

BAPTISM: A baptism preparation class is offered every other month and is required for all first-time parents and godparents. Baptisms are scheduled during one of the Sunday Mass times or can be held privately. Please contact the parish office for information and scheduling.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY: In the event we have to cancel class due to weather, look for announcements on the Parish Office voice mail (469-467-9669), the website (www.ourladyofangels.com), and on Facebook. We will also call each teacher or small group leader to let them know that class is cancelled. Each teacher or small group leader will try to contact all students, by phone and email. We will also try to post a sign that class is cancelled. We will attempt to make any class cancellation at least two hours before class time. If you believe the road conditions to be unsafe, please do not put yourself or your family in danger. Please contact your religious education coordinator so they know you will not be present at class.

MARRIAGE: Law of the church requires that the couple:

- be free to marry (never having been married before; free due to death of prior spouse; or duetea declaration of invalidity of previous bond),
- has known each other at least six months.
- has adequate ability to make a mature and deliberative decision about marriage; and
- has the emotional, psychological and spiritual capacities (abilities) to carry out the purposes of Christian marriage.

Couples should call the parish office at least 6 months before their intended wedding date to schedule a meeting with the pastor.

A marriage preparation process is required. Couples are asked to contact the parish as soon as the intention to marry is known to begin the pre-cana process and schedule a marriage ceremony.

MASS INTENTIONS/MASS CARDS: Mass intentions and Mass cards are handled by Father Bell. The parish office has request envelopes available for you. A Mass card will be issued with the available date. Please note, the requested date may or may not be available but the next closest date will be scheduled.

NEWCOMER WELCOME PACKET: Registration forms and other parish information are available in our Newcomer Welcome Packet located in the Worship Center. Please complete the blue card or register online through our parish website.

SAFE ENFIRONMENT: A safe and secure environment for everyone in Our Lady of Angels is a top priority. To ensure that our parish family can enjoy this security, *all parish volunteers, clergy, and staff members* are required to complete a confidential screening process which includes an application and interview, and a reference and background check. Educational training is required initially in a classroom environment and recertification annually thereafter through the internet. Every volunteer receives a copy of the following: Safe Environment Program Policy and Procedures, Policy of Sexual Misconduct, and Social Media Policy. Each Volunteer must acknowledge they have read and understood the requirements.

SUNDAY BULLETIN: A weekly publication distributed at Mass to keep our parishioners informed of happenings and events in the parish. Information for the bulletin should be submitted by noon on the previous Friday (nine days in advance of the targeted Sunday). OLA is blessed to have so many people willing to share their talents and love of music with our community. The mission of Music Ministry is to support the prayer of the people and to actively engage each member of the assembly. When our Parish family gathers to share our faith at mass, singing together is a fundamental part of the celebration. We welcome new singers and instrumentalists from all age groups to join the music ministry. There are many opportunities in our music ministry to serve the parish for weekly celebrations and special feasts throughout the year.

OLA Choir

The OLA Choir sings at the weekend Masses, Holy Days, Christmas, Triduum, and other special Liturgies. Accurate intonation is expected, and basic knowledge of music rudiments is a strong preference, but not required. Rehearsals are held on Monday evenings from 6:00-7:15 pm in the Worship Center. Warm-up sessions are held 30 minutes before each Mass in the Conference Room of the Education and Formation Building. All vocal types (Soprano, Alto, Tenor and Bass) are needed! High School students are encouraged to join the choir. Also, college students who live away are welcome to join us anytime they are home for the holidays.

Year-Round Children's Choir - Grades 2nd-6th

Our Children's Choir provides the music for The Christmas Pageant and First Eucharist Celebrations. Children in Grades 2-6 are welcome to join. Rehearsals are Monday evenings from 5:00-5:50 pm in the Worship Center, and we generally follow the schedule of Faith Formation. Our rehearsals and liturgies provide an opportunity for our children to learn and proclaim their faith through music.

Instrumentalists should have a minimum of 2-3 years of experience playing their instrument, as well as experience playing in an ensemble setting. 

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is a ministry serving adults who are interested in learning about the Catholic faith with the possibility of becoming Catholic. RCIA supports adults on their journey towards a closer relationship with Christ through the Sacraments of Initiation, evangelization, conversion, liturgy, catechesis, discipleship, justice and mission. We gather as a community on a weekly basis sharing the teachings of the Catholic Church and then living out of the faith through our life experiences.

Sacraments

First Communion & Confirmation

Guidelines for First Communion Baptized Catholic

For baptized Catholics, two years of faith formation are required by the diocese in order to receive reconciliation and Eucharist.

- 1. In order to receive reconciliation and Eucharist in Grades 2nd thru 5th, a child must enroll and have an 80% attendance rate in faith formation for two years.
- 2. Specific instruction for sacraments is given during family retreats.
- 3. If a youth is in middle or high school, he/she will enroll in an age-appropriate session for the first and second year. During the second year, he/she may also attend preparation classes for each sacrament that he/she will be receiving.

