be fully initiated into the church at the Easter Vigil by receiving sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharistic. SPRED - Special Religious Education - The SPRED Center at St. Therese Parish provides a structured religious learning environment for persons who are developmentally delayed, ages 21 or older. Through prepared sessions provided by the diocese, adults experience meaningful participation as members of our faith community. Other opportunities for special liturgies and social events are also provided. Helper catechists aged 21 or older, assist in the sessions, sharing their time and kindness in relating everyday life experience to our journey within the Catholic faith. Meetings are held during the school year on Thursday evening, at 7:00. For more information contact **Pat or Geri Lantz** at 816-587-8403.

Parish Schools of Religion - The School of Religion serves children in grades Pre-K through 8. Religious Education (RE) classes for grades 1-5 are held on Wednesday evenings from 6:00-7:15 PM in the Education and Parish Center. Catechists utilize textbooks, parish resources and family activities to help students learn more about our faith. Religious Education classes meet from September though the first week of May.

Children in grades Pre-K and Kindergarten may attend Sunday School in the Education and Parish Center during the 10:00 AM Mass. Sunday School is ideal for all parish children (including those who attend Catholic School.) Curriculum includes a variety of activities to help children learn more about God and prayer. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd - is a faith formation for children ages 3 through 12. 
Faith Formation Community

The core function includes *Leadership*, serving as examples of stewardship in the life of the parish; *Planning*, to develop plans and conduct programs asking parishioners to give of their time, their God-given talents and the return of a portion of God's financial blessings; *Education*, to see that God's lessons on the value of stewardship are communicated through all areas of parish activities, including worship, education and ministry; and finally *Ministry Coordination*, to facilitate the communication between the different ministries of the parish so that those parishioners wishing to give of their time and talents are matched with the appropriate ministry.

Annual Appeal - We show care for the work of God by the way we live. We join the work of God when we freely and gratefully share our gifts with the Church and others. Each fall, all parishioners receive an appeal and support form asking them to review their family's commitment to stewardship - the sharing of one's time, talent and treasure. Parishioners are encouraged to consider setting an eventual goal at the biblical tithe of 10 % - 5 % to the Parish; 1% to the Diocese and 4% to other charities. It may take a few years to accomplish this, but this is a worthy and rewarding goal for all, on the journey of stewardship and gratitude. Social Outreach

In the name of Christian charity, we attempt to serve the needs of the poor and marginalized of our community and the wider world. The bulk of our temporal assistance requests are channeled through the St. Vincent de Paul Society. We have emergency food supplies on hand in our pantry and network with Harvesters for additional food needs.

Local food drives, plus the efforts of our RE and school children, keep shelves stocked with foodstuffs. Pickups of donated perishable food from area supermarkets, bakeries, etc. take place daily through the "Society" and other parish volunteers. These volunteers also make deliveries to food pantries, shelters and soup kitchens in the metropolitan area.

Through the interest and effort of our parishioners, childcare centers, homes for the aged, abused, or disabled, and missionary activities receive either monetary donations or clothing and medical aid. We continue to be open to other ways to affect social change through community projects and individual political activism.

St. Vincent de Paul Society - The St. Therese Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society has been active in providing for the emergency needs of families since 1961. Our organization, through our 100+ volunteers, provides assistance with food, rent, utilities, medical bills and other basic needs to the many Southern Platte County families that call our office every year. In each of the past few years, our financial assistance has exceeded the \$150,000 level and our food pantry has distributed over 18,000 bags of groceries.





Our spiritual patron is St. Vincent de Paul and our Society's roots go back to France in 1833 when 10 year old Frederic Ozanam founded the organization to help relieve the suffering of the poor through the personal contact of a Society's member. We live out the teachings of St. Vincent de Paul and Frederic Ozanam by personally visiting those who have asked for assistance.

We are always in need of volunteers to assist in our ministry. We have a variety of ways to volunteer: home visits (with a partner) to clients who ask for aid; assist in the food pantry at St. Therese; pick up perishable food from area grocery stores; assist in the St. Vincent de Paul Office. 


