Adult Education Fr. Mike O'Rourke, O.P. (504) 482-4156
St. Dominic Adult Religious Education is committed to bringing quality presentations and programs to our parishioners in order to help them understand their Catholic faith better and to assist them in deepening their relationship with Jesus Christ.

Toward that end our catechists offer presentations on church doctrine, scripture, prayer, sacraments, church history, morals, the family and on a variety of other topics. Our teachers also provides evenings of recollection, prayer time together, and weekend retreats---all for the greater glory of God and all to serve God's children.

Altar Servers George Voulgarakis (504) 451-4544
Serve at Sunday Masses, funerals, weddings and other special Masses and services. Fourth grade (and above) boys and girls of the parish are eligible. Two meetings are held at the beginning of the school year. Other meetings may be called.

CCD John Smestad, Jr., M.R.E. (504) 486-9731
St. Dominic Parish CCD/Religious Education program serves to provide formation in the Catholic faith for students not enrolled in a Catholic school. Parents have a serious obligation to ensure proper on-going religious education for their children in grades Kindergarten through high school. The Archdiocese of New Orleans requires that any student not attending a Catholic school be enrolled in a parish religious education program.

Also, it is the policy of the archbishop that sacraments such as First Communion and Confirmation may not be administered without at least two consecutive years of religious instruction prior to the year of reception of the sacrament. The parish CCD classes are held on Wednesdays in Aquinas Hall from September through May, with grades Kindergarten through 6th meeting from 4:00 PM-5:30 PM, and grades 7 through high school meeting from 7:00 PM-8:30 PM. The curriculum, which includes First Reconciliation and First Communion preparation for second grade students, is provided by the Archdiocese of New Orleans. The Religious Education Office also coordinates preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation for all eligible high school students in the parish.

The St. Dominic CYO (Catholic Youth Organization) is the youth ministry outreach of the parish and involves teenagers (8th through 12th grades) in faith formation, leadership development, social activities, service projects, athletic leagues, and archdiocesan youth ministry programs and events. The regular meeting is usually held on the second Sunday of each month after the 5:30 PM Mass, and additional activities take place throughout every month year-round. The St. Dominic Emmaus Retreat Ministry is a parish-based ministry that offers retreats which provide the time and opportunity to pray, self-reflect, examine our relationship with Jesus Christ, and fellowship with men or women just like yourself.

The retreat (offered separately for “men only” and for “women only”) is held at the beautiful Rosaryville Retreat Center in Ponchatoula, LA. It is presented by laymen & laywomen, guided by the Holy Spirit, and based on the scripture passage found in the gospel of Luke 24:13-35, the “Road to Emmaus” reading.

The purpose of the Emmaus Retreat Ministry and the retreats is for each person to grow spiritually, develop a greater knowledge of and a deeper relationship with Our Lord, Jesus Christ, and better understand how to love and serve God and His children.

The Emmaus Retreats are for adults 18 yrs. and older. The retreats are held throughout the year on weekends beginning at 5:00 PM of Friday evening and concluding after the 5:30 PM Mass on Sunday evening. Transportation to and from Rosaryville Retreat Center is provided.

Whether you are just starting on your faith journey or need help getting back on the road, we hope that you take advantage of this opportunity to attend one of the Emmaus Retreats.

Evenings for the Engaged..Deacon John Pippenger..... (504) 835-6479
The Evening for the Engaged Ministry in St. Dominic is composed of a team of 22 couples who have been trained by the Archdiocese of New Orleans Family Life Office. These couples with the priest or deacon help prepare the couple for marriage. The team couple will host an engaged couple in their home for sessions. The topics to be covered during the sessions are Communication, Faith, Finance, Reality, Sexuality, and Sacramentality of Marriage. Each meeting lasts about 2 1/2 hours. The session on sacrament either the priest or deacon will come to the meeting and share insights on the sacrament of marriage. Evenings for the Engaged is one of the three choices a couple has for their marriage preparation in both St. Dominic Parish and the Archdiocese of New Orleans.

Family Advisory Board..Deacon John Pippenger (504) 835-6479
This Board is comprised of 14 couples, and the clergy for St. Dominic Parish. The couples commit to a 3 year term. This ministry meets 8-10 times a year on a Sunday Evening. This group of St .Dominic Parishioners advise the Pastor on Matters involving family life. They also coordinate the following parish events: Family Day, Supper and Substance, Evenings for the Engaged, Baptismal Seminars, World Marriage Day, Right to Life Programs, Father/Son Sexuality Program, Mother/Daughter Sexuality Program, prayer blanket ministry, and the list goes on... This group plans and coordinate these events in concert with our parish organizations. Together we can help keep Family Life in St. Dominic Parish strong and vibrant.

To support parish activities, foster religious vocations, promote aid to retarded citizens and other charities, to help finance K.C. Youth Expansion Programs; to promote retreats to Manresa, devotion to the rosary, to engage in community activities and provide social interaction among K.C. families. Meetings are held twice per month.

The St. Dominic Men's Club (SDMC) mission is to encourage all men of the parish to lead by example and serve the needs of the Church and school.

Membership is open to any man affiliated with St. Dominic Parish—one does not need a child attending school at St. Dominic to be eligible.