Baptized in a Different Christian Faith

For children and youth who were baptized in a different Christian faith, at least one year of faith formation is required by the diocese. There are rites and scrutinies that they, their parents and godparents/sponsor will be asked to attend. At the Easter Vigil, they will make a profession of faith and may also be confirmed.

- 1. If a child is in 1st grade or younger, he/she will be enrolled in the appropriate grade level.
- Children and teens in 2nd grade through high school will be enrolled in faith formation at their grade level. Attendance at age appropriate sacrament preparation sessions will be necessary for each sacrament being received.
- 3. First Reconciliation is generally done in February or March. Eucharist and Confirmation (as is age appropriate) are received at the Easter Vigil.

Unbaptized

For children and youth who have not been baptized, at least one year of faith formation is required by the diocese. There are rites and scrutinies that they, their parents and godparents will be asked to attend.

- 1. If a child is in 1st grade or younger, he/she will be enrolled in the appropriate grade level for faith formation and receive baptism at an agreed upon time between the parents and the deacon or priest.
- 2. Children and teens in 2nd grade through high school will be enrolled in faith formation at their grade level. Attendance at age appropriate sacrament preparation sessions will be necessary for each sacrament being received.
- 3. Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation are received at the Easter Vigil according to which sacraments are age appropriate. Reconciliation preparation and reception of the sacrament will be offered the following year.

Guidelines for Confirmation

Confirmation is the third sacrament of initiation where we, as Catholics, receive an outpouring of strength and grace from the Holy Spirit to live out our lives as disciples. Youth are essentially "confirming" what they have already been experiencing as a Catholic, and he/she comes forward in the Sacrament with a desire for grace and gifts from the Holy Spirit to help their active continuation in the faith. Therefore, Confirmation Preparation is in addition to participation in Faith Formation or Youth Ministry.

Normative Age for Confirmation Preparation

- 6th graders Foundational catechesis
- 7th graders Year 1 Confirmation Preparation
- 8th graders Year 2 Confirmation Preparation
- 9th-12th graders Continued participation in High School Ministry as a Confirmed teen

If a youth has passed the normative grade for Confirmation or missed the normative Year 1, we do have alternative pathways. Contact the Youth Ministry Office for details.

Art at Our Lady of Angels

Our Lady of Angels parish is blessed to have a number of original art pieces. The stained glass windows were the first commissioned pieces, graciously donated by two parish families. The windows are original works, designed by Linda Dabeau of New Mexico, a liturgical artist with a number of pieces in churches across the United States. The glasses were fabricated in Germany by Derix's Artglass Studios. Derix Artglass is the fabricator of the memorial stained glass window at Ground Zero in New York City.

Following is the artist's description of the windows: "The window above the altar, The Blessed Virgin Mary has a central depiction of the young Virgin Mary. On Her right side are lilies that represent Mary's purity. On the left side of Mary is a depiction of the Holy Spirit indicating the presence of God. Lines in the window create a spiritual energy that ties the imagery together and showcases the image of Mary. This window was donated by Ed and Diana Belvin."

"Daystar, the window as you leave the worship space, is a circular design of three circular rows of line that would represent a star burst or be indicative of the thorns that were put onto Christ's head as a crown during the Crucifixion; a background ribbon effect border underneath the lines that tie each circle together and a bright white center to provide the feeling of God eternal. This window was donated by the Fitzmartin Family."

Both windows earned an Honorable Mention from the Liturgical Art Magazine in 2007.

ASK ABOUT OUR LOYALTY PROGRAMME THAT REWARDS YOU... The painting of Our Lady of Angels that hangs on the back wall of our worship space was created by Susie Cortez in 2005. It is an interpretation of Spanish painter Bartolome Murillo's Immaculate Conception, painted in 1678, that hangs in Madrid, Spain at the Prado Museum. Susie created the painting in homage to the Blesses Mother and her Son for having survived a serious car accident. This offering was her way of expressing her gratitude. Susie is the sister of Millie Negron of Our Lady of Angels.

In the spring of 2009, the parish received an original sculpture, Our Lady of Angels, also created by Linda Dabeau. The bronze sculpture with patina is a representation of the Blessed Virgin Mary with her arms outstretched. Behind Mary are two floating angels with outstretched arms pointing toward Mary. The sculpture is located between the Worship Center and the Education and Formation Building. It was dedicated in the fall of 2009. The statue stands in our meditation garden.

Our Lady of Angels: 2019 A Year in Review

Our Lady of Angels is a very blessed parish. A parish where friends and family come to worship and praise God. We are a parish where all are welcome and all can be disciples of Jesus Christ to one another. We foster Christ's love through prayer and worship, teaching, service and community as we live out our mission of Love God, Embrace all People, and Share the Gospel Joyfully.

