

Parish Membership

St. Mary is one of the largest Parishes in the Milwaukee Archdiocese. The parish has approximately 3,200 families, or about 11,000 members. All are welcomed and encouraged to register as members of the parish. Young adults over 18 years old should register as members even if still living at home. Registration is a simple process that begins with a welcome session.

Membership is essential to full life in the parish. It is necessary to be a member to prepare to receive sacraments and also affects placement for registration with the Parish School and Catholic Formation programs.

Parish History

St. Mary Catholic Faith Community is gifted with a rich heritage. Our roots go back to the time when Wisconsin was just a Territory. We began in a log church measuring only 24 ft. by 36 ft. which was built on the site of the present cemetery sometime between 1839 and 1842. The congregation numbered about 140 families, most of Irish decent.

A larger frame church was built in 1858 just west of where the log church stood. The cost was \$7,000—a fortune in the mid 1800's. This church served our community for 35 years.

A large, Cream City brick church, located between the old rectory and Edgerton Avenue served as our faith community from 1893 to 1963. A rectory was built in 1915 and was located along the former frontage road (the original Forest Home Plank Road prior to becoming a frontage road). The rectory was raised to make way for our new church and stone from the front of that building was used in the foundation of our new parish sign.

In the post-war years, there was tremendous growth in suburbia and St. Mary's expanded its mission to include a parish school for the increasing number of children born. A long anticipated parish school—eight rooms, a kitchen and a hall—opened in September of 1954. The School Sisters of St. Francis became the primary teachers here over the years. There were 231 students who opened this new school. Later, a convent was built to house the sisters. When the sisters no longer taught here, the convent became the parish offices. A new church and additional classrooms were built in 1960 to serve an ever-growing congregation of more than 800 families. In September of 1960 there were 470 students in St. Mary Parish School.

By the mid 1980's, the buildings again were too small to handle the growing parish of 1700 families. The worship space was turned 90 degrees and a balcony was added in this renovation. Also a new wing was added which provided an addition to the school and a Community Centre (gymnasium).

The new millennium saw our parish numbers increasing to the point where we were again outgrowing every area of our facilities. We realized the need for additional space to educate our children—the 700 plus who attend public schools, and also attend religious education classes here—and for our parish school, where there was a need for defined space for art, computer, science and kindergarten classes. Meeting space to accommodate all of the various ministries was at a premium and the size and quality of our worship space clearly had met its limitations.

In 2000, our Parish Council addressed the need for a larger church, additional school, meeting and office space, as well as upgrading of the existing buildings and expanded parking. A campaign was begun in 2001 to fund this project. Groundbreaking for the new church followed on Father's Day in June of 2002. What started in a log cabin with a few farmers has now grown to be one of the largest parishes in the archdiocese, serving approximately 3,400 families or about 12,000 people! Dedication of our new worship space, Gathering Space, classrooms, and offices occurred on September 28, 2003.

It is because of the gifts of those who have gone before us that we have this beautiful place to gather, worship, educate and form our children. We continue to build our faith by building our future.

Sacraments

To make arrangements for celebrating the sacraments of Anointing of the Sick, Baptism or Matrimony, call the Parish Office at (414) 425-2174.

To make arrangements for celebrating the sacraments of First Eucharist, First Reconciliation or Confirmation, call the Catholic Formation Office at (414) 425-3101.

To request a visit or communion for the sick, call the Parish Office at (414) 425-2174. If there is an emergency or special circumstances, call the Parish Office and you will be put in contact with a pastoral staff member.

Baptism

As parents, you are asked to register for baptism with the parish during the first trimester of pregnancy, or when adoption is certain. During the preparation time, you are invited to come to formation classes and you will have the opportunity to sit down with a member of our Pastoral Staff and other couples to talk about your understanding of Baptism, responding especially to the question: "Why do you want your child Baptized in the faith?" This is a wonderful time, not only to make your lives ready for the new child, but also to prepare the ground of faith for your child.

Baptisms are typically celebrated the second and fourth weekends during liturgies and on the third Sunday at 1:00PM.

First Reconciliation/First Eucharist

These sacraments are usually celebrated in 2nd grade. Preparation is a combination of classroom instruction (school and evening formation) and parish-based (for all children and parents) events.

Confirmation

Young people can make the decision for Confirmation at age 16 and junior year of high school. Preparation includes classes, service, retreat experience and worship opportunities.

