



Sacramental Preparation

Baptism - A one-hour session on Sunday morning is offered every other month: January, March, May, July, September, and November. The classes are for parents of infants and small children as well as godparents. You may attend during pregnancy or after your child is born. First Holy Communion - For those attending St. Richard School, this sacrament preparation is provided as part of the school curriculum. However, for those children not attending St. Richard School, the required preparation necessary is provided by attending weekly Sunday School. Youth

Children's Liturgy of the Word - 3 to 6 year olds. From September to May during the 10:30 a.m. Mass, Children are escorted from the church to a classroom before the readings and return after the homily. Here they hear the Word of God on their level with activities to help them understand the lesson.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd - This is a Montessori-based religious formation program for children ages 3-6th grade (Level I, Level II, Level III). This program is rooted in scripture and Catholic doctrine. Children learn through hands-on works about the liturgy, history and teachings of the Church as demonstrated by Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Children entering 2nd grade who are not students at St. Richard School must attend in order to receive the sacrament of the Eucharist.

Small Faith Communities Purpose

Small Faith Communities (SFCs) are a gathering of approximately five to fifteen people who meet on a regular basis with the common purpose of growing together in their faith. Through prayers, scripture, and sharing of faith experiences, members support one another to live out Christian values and connect faith to everyday life. Over 450 St. Richard parishioners and non-parishioners meet regularly in these small groups helping each other to build this much needed bridge between our spiritual and everyday lives.

There are a variety of groups that meet at different times, in different locations and on different days. Some of the groups that we currently have are: Young Singles, Married Couples, Young Married Couples, Seniors, All Women, Couples and Singles, Parents with small children, Zones (Neighborhoods) and more. There is truly a group for everyone!

St. Richard Parish outreach ministries flow naturally from Small Faith Communities. Members from perspective Small Faith groups have the opportunity to reach out and minister to both parishioners and others in need in the surrounding areas a few times a year.

Benefits

- **Learning and growing in your faith.** Small Faith Communities are a wonderful resource to learn more about what we believe as Catholics.
- **The Scriptures start becoming more alive in your life.** One of the great benefits of gathering in the Small Faith Communities is a new appreciation for Scripture. Through the prayer service that opens each meeting, one begins to get more comfortable with the Bible and it opens up in a new way, becoming a "living" word.
- The opportunity to hear how other Catholics live their faith in their daily lives. So many times, we Catholics do not share our faith with other people. Small Faith Communities provide a unique opportunity to share how God is working in our lives and to hear how God is working in other people's lives.
- **Getting to know other St. Richard parishioners.** Our parish is so large that it is easy to get lost in the crowd. All meetings incorporate some social time to help everyone get to know each other in a Christian setting.
- **The opportunity to help others.** Throughout the year there are service projects to offer support to our church family and our community.

Questions

Are Small Faith Communities new?

Actually, the concept is about 2000 years old. In the early days of Christianity, small groups of believers gathered in people's homes to worship and share their faith. As these groups became larger, some of the intimacy and fellowship experienced by the small groups was lost. In the 1960's Pope Paul VI proclaimed the future of the Church was in the re-establishment of Small Faith Communities to foster community, prayer, scripture study and service.

What does this mean for me?

If you join a group, you will have the opportunity to get to know other parishioners (more than familiar faces at Mass), you will grow in your faith through prayer and learning to apply Scripture and church teachings to your life. You will experience the rewards given to everyone that reaches out to serve others.

Are SFCs unique to Saint Richard?

No. The development of Small Faith Communities within parishes is a worldwide movement in the Catholic Church. If you should move to another parish, it is very likely that SFCs would be a part of your new parish as well.

How do "Zones" differ from "Small Faith Communities?"

Zones simply refer to where you live. St. Richard Parish serves a large geographical area, so it is divided into 17 zones, each designated by a letter of the alphabet. This distinction was devised some 20 years ago to insure each parishioner was better served. SFCs are but one of these ministries within any given zone. There may be several SFCs within a given zone.

What are the "special interest" Small Faith Communities (SFCs)?

Some Small Faith Communities have developed out of a common bond... young and middle age couples, single young adults, older singles, stay at home moms, seniors, etc. You are welcome to attend any of these groups, as all the SFCs are open to anyone that would like to join.

How often do you meet?

