WHAT IS THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH?



Eucharistic Exposition

Eucharistic Exposition is the worship of Christ truly present in the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance on the altar. The communal devotion is from 8:30 am to 9:30 am on 1st Friday. Parishioners commit to keeping watch with our Lord for one hour each month to insure the Blessed Sacrament is never unattended when exposed on the altar. During regular work hours the Church is opened for private devotion.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

Following parish training, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are commissioned to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ at

You must be baptized, confirmed, and receiving Eucharist regularly and be in good standing with the Catholic Church. This ministry will require orientation and ongoing education.

Lectors

Duties include Proclaiming the Word of God at Mass with reverence and understanding. Skills needed: Clear speaking voice. Love of God's Word and desire to study and reflect for each reading, an ease speaking in front of people, ability to proclaim the Word with conviction. This ministry will require orientation and ongoing education.

Marriage Preparation

St. Joseph's Marriage Ministry Team includes married couples in the Parish who have been trained to interpret the Foccus Inventory. This tool is designed to help the couples sharpen their communication skills. The Team also includes parishioners who assist the bridal couple during the rehearsal and wedding ceremony. They help support and direct the bridal couple, bridal party, family and guests to ensure that the wedding runs smoothly.

Music

Parishioners who enjoy playing an instrument or singing are invited to join our music ministry. The groups sing and provide instrumental support for the congregation during weekend liturgies and other liturgies throughout the year. All members are first and foremost responsible for understanding that as ministers of music we serve the community at St. Joseph Parish. All members share the responsibility for learning music and attending rehearsals.

The adult choir, for men and women who are at least 16 years of age, rehearses on Wednesday evenings. The Youth Ensemble, for members 12 years of age and older, sings at 2-3 weekend liturgies per month, as well as special feast days, i.e. Christmas. The contemporary group is a small group of men and women with specific music training, knowledge and skills. An audition is required. Please contact the music director for more information.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

The RCIA is the process which prepares unbaptized adults to become full active members of the Catholic Church. The process can also include adults baptized in other Christian traditions and uncatechized baptized Catholics. The process provides an opportunity to acquaint adults with Catholic teachings and practices. RCIA culminates at the Easter Vigil when participants come into full communion with the Catholic Church. Each participant has a sponsor who helps provide support and encouragement along the journey. We also have RCIA for youth

Two-Week Summer Religious Education/Youth Formation

This is part of the Parish's Religious Education Process which provides for all students in grades 1-8. The 2-week session in June follows the closing of the school year. We use the Be My Disciple curriculum exploring doctrines and teachings of the Church. Music & Art/Crafts are also built into the program.

Preschool/Kindergarten Religious Education

Christ-centered and age-appropriate curriculum featuring activities, Bible stories, ritual, music, crafts, prayers, etc. They will gather on Sunday mornings during the 11:00 am Mass. The classes begin in September and go until April not including holy days/holidays.

First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion

St. Joseph provides a family centered and parish based sacramental preparation process, open to each child, second grade or older, who is a member of the Catholic Church. The Church's philosophy is that the family, particularly the parents, is the first and primary religious educators of their children. In support of this, we provide sacramental preparation for second graders for the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion during the academic year. Expectations are that the children have completed Religious Education Classes for grades 1 & 2. In addition to the catechesis, we provide a parent orientation and a parent/child retreat.

Confirmation

St. Joseph parish provides preparation for Confirmation beginning in the spring every other year. Confirmation takes place in November of the same year. Our next session begins in March 2016. The program makes use of "Chosen" by Ascension Press. This series covers a great number of important topics related to a basic understanding of the Catholic faith appropriate to Junior High and High School students. It has video, reading and discussion components. Our classes meet twice each month until November as well as two weeks daily in June, during the summer program. Participants are expected to attend a retreat day, and an evening designed for students with their sponsors. Students who are in at least the seventh grade by the spring of 2016 may join. Students must have attended prior religious education classes leading up to junior high level catechesis.