Adult Confirmation preparation is done in a tri-parish collaboration and begins in October.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

This is a process through which adults are initiated into the Catholic Church. It is designed for 1) any adult not yet baptized; 2) any adult baptized in another Christian tradition; 3) any adult baptized Catholic who was not raised practicing the Catholic Faith and who now wants to complete their initiation into the church through reception of Eucharist and Confirmation.

Reconciliation

Reconciliation is not only a Sacrament, but an attitude we must develop toward God according to individual needs. Prayer and meditation, as well as occasions of reconciliation in other liturgies, should be used in addition to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is celebrated Thursday evenings at 5:00 p.m. in the Reconciliation Room in the Southeast corner of the Church. Private Reconciliation is available anytime by personal arrangement with one of the priests.

Marriage

The decision to enter into Christian Marriage is a major milestone in the life of a man and woman. In order to be married at St. Mary, the bride, the groom or both must be registered as adult members of the parish. It is expected that they regularly participate at Sunday Mass. Weddings must be scheduled at least nine months prior to the anticipated wedding date. They are normally scheduled at 12 Noon or 2:00 p.m. on a Saturday and we celebrate a maximum of two weddings per Saturday. We also schedule weddings on Friday afternoons at 1:30 or 3:30 p.m. Weddings are not celebrated at St. Mary during the seasons of Advent or Lent or on Festival Weekend.

The Sacrament of Marriage requires preparation like most other sacraments. After an initial meeting with the priest or deacon, the couple will meet with a married couple from the parish to do a pre-marital inventory, they will attend an enrichment day for the engaged, and will meet with one of the parish musicians and the liturgist. The scheduling of a wedding begins with a call to the parish priest by the bride or groom.

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick can be administered to a member of the faithful whose health is marked by illness, surgery or old age. It is important to remember that people are encouraged to receive the sacrament during the early stages of illness. Do not delay anointing. This is NOT the "last rights". The sacrament can be repeated whenever the sick person again falls in to a serious sickness or whenever a more serious crisis develops during the same sickness.

The anointing of the sick is meant for the living. If there is a person in your family who is ill, chronically sick, growing weaker or disabled, preparing for surgery, they should receive the anointing of the sick. If a family calls for the anointing of a loved one, it is a great support for the sick person to have their whole family and friends present during the actual anointing.

A communal celebration of the Anointing of the Sick is typically celebrated following the 4:00PM mass on the 1st Saturday of the month and at all masses 2 other weekends a year.

Christian Burial

When someone dies, contact the funeral home of your choice. Usually, the funeral director will contact the parish office in order to arrange for the funeral of the deceased person. At that time, necessary information will be given to the parish and a date and time for the funeral liturgy and vigil will be set based on the priest, musician, space, funeral home and family availability.

The priest, deacon or pastoral minister will be in contact with the family to arrange a meeting in order to prepare the liturgy, reflect on the life of the deceased, select readings and hymns, discuss family participants, etc.







How do I get an announcement/insert in the bulletin?

How do I request a Mass Intention?

Contact the Parish Office or stop in during business hours. We take up to 12 intentions for any given weekend and 3 intentions per weekday Mass. We suggest scheduling no more than two Masses per month. Donations accepted.

How do I change my address?

How do I know how much to give?

We ask each parish family to prayerfully consider a contribution of \$150 per month. We realize that not all families will be able to contribute at this level, but hopefully some will have the ability to do more. School families are expected to contribute a minimum of \$900.00/year, or \$75.00/month, in addition to tuition and school fees.

Where does the money go that I contribute?

Contributions to our operations fund the mission of our church and school including our mortgage.

How do I get information for myself or someone I know, about becoming Catholic?

Many non-Catholic adults who come in contact with St. Mary's express an interest in joining our Church. The parish will gladly provide contact information and prayerfully supports this important journey with Christ. Please contact the office to schedule an appointment with a pastoral staff member.

What is Scrip/Gift Card Program?

Our program is an easy way for you to support St. Mary, without increasing your monthly contributions. SCRIP cards are issued by a wide variety of retail companies. The merchants provide the purchaser a rebate, ranging from 2 to 18%. You are able to assign the rebate to the parish, which becomes a tax deductible contribution. You are also able to use it to offset tuition at the parish school. And it costs you nothing extra.

How do I enroll my child in the Parish School?

How can my child become an Altar Server?

Students 5th grade and older can sign up to be an Altar Server. Training is required. Training sessions take place in January each year. See the Contact Persons sheet for the name and phone number of the Altar Server Coordinator to get more information.