Most of our SFCs meet in 6 week intervals. They meet 6 consecutive weeks in the Fall and then again in the Spring. We do have a few groups that deviate from the consecutive 6 week and they meet monthly or bi-monthly.

Do I have to go to every meeting?

No. Typically each meeting is independent of the other meetings. However, regular participation is important in order to reap the optimum benefit not only of the material presented but of getting to know your fellow parishioners as well.

How do I join a group?

It's simple. Contact Debbie Tubertini at 601-366-2335 Ext. 107 or email tubertini@saintrichard.com. She will review the variety of options regarding your preferences of group type, meeting time and location to help you decide which group best fits your needs.

What about Child Care?

The church provides free babysitting on Wednesday evenings while the SFC groups are meeting.

- Special Kids Ministry This unique ministry was started over 30 years ago by Msgr. Farrell. The Special Kids program is for teens to young adults with developmental disabilities, ranging in age from 13 to 21. Each student has a plan designed specifically for their individual needs. Each plan includes academics as well as job, life and social skills. Our students go into the community almost every day interacting with local businesses to put these skills into action. Each student has various jobs within our parish community. We maintain a low student to teacher ratio ensuring each student receives the necessary individual guidance. - **Young Adult Ministry (Ages 21-35)** Young adults meet regularly at the church for fellowship and spiritual enrichment. This group enjoys getting together. They do fun activities outside of the church just for the fellowship. Contact Debbie Tubertini at 601-366-2335 Ext. 107 or tubertini@saintrichard.com
- **Young at Heart Ministry (Ages 60+)** This group enjoys a monthly luncheon followed by a presentation during the months of September through May. Over the years we have had a variety of speakers who share with the group on a wide range of topics. There are occasional trips and other activities also planned for this group. - **Zone Ministry** Our parish is divided into 17 geographical zones. We are always looking for volunteers to call and welcome newcomers to our parish within a particular Zone. In regard to Zone ministry we have a person who delivers baby gifts to new parents in our parish. History of Our Church (1949-2018)

- **1949:** Bishop Richard Gerow and St. Peter's Cathedral purchase twelve acres for \$25,000 on Lynnwood Drive for a new church in north Jackson.
 - St. Richard's parish is named in honor of St. Richard of Chichester, patron saint of Bishop Richard Gerow.
- **1952:** Monsignor Chatham is appointed by Bishop Gerow to organize the new St. Richard parish.
- **1953:** Bishop Gerow officially establishes St. Richard as a parish for approximately 274 families.
 - Construction of a chapel that seats 340 and a 4-classroom elementary school begins. The total cost is approximately \$135,000 for 15,150 square feet or about \$9/square foot. Monsignor Chatham is installed as St. Richard's first pastor.

The Sisters of Mercy are in charge of the new school and Sr. Cyrena Harkins, R.S.M. is the first principal and is with the school a total of 14 years.

1965: Ground is broken for the new church.

1967: New church is dedicated in March.

Church building receives an award from the National Liturgical Conference.

Monsignor Harnett is installed as our second pastor.

1973: New sanctuary receives an honor award for Excellence in Design from the Mississippi Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

1975: Father Patrick Farrell is installed as our third pastor.

1978: Ground is broken for the multi-purpose building. It includes the gymnasium and a 2-story building that has a meeting room on the first floor and the parish office on the second floor.

1979: Bishop Houck is installed as auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Jackson.

1984: Bishop Brunini retires and Bishop Houck is installed as Bishop of the Diocese of Jackson.

1985: Geographical "zones" are organized in our parish. Elections are then held with the Pastoral Council consisting of representatives of each zone.

1986: Father Richard Somers is installed as our fourth pastor.

1988: 8 zone groups are formed from the "Renew" groups.

1989: Junior High becomes St. Joseph Junior High.

1992: New rectory is constructed.

"Zones" become known as Small Faith Communities (SFCs) and ongoing groups begin for neighborhoods and special interests.

1995: Land is purchased in Madison for St. Joseph High School.

1997: St. Joseph High School is constructed in Madison for grades 7-12.

1998: Monsignor Noel Foley is installed as our fifth pastor.

1999: Jules Michel becomes St. Richard School principal.

2003: Renovation of the parish offices is completed, and construction of a reception hall begins.

Bishop Houck retires, and Bishop Joseph Latino is installed.

Monsignor Noel Foley goes to his eternal reward on June 10. Father Mike O'Brien is installed as our sixth pastor.
