## General Information

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in the United Methodist Church is open to all who believe and follow Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. A person may transfer their membership from another denomination, from another United Methodist Church, or by professing their faith in Jesus.

#### **BAPTISM**

The United Methodist Church believes in one baptism and recognizes any Christian baptism. We baptize infants, children, and adults. Adults may be baptized in any of the three modes of baptism.

#### HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion is celebrated the first weekend of each month and at special times such as Maundy Thursday, Christmas Eve, and other times as desired. "Open" Communion is observed, where any person desiring may take Communion in remembrance of Jesus.

## Christ UMC History

The Board of Missions and Church Extension of Greater Kansas City made a study of the 39th St. and Phelps area, and as a result of this study, 6.5 acres were purchased for a new Methodist Church. The first service was held on September 15, 1963 and the church was organized on September 22, 1963. Fifty-four members were received as Charter Members by March 16, 1964.

On June 1, 1966, the new Christ Methodist Church and Wason Memorial Methodist Church were merged by a vote of both congregations. The Watson Memorial Church history goes back to 1831 as a point for a circuit rider. The name Watson was taken in 1902, in tribute to Dr. and Mrs. T. J. Watson, who contributed \$16,400 toward a building. The total cost was \$20,000.

The merged congregation was called Christ Methodist Church. Plans for a new building were made. According to church records, in April 1967, there was a membership of 683. Groundbreaking ceremonies were held October 9, 1966, and the Consecration was held October 22, 1967. The Dedication Service was held September 19, 1982.

In 1968 the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church merged nationwide. We then became known as Christ United Methodist Church.

The original plans for the church building included the addition of an education wing on the east side of the building. A two-story addition was completed and on April 1, 1984, Sunday School classes were held in ten additional classrooms. The building was debt-free on August 25, 1991. Because of the growth of the church and its ministries, the facilities were again expanded with a Family Life Center, classrooms, office complex, and enlarged narthex. All of this was completed in December 1995. The new area was consecrated February 18, 1996. The facilities offer opportunities to expand our ministries in new and exciting ways.

## Ministries with Children

Christ United Methodist Church is committed to offering opportunities for Christian fellowship and Bible-based learning to children of all ages in a safe environment. - **Nursery through Pre-School Ages:** Nursery care is provided in our daycare area (rooms 106-111) during worship from 8:30am 12:00pm and for meetings and other gatherings when requested.
- **Sunday School:** Children in Pre-School through 5th grade meet in our Kids Zone (lower level) from 9:45 10:45am, in grade level groups to experience Bible stories and learn ways to apply Christian principles to daily living. The lessons are fun, interactive and Bible-focused.
- **Kids Church:** Meets from 10:45am 12:00pm. Children ages 5 through 5th grade meet in our Kids Zone (lower level) for a children's worship during the 10:55 service. Children spend time in the Kids Zone for Bible stories and worship with some recreation time added. They are also taken up to the church service for Children's Time for the minister's children's message.
- **On Wednesdays** during the school year, from 6:00-7:30pm, 2nd through 5th grade are invited to come to Serve, Worship and Glorify (S.W.A.G.). We have a light snack supper then a bible lesson and games. Some weeks we support the community by volunteering in service projects. This is a joint event with the youth group.
- **Special Activities and Events:** Throughout the year, various opportunities are provided for children to join groups preparing for performances. Students in grades 3rd through 5th can join a dowel rod performing group called TWIGS. Opportunities to sing and act are also available during the annul Youth Dinner Theater each spring.

#### Each year we host the following events for family fun:

Trunk-or-Treat in October, 4th & 5th Grade Fun Night and an Easter Eggstravaganza on Palm Sunday.

- **Creative Arts Camp:** Creative Arts Camp is held each summer for students entering grades 3rd through 7th. There are several choices of classes that kids can choose from and they choose three to attend that week. - **Church Camps:** During the summer, the Missouri Conference offers United Methodist camping experiences for both youth and children. The Missouri conference also supports the Eaglelakes Base Camp during the summer. This event is a traveling day camp lasting a week as an alternative to overnight stays.




