

From Whence Did We Come

Grace United Methodist Church has its roots in the Evangelical Church. Jacob Albright was inspired by a Methodist class meeting to bring the Gospel to the German speaking people of Pennsylvania, which formed the Evangelical Association in 1807. Families came West, settled in Naperville, and held class meetings. They established Zion Evangelical Church and built their first church on Van Buren Street in 1842 and a larger church in 1859 on Ellsworth Street, now Community United Methodist Church. Northwestern College, now North Central College, had an Evangelical Church with worship in English at this time.

In 1890, members of Zion Church, the College church and others in the community organized an English speaking church incorporated as Grace Church of Naperville on December 22, 1890. The 103 members moved into their new wood frame building on March 8, 1891, which today is a home just east of Pfeiffer Hall on the campus of North Central College. The vital growth of the congregation caused the building of the brick church at Ellsworth Street and Van Buren Avenue, dedicated November 14, 1909. A fire prompted an addition and renovation in 1924.

The name Grace Evangelical United Brethren Church was the result of a merger with the United Brethren in 1946. Again outgrowing their facilities, and after rejecting a plan for an addition and taking into perspective the merger with the Methodist Church in 1968, these people of faith, mission and vision voted to move to a new site, which resulted in the building of the present edifice, dedicated March 14, 1971. In the next ten years the membership grew from 700 to 1900, and again space was needed. The new classrooms, Activity Center, expanded offices and narthex were completed in 1990, with the finishing of rooms for a Music Center and the installing of air conditioning and the elevator in 1995. In 2005, we completed a renovation of our hallways and classrooms and our sanctuary, with the installation of a new organ. In 2011/12 we celebrated the installation of several stained-glass windows from the previous building. In 2012, we approved a capital campaign for the funding of improvements to our parking areas. roofing, kitchen, building security, and signage, and much progress has since been made on those projects. In 2019, due to the generosity of the Glenna Holloway Memorial Fund, we were able to complete a three-phase renovation project at Grace that included the creation of an open floor plan style Gathering Space, a new main office configuration, update existing facilities to better meet the needs of those with disabilities and renovated our Children's Ministry and Parent's Day Out Areas.

At this time in 2020, we rejoice in what God has done through Grace Church in bringing people into the presence of God, the teachings of Jesus the Christ, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Worship in Spirit and in Truth

Four services provide the "space of grace" for the Grace Church family. Designed to tell the Good News of God's love in Jesus Christ, the message, music, and prayers draw upon the best in traditional and contemporary expressions of Christian worship.

Weekly Worship Schedule

Saturdays

5 p.m. Reflective and uplifting, this 'come as you are' worship meets in the Activity Center. Set to the vocals of singer/songwriter Vickie Wagner, it offers a quiet setting to recharge in God's love. There is also an American Sign Language interpreter for those who are hearing impaired. A brief message will focus on scripture each week. Holy Communion is served weekly. You will be fully welcomed in as food and fellowship is shared following worship.

Sundays

- **8 a.m. in the Sanctuary.** This is the service you remember growing up! Traditional liturgy with the creeds and weekly Communion. The message is the same for all of our services and we enjoy traditional hymns. Two great choirs, the New Life Singers and the Grace Bell Ensemble, alternate Sundays. Families are welcome!
- **9 a.m. in the Activity Center.** Enjoy coffee and food as you worship either at tables or in rows. With thought-provoking visual projections, interactive opportunities and meaningful messages, this service features music provided by the Grace Praise Team. Communion is served weekly. Families can enjoy music and fellowship together at the beginning and children can exit to attend Grace Sunday School at 9:15 a.m., or remain in worship with parents as desired.
- **10:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary.** Every Sunday, the Chancel Choir fills the Sanctuary with the glory of classical choral music and familiar hymns. This service follows a formal worship pattern based on United Methodist tradition with heartfelt and thought-provoking messages. Communion is served on the first Sunday of every month. Families are welcome

6 weeks to 4 years old childcare is provided during Sunday worship services—7:45 a.m. – 11:45 a.m.

The dynamic preaching ministry at Grace Church brings biblical, relevant, and thought-provoking messages. Messages and worship services are recorded for congregational use and available on the Grace website and the Grace YouTube page.

The sacrament of Holy Communion is celebrated in community each week at our Saturday 5 p.m. service, and Sundays at 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. We celebrate Holy Communion on the first Sunday of the month at our 10:30 service.

Baptisms are officiated by our pastors within our worship services. These are joyous occasions for our congregation as we covenant together to provide ongoing support for the baptism candidate. To schedule a baptism, contact Sharon Ferguson in the church office. She will extend your request to the pastors, one of whom will be in contact to arrange a time to meet with you for further conversation and to confirm your date.

Easy Access

Grace Church is conveniently located on Gartner Road, just north of 75th Street, and intersects the North/South streets of Modaff, Washington Street, Julian Street, Charles, Olesen Road, and Naper Boulevard, providing easy access to the church.

The church has off-street parking for nearly 500 cars. Many of those spaces are shaded by the fully-grown trees throughout the grounds.

Our main covered entrance (Worship Center) is on the upper level of the building and has automatic doors for handicapped accessibility, there is an elevator inside that entrance which accesses both floors of the building.

On Sunday mornings valet parking is available at the covered entrance (Worship Center).

