Music

Angelus (Children's Choir)

Children's Choir sings at the 5:30 pm Mass on Saturdays and at special liturgies throughout the year. Children age 8-13 are invited to tryout and interview. Rehearsals are held on Wednesday afternoons, 5:30 pm-6:30 pm.

Cantors

Cantors lead the congregation in song, a role which requires special vocal capabilities and extensive training. Cantors meet once a month on Saturday mornings for private coaching sessions and are members of one of the choirs.

Children's Summer Choir Camp

This week long camp includes Bible Study, Arts, and Crafts, singing, acting and performance rehearsals and techniques all within the theme of the selected musical presentation. The camp concludes the week with the presentation of the musical on the evening of the last day of camp. The camp begins at 8:00 am and ends at 1:00 pm daily and is open to children 8 to 13 years of age. Registration begins April 1st and is limited to 60 participants. Scholarships are available.

Choro di pace (Adult Choir)

The Choro di pace choir sings at the 9:00 am Sunday Mass and at special liturgies throughout the year. Rehearsals are on Thursday evenings, 7:30 pm-9:00 pm. The group is made up of male and female members of high school age through retirees.

Marriage Annulments

Canon Law requires the existence of a Marriage Tribunal in every Diocese in the World. It is the Ecclesial Court which offers assistance to those who request that the Church study their marriage in order to determine if their marriage was lacking (from back to the time of consent) any essential(s) required for a valid marriage.

A Decree of Invalidity of a previous marriage must be proven before marriage in the Catholic Church is permitted.

Every marriage is considered Valid until proven otherwise, by the Tribunal Judges, after much Testimony, Witnesses, Documents, and sometimes Professional Evaluations, etc.

As marriage is a Sacrament and life binding, it can be a long process and take much time to determine if it is invalid. A Civil Divorce does not invalidate a marriage.

Please remember that there are different grounds for a Decree of Invalidity because each marriage case is different and confidential.

Christmas Angel Tree Ministry

Each Christmas, the social ministry decorates a tree with paper angels. Each tag represents a needy child's shoe and clothing sizes, and their wish for a particular toy, sports item or game. Parishioners pick one or more of these "gift Angel tags", register the angel, buy a gift or gifts of clothing and/or the special wish, returning the gifts to the social ministry for distribution.

Saint Anthony's Bread & Food Pantry

Volunteers distribute food every Tuesday and Saturday, at the Padre Pio House, excluding holidays, by appointment, take out only, serving specific Arlington zip codes beginning at 8:00 am and ending at 12:00 noon. Besides the basic staple food items procured, other foods are donated by SMG parishioners, SMG School, Holy Rosary School children, Saint Joseph's Love trucks, Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Knights of Columbus, Salvation Army, and others.

Saint Therese Baby's World

Volunteers distribute baby items to needy families every Tuesday and Saturday, excluding holidays, by appointment, take out only, beginning at 8:00 am and ending by 12:00 Noon. Items donated include new clothes, clean used clothing, diapers, formula, baby food, etc. Special donations are received via birthday parties, SMG school children/National Jr. Honor Society and private contributions.

Thanksgiving Basket Ministry

The social ministry reaches out to needy families on Thanksgiving by collecting, preparing and distributing food baskets. A "Love" truck weekend is sponsored for parishioners to assist in providing requested items or by donating funds or gift cards.

Tools for School

Our parish collects new and gently used school supplies from parishioners and the local community. These are distributed to needy children at the beginning of the school year and as needed, helping them to overcome social embarrassment and impediments to learning. The group also collects supplies to supplement the parish school teacher's "Wish List," assisting the teachers throughout the school year with items they would otherwise have to purchase themselves.

SMG Saint Vincent de Paul Conference

The Society of Saint Vincent de Paul (SVdP) is a volunteer lay Catholic organization. Members are called Vincentians, and come from all ages, socioeconomic backgrounds, and cultures. No act of charity is too small for Vincentians. Through the Saint Maria Goretti SVdP Conference, we will honor the mission of the Society by offering assistance to those who have fallen upon times of hardship and personal crisis. We will assist those individuals and families that need basic necessities such as food, utility and rent payments through home visits of two people. The home visit is what separates the Society from other social agencies. The role of the Vincentian is not only to provide financial assistance but to be loving, supportive, and compassionate. It is through serving those in need that we live the gospel message of loving our neighbor. We work in conjunction with, and in support of, the existing Social Ministry program at Saint Maria Goretti Catholic Church.

Youth Formation K-4

K-4-Youth Ministry

Youth in kindergarten through grade 4 encounter God and build a firm foundation of faith through multisensory, creative activities & catechesis using the Ignatius Faith & Life Series and the Sunday Gospel readings. Sessions are held Sunday mornings from 9:15 am to 10:30 am.

Vacation Bible School

Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

The RCIC program is offered for children in 2nd through 4th grade who have not yet been baptized and are now seeking to develop an understanding of and desiring to embrace the Catholic Faith. RCIC meets Sunday mornings to prepare for Baptism, First Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion.

Special Sacramental Preparation (SSP) Grades 3-4

SSP is offered for those children in 3rd & 4th grade that have been baptized in the Catholic faith or another faith tradition but have not yet received First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Classes are Sunday mornings.

Catechist for K-4 Youth Ministry

Catechists present the Catholic Faith in such a way that children both understand and embrace it. They must be confirmed Catholics in good standing with the Church who love children and are able to work with aides and other adult volunteers to prepare an effective weekly lesson plan. K-4 youth ministry classes are held on Sunday morning from 9:15 am to 10:30 am. Training is provided.

Catechist Aide for K-4 Youth Ministry

Aides help in the faith formation of our children by running errands, supervising the classroom, and performing other helpful duties in conjunction with the Catechist.

Office Assistant for K-4 Youth Ministry

Office assistants help to ensure that classes run smoothly. They unlock and prepare classrooms, collect attendance sheets, monitor the hallways, and assist Catechists if extra help is needed.

Vacation Bible School Adult Volunteer

Vacation Bible School (VBS) is a powerful, fun-filled week of sharing the Gospel with children in kindergarten through 4th grade. Adult volunteers serve as small group leaders, check-in helpers, our decorating team, the clean-up crew, and more.

SSP Catechists prepare children in 3rd and 4th grade to receive First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Catechists must be confirmed Catholics in good standing with the Church. Classes are Sunday mornings.

Middle School Youth Ministry Grades 5-8

Disciples have had a personal encounter with Jesus and have made a conscious decision to entrust their very lives to him. Through the Holy Spirit, Middle School Youth Ministry seeks to facilitate this encounter and to move youth from an inherited faith to an owned faith. 5th-8th grade youth meet on Sunday evenings from 6:15-8:15 pm for dinner, small group discipleship, Adoration, service, and fun. Every youth (public, private, and homeschooled) is welcome. Small group leaders must be a confirmed Catholics in good standing with the church. Training is provided.
