

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Sick is a healing sacrament of the Church. Anyone who is sick or elderly, and in need of physical or emotional healing can receive this sacrament. Those who would like to receive the sacrament before a hospital stay or surgery are invited to call the parish office to make arrangements. The sacrament is also available to those who may be near death; please call the parish emergency line, and someone will respond to your call. Also, please inform the parish office when a member of the parish is hospitalized.

BAPTISMS (INFANTS)

Baptisms take place on the first and second Sunday each month at 1:00 p.m. Pre-Baptismal preparation is required.

BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

The mission of the Bereavement Ministry is to reach out with compassion, understanding and comfort when meeting with grieving families upon the death of their loved ones and provide an opportunity for making choices concerning the Mass of Christian Burial. A Bereavement Minister will contact the family soon after the Funeral Director advises the Parish Office of the death.

CANTOR

Lead the congregation in singing the hymns and responses during mass. Must have a skilled solo voice and a sense of prayerfulness and reverence for the congregation's sung prayer.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD (CLOW)

Liturgy of the Word with children is a worship experience geared especially for children. It mirrors the worship that is going on during the Scripture readings, Creed, and Prayers of the Faithful at the regular Sunday Liturgy. The children and their catechists leave the body of the church and gather in the Gathering Place for a child-friendly experience. This happens during the 9:30 a.m. Sunday Liturgy with at least two catechists at each session.

CHOIR

Sing at the 9:30 a.m. Mass or the 11:30 a.m. Mass each week. You must have a good singing voice (however, you do not have to be a professional to join). Practice for our 9:30 Mass Choir is Wednesday evenings from 8:00 p.m. to 9:15 p.m. and as needed, for our 11:30 a.m. Mass Choir.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF THE EUCHARIST

Assist priest with distribution of Holy Communion at Masses. A love and reverence for the Eucharist, ease in public settings, Catholic in good standing who has received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Approximately 1 hour at weekend Mass, 1 to 3 times a month.

GIFT BEARERS

Carries the gifts of Bread and Wine in a procession from the rear of church to the sanctuary during our weekend Masses.

LECTORS

MARRIAGE

One of the engaged or his/her parents must be a registered and active parishioner for six months prior to scheduling a wedding. Scheduling must take place at least six months in advance of the wedding. A marriage preparation program is required.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION DAY

St. Dominic Parish offers this day of preparation as a formational opportunity for engaged couples who are part of our parish community. This day fulfills the formational program component of marriage preparation for those who choose to participate. Sessions and workshops are presented by the priests and staff of St. Dominic Parish. The marriage preparation day begins Saturday morning and ends with dinner. Marriage preparation days are scheduled for March and September each year.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

RCIA Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. The process of initiation for those seeking Membership in the Catholic Church.

USHERS

Greet parishioners, collect offerings, seat parishioners as necessary, see that people are present to bring up gifts, follow any requests of the priests, see that order is maintained and attend to emergencies in the congregation.

ARCHDIOCESE OF CINCINNATI DECREE ON CHILD PROTECTION

This Decree applies to any adult employee or volunteer who works with children in any parish setting. This Decree exists to prevent abuse of children or vulnerable adults and have a plan to handle cases of abuse, if one occurs. To meet the requirements of this Decree, all adults, who work with children MUST complete a child protection training class; a background check through Selection.com; and stay current on continuing education. These prerequisites must be in place before any volunteer can work with children in a parish setting.

ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

Our program's purpose is to: Aid in the development of fully mature Christian individuals through competitive athletics; Encourage the fun of playing, the joy of physical effort and the development of skills for wholesome leisure time; Guide in the development of leadership and good sportsmanship among the youth of the parish; Plan, promote and assist in the development of a sound, workable and complete athletic program for the youth of the parish; and finance our program.

Our program is open to all interested individuals and families, who are registered in our Parish. The youth must either be a student at St. Dominic Parish School or be enrolled and attend, on an ongoing basis, our Parish School of Religion (PSR).

Our program is financed through annual family membership dues, per sport fees and various fundraisers. Adults are encouraged to assist.

BEFORE/AFTER SCHOOL CARE PROGRAM

GWAC Rep Amanda Newland

The St. Dominic Before/After School Care program is designed primarily for children of working parents. Held at St. Dominic, it is limited to students attending St. Dominic School. Students may attend from 7:00 to 8:00 a.m. before school and 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. after school. The program operates only on days when St. Dominic School is in session.

BOY SCOUTS

St. Dominic Boy Scout Troop 483 includes boys, ages 11 through 18. The boys pursue merit badges, progressing through the Eagle Scout level with the guidance of adult leaders and volunteers. Various fund raisers help to support camping trips and annual summer camp. Some of the purposes of scouting are to influence and develop character, encourage spiritual growth, develop good citizenship, improve understanding with the family, encourage good sportsmanship, companionship, leadership and respect for the outdoors.

CROSSING GUARDS

Keep cars flowing in a safe and timely manner and see that children get safely across the parking lot, mornings during the school year. You must be alert, with the ability to spot potential dangers.

CUB SCOUTS LEADERS/HELPERS

Cub Scouting is a program of the Boy Scouts of America involving boys in kindergarten through 5th grade. At St. Dominic, Pack 483 meets monthly as a group, and three times each month in smaller groups of six to eight boys at St. Dominic, under the direction of den leaders. Leaders assist with activities to help the boys grow, learn, and mature through the scout program and to grow in character, good morals, and physical fitness.

Our Commission consists of nine voting members, with three elected annually, and non-voting members, which include our Pastor, Principal, Pastoral Associate and Parish Administrator.