In 2019 OLA ministries served in all areas of the church. Liturgical Ministries are comprised of 56 Altar Servers, 141 Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, 59 Lectors, 28 children's liturgy breakout, 17 Sacristans, 39 ushers, 39 Greeters, 13 Altar Linen Angels, and 14 Art & Environment Team members, who serve the parish at four Masses each weekend.

- •Outreach Ministries sponsored the Christmas Angel Tree helping 100 children and individuals this Christmas. Toys and items were given to CASA, Catholic Charities, Samaritan Inn, and Bella House. Our monthly Food Pantry collections assist the Allen Food Pantry. Other outreach ministries are Military Shipment Collections, Guardian Angel requests, and Meals for parishioners.
- •Military Ministry packed and shipped 35 care packages to four stateside soldiers and six overseas. These care packages were shipped twice a year (4th of July and Christmas). Care packs consisted of donated toiletries, snacks, games, magazines, handmade rosaries, and personal handmade cards Our mission is to give the soldiers a little bit of home and thank them for their service.
- •**Guardian Angel Ministry** has given financial assistance to 125 families in our greater Allen/Plano community totaling over \$40,000.

- •Rosary Makers Ministry has 20 members. We collected from these members a total of 5797 handmade rosaries from January November and given/sent out a total of 7626 which include rosaries from 2018 and 2019. Our leading rosary maker is Bill Luckett who made a total of 1700 for 2019. We have shared our rosaries with the Parish by providing rosaries for the OLA International Rosary in May, giving rosaries for the children to Faith Formation, and having a Rosary Display in October which is the Month of the Rosary. We give rosaries to the University of Texas (Terri Fox) and to Eleanor Doonan (mother of one of our members) from Houston who gives them out to patients at Memorial Herman Hospital in Houston and to individuals at nursing homes in the Houston area. Our rosaries are sent to mission around the world by organizations such as The Family Rosary, the St. Raymond's Rosary Group, and OLRM.
- **Shawl Ministry** has given over 45 prayer shawls and 4 blankets. More blankets will be given to a local nursing home this Christmas.
- •OLA's Women's Club organized a fundraiser selling "Love, Embrace, Share" Commemorative T-Shirts and Sweatshirts. 100% of the proceeds, \$3000.00, was donated to the parish Canopy Project. Throughout the year we provided support to numerous OLA Ministries The Guardian Angel Fund, Military Ministry, VBS, Boy Scouts, Rosary Group and Wheelchair Mission Sunday. The local charities that were our focus this year were Bella House, School Sisters of Notre Dame's, Women's Leadership Luncheon, Meals on Wheels Fall Harvest Boxes, and our annual Easter Project with Hope's Door and City House.
- •Knights of Columbus with more than 200 members are often referred to as "The Strong Right Arm of the Church." Knights serve both the parish and the community with acts of Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism. You may be familiar with the Knights if you were one of the more than 300 parishioners who ate with us at our Fish Frys during Lent, or one of the 400+ who were served at the Parish picnic, or brought your children to our Easter egg hunt. But our service to our faith goes much deeper. Every year we donate our labor to help any parishioner in need who cannot help themselves, and donate our time and money to causes within the Diocese consistent with our Catholic faith. We sponsor 5 seminarians, are active with our Jail Ministry, and we volunteer and support every Pro-Life activity with the full support of our parish. We raised almost \$20,000 for 130 wheelchairs for the needy (directly impacting 1,300 lives), ran two blood drives, served the Allen food pantry, and hosted cookies Saturdays/donuts Sundays for the Parish.

- •**Faith Formation** programs for PK3-High School are designed to impart knowledge about the traditional teachings of the Catholic Church, but also provide opportunities to develop the values, conscience, and skills necessary to become faithful and active disciples of Jesus Christ. We have 53 enrolled in our PK3-K program, 253 in our Elementary program, 213 in Middle School formation, and 100 students participating in High School ministry. Over 150 catechists participate each week of Faith Formation. Vacation Bible school was staffed with 45 adult volunteers, 67 teen volunteers, and enrolled 132 children in grades K-5th and 5 in the nursery.
- **Adult Faith Formation** sponsors our Men's and Women's Welcome retreats, Wednesday Morning Bible Study, Thursday Evening Bible Study, Sunday Morning Faith Formation, marriage preparation for newly engaged couples, and Small Groups.
- **Boy Scout Troop 1914** consists of 40 Scouts who are working on the various stages of their Scouting Journey from the first rank of Scout to those who have earned the coveted Eagle rank. Four scouts earned the rank of Eagle in 2019. To make this all possible Troop 1914 has a 50 strong adult support staff that mentors and supports our young men. Adults take on the roles of Scoutmasters and Committee Members to help make sure this Boy Lead Troop continues to grow and teach these young men the skills they need to be successful.

At the end of 2019 there are 1296 families registered with 4346 individual parishioners in our database.
