CHURCH COUNCIL: Consists of the Pastor, Principal, Chairman, Vice-Chairmen, Secretary, Treasurer, and the Elected Chairpersons of the Administrative Boards.

OFFICERS' DUTIES:

- Chairman is the "Administrative Head" of the congregational program.
 He calls meetings, presides at all meetings of the congregation, and meets periodically with the pastoral ministry team staff.
- Vice-Chairmen assist in the duties of the "Administrative Head" of the Congregation. They serve as Chairmen of the Personnel Committee.
- Secretary is present at all congregational meetings and enters minutes. He/she signs all official and legal documents in the name of and by the direction of the Church Council and the Congregation.
- Treasurer is responsible for accurate recording of all receipts and disbursements. He/she presents written financial reports, submits permanent records, and is responsible for monthly remission of offerings. Pat Powell, Business Director, works with the Treasurer and the Board of Stewardship.

THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN SCHOOL assists the Principal and School staff with providing a quality Christian Education for students Preschool through the 8th grade.

- **THE BOARD OF ELDERS** is responsible for the Worship Life of the Parish. The Board assists the Pastor with worship services, hospital visits, and home visits. The Board of Elders also oversee:
 - Public Worship responsible for the conducting of and orderliness of public worship
 - Acolytes train and supervise the acolytes
 - Altar Guild prepares the altar for Holy Communion, which includes placing of the altar flowers. In addition, they ensure that the seasonal liturgical paraments and banners are hung. Contact Lea Hepworth (361-3741)
 - Ushers train and supervise the ushering staff
 - Communion Assistants identify and train persons to assist with the distribution of communion during public worship
 - Video Recording train, supervise and distribute the digital recordings of worship services
- **THE BOARD OF ENDOWMENT** administers all income and accounts of the Endowment and Memorial Funds.
- **THE BOARD OF EVANGELISM** brings the Gospel to the unchurched and arranges for the enlistment of all of God's people in the work of spreading the Gospel. One of their responsibilities is for recruiting and scheduling door greeters before services.
- **THE BOARD OF HUMAN CARE** works to secure and provide assistance for members of the congregation as needed, and to the church and community at large. They have collections for various helping ministries. Contact Pat Heyer (393-0137).
 - **Health Ministry/Parish Nursing** coordinates, trains, and utilizes volunteers to help meet congregational health needs, including offering blood pressure checks on the second and fourth Sundays of each month. We always need nurses who would consider volunteering to help with blood pressure checks. Contact Jeanette Kellerman (364-6072).
 - **Stephen Ministers** are trained congregational members who come alongside people during difficult times to listen, care, and provide emotional and spiritual support. All contacts are confidential. If you are interested in becoming a Stephen Minister or would like to be a care receiver, please contact Pat Heyer (393-0137) or Karen Kroemer (363-3349).
 - **Passing on the Faith** gives newly-baptized children a wooden "Faith Chest" that contains several Christian training materials and a quilt. Children also receive age-appropriate Christian books at designated times until they reach age 3. Contact Phyllis Maeder (721-7913) if you would like to donate a quilt or use woodworking skills to make the Faith Chests.

- **THE BOARD OF PARISH EDUCATION** plans and administers all part-time parish educational programs of the congregation (e.g., Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Bible classes, etc.), determines policies, selects personnel for the various agencies, provides the necessary means and the facilities for the agencies, directs and supervises the part-time parish education programs.
 - Sunday School for students ages 3 years through 8th grade, meets in the school each Sunday morning at 10:30 a.m.
 - Vacation Bible School Conducted annually for students 3 years old through those entering 6th grade.
 - Library Committee meets the 1st Monday of the month at 9:30 a.m. to process books and take general care of the library. Contact Deanna Acord (396-8960), or Rose McDonald (366-6743).
- **THE BOARD OF PARISH FELLOWSHIP** helps to strengthen the fellowship between members of the congregation spiritually and socially, to integrate new members into the life of the congregation, and to build up a spirit of mutual cooperation among all members of Trinity congregation.
 - **Fellowship Club** meets periodically for a potluck meal and fellowship. All are welcome. Lutheran Layman's League is sponsored by the Fellowship Club of Trinity. Contact Alice Hoffmeier (365-8586).
 - Trinity Lunch Ladies meet periodically for fellowship and a meal. Current time and place information are announced in the bulletins, or contact the church office.
- **THE BOARD OF PUBLIC RELATIONS** works to make the congregation known to the community as a Christ-centered ministry of the Gospel. The objectives of this group are:
 - To keep the community informed of Trinity Lutheran Church and its activities through Gazette ads, 1st Avenue message board, and other publications when possible.
 - To keep the congregation informed of internal activities and programs through various means of publications and directories. The Public Relations Board maintains the Church Facebook page, YouTube Channel, TV Monitors in church entryways, and other general in-reach sources.