Celebrate the Christian Year

Throughout the year, evening worship marks changes in the seasons. Advent Worship/Wreath-making prepares families for Christmas. On Christmas Eve six services celebrate the birth of the Savior. Lent begins with the Ash Wednesday Experience for families and a traditional evening service and concludes with Holy Week observances on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. On Easter Sunday, there are three worship services, plus a Saturday evening Easter worship.

- This advanced choral ensemble is for the highly motivated Christian choral artist with a strong voice and choral background.
- The Chamber Singers sing special events, concerts, and major works as scheduled and occasional worship services at Grace.

Requirements: a vocal audition is required. Singers must be able to sight-read and must have advanced vocal ability. While many members have operatic training, the Chamber Singers ensemble requires vocal flexibility, blend, subtlety and management of excessive vibrato.

Chancel Choir

- Led by Dan Wagner, Minister of Music.
- Rehearse Thursdays, 7:30-9 p.m., during the school year.
- Primary choir for our 10:30 a.m. service.
- Presents major works and special seasonal events.
- A dynamic ensemble that sings a variety of pieces centered in standard sacred repertoire and masterworks, while venturing often into hymn settings, gospel, spirituals and other genres.

Requirements: a good choral voice, ability to match pitch, learn and hold a part, sing advanced repertoire with adequate preparation. Reading music is helpful. Though not all members are fluent readers, many are. A formal audition is not required but an informal meeting with the director is recommended. Prospective members are *always* welcome to visit a rehearsal to see what it's like.

New Life Singers

- New Life Singers is open to young adults and up.

- Repertoire includes traditional Christian music with a focus on various gospel styles.
- Rehearse Wednesdays at 7:15-8:30 p.m., in Room 161.

- No audition is required.

Requirements: an audition is required for singers and band members. Singers must be comfortable singing in a contemporary style with microphones, willing to learn music on their own as well as in rehearsal, have expressive leadership presence and a solo or near solo-quality voice. Band members must be able to learn parts for several pieces of music each week, be experienced in playing challenging music in a group setting, and willing to work on their music outside of rehearsals. Music reading is very helpful and, in some cases, required.

Children/Education

At Grace UMC, we value and respect the role of the church in supporting the faith formation efforts of the family. We believe that providing faith based educational support is critical as we answer the call to share God's word with the next generation. We offer a Faith Formation (Sunday school hour) on Sunday mornings at 9 a.m. for children ages 3 years to 5th grade. Children must be able to use the restroom independently. During this time, children gather, share in praise and worship, practice serving and stewardship, pray, hear God's Word, and participate in hands-on activities in an age appropriate setting. These efforts ultimately result in children putting their faith into action at a young age. Infants and toddlers enjoy a healthy, colorful environment with professional caregivers, 7:45 a.m. - 11:45 a.m. each Sunday morning. If for any reason we are unable to meet in our formal space, online connection will be provided.

Children - Worship

Worship is a special time for the whole Grace family. There are special worship bags with activities for children at the back of the Sanctuary as well as sensory bags for those who may need sensory support items while in worship. You may request a sensory bag at any time. During the 8 a.m. worship service, a children's message is offered and at the 10:30 a.m. Sunday worship service, children attend a portion of the service, including a children's message, then continue their worship together with the Children's Director and weekly volunteer team, or worship with their parents. Childcare for 6 weeks to 4 years old is available at all services in the nursery (room 130).

Summer - Vacation Bible School

Every summer, Vacation Bible School sees hundreds of children participate in a weeklong morning program for children aged 3 years through entering 5th grade. Students entering 6th-8th grades serve as Apprentices and youth entering 9-12th grade are invited to serve as class or activity leads or supports. VBS is normally held from 9 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. each day. If for any reason we cannot meet in person, an online connection will be offered. Bible stories, music, crafts, drama, and mission projects help children learn more about our Christian faith and make the important connection to God's word and their lives. The United Methodist Women of Grace host a VBS Family Night the Thursday of VBS week to offer a time of food, family, and fellowship. We are thankful for this UMW Outreach in support of the VBS program.

As a church, we do not know who God has called us to raise up, but we do know that each child has value and purpose and we will support making sure they know that! Youth

Wednesday evening G.Y.M. (Grace Youth Ministry) for Junior and Senior High gathers from 7-8:30 in Room 234 (during the school year) for an informal time of fellowship, fun faith exploration, life application studies, and worship.

Additional ministry opportunities/programs include Wacky Wednesday fellowship,; retreats; local mission opportunities; serving in worship; service projects; mission trip fundraisers; a junior high at-home mission in the Chicago region; high school week-long away summer mission trip; and serving as teen helpers for Vacation Bible School.

Confirmation

Confirmation is open to all youth entering the 8th or 9th grades. The class begins in August, when the school year resumes, and concludes with Confirmation Sunday Worship in the spring. Classes meet each Sunday morning from 9:15 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. in room 227, with additional dates for field trips, service opportunities, and retreats.

As Confirmation students discern whether to make a commitment to the church, they embark on a focused but age-appropriate study of the Bible, church history, worship, discipleship, and mission. Throughout the year, students will participate on field trips to other faith communities in order to learn more about our neighbors and, simultaneously, more about our own tradition. Students will also participate in worship services and community service opportunities, in addition to working closely with an adult mentor. Fellowship is a particularly important part of the Confirmation Program, so students will have additional opportunities to build relationships with one another and other members of the church community.