THE BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP - The basic objectives of this board are:

- To initiate programs for the development of good stewardship attitudes in the members of the congregation in regard to time, talent and treasures.
- To provide for training and utilization of members of the congregation for the work of Christ's Kingdom.
- To ensure the financial stability of the congregation and its work through a developed program of dedicated, proportionate, first fruit giving.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES is responsible for the maintenance and repair of the physical properties of Trinity congregation. They meet the second Thursday of the month. Our custodian works with the Board.

THE BOARD OF YOUTH & FAMILY MINISTRY helps foster the spiritual growth of the youth of Trinity's congregation as well as promotes genuine Christian Fellowship for the congregation's young people and their families. Programming for the young people of our church ranges from 6th grade to Senior High. Our ministry includes various activities, meetings, retreats/gatherings, Bible studies, and service opportunities. Youth in 5th through 8th grades are encouraged to attend the Sunday Middle School Ministries at the school each week, and Senior High have their own Bible study time on Sundays after the 9:00 a.m. service in our Youth Room. More activities are available beyond that as well. The Senior High Youth space is there to study God's word, relax, have fun, and build relationships. Trinity Home Missionary Society (LWML)

Trinity Home Missionary Society was formed on February 12, 1919 by twelve ladies of Trinity Lutheran Church as the new English-speaking society to aid the needs of Trinity. Any time their church or school was in need, the Home Missionary Ladies gave generously of their time, talents and donations. As of today, this is the purpose and objective of this society: to promote the welfare of the church through Christian service, fellowship, and ministry.

In 1942, Home Missionary became charter members of the newly formed Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) and its objectives of mission education, inspiration, and service. An additional objective is to nurture spiritual life through devotions, prayer, and Bible study.

Down through the years, the Home Missionary has consistently given of their time and also donated very generously to the building maintenance of our school. As long as we have women with fervent love in their heart for the Lord and the eager desire to fulfill the wants and needs of our church, we will have Home Missionary. This zeal shall be passed on from grandmother to mother to daughter.

All women who are communicant members at Trinity and have expressed an interest in joining are eligible for membership. Home Missionary has several sub-groups that meet at different times and concentrate on certain activities. As a large group, Home Missionary usually meets on the first Thursday of the month for a program and business meeting.

What We Believe

The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod teaches and responds to the love of the Triune God: the Father, creator of all that exists; Jesus Christ, the Son, who became human to suffer and die for the sins of all human beings and to rise to life again in the ultimate victory over death and Satan; and the Holy Spirit, who creates faith through God's Word and Sacraments. The three persons of the Trinity are coequal and coeternal, one God.

Being "Lutheran," our congregations accept and teach Bible-based teachings of Martin Luther that inspired the reformation of the Christian Church in the 16th century. The teachings of Luther and the reformers can be summarized in three short phrases: Grace alone, Faith alone, Scripture alone.

Grace alone

God loves the people of the world, even though they are sinful, rebel against Him and do not deserve His love. He sent Jesus, His Son, to love the unlovable and save the ungodly.

Faith alone

By His suffering and death as the substitute for all people of all time, Jesus purchased and won forgiveness and eternal life for them. Those who hear this Good News and believe it have the eternal life that it offers. God creates faith in Christ and gives people forgiveness through Him.

Scripture alone

The Bible is God's inerrant and infallible Word, in which He reveals His Law and His Gospel of salvation in Jesus Christ. It is the sole rule and norm for Christian doctrine.
