VISITOR INFORMATION

Frequently Asked Questions

What times are regular Sunday services? Are the services different? Our regular service times are 8:00 am, 10:30 am, and 5:00 pm. Childcare is available for all morning services for children 3K and younger. The **8:00 am service** includes Eucharist (Rite I) and music for the processional and recessional only. The **10:30 am service** in the Nave offers Eucharist (Rite II) and features additional hymns and a choral offering, as well as Children's Chapel for 4K through second-grade. At 10:30 am in Graham Hall, we also offer Service of The Word, combining ancient liturgy with current music that delights and inspires all ages. The **5:00 pm service** includes Eucharist (Rite II) and offers a more informal style of worship. Dress is casual, and childcare is available for children 4K and younger.

Is nursery or childcare available? Are my children welcome in the services? We love children here at Saint Luke's, and as you will see, we have plenty of them! Your children are welcome in any of the services, or you may bring them to the Nursery (6 weeks through 3K, except for the 5:00 pm service which includes nursery through 4K).

What time is Sunday School? Sunday School begins September 13, 2015. We have offerings for all ages, and classes meet from 9:15 am to 10:15 am. The last day of Sunday School is May 1, 2016. You and your children are welcome to attend any of the classes. For more information, see the Christian Education section of this book. Also, check our newsletter, the totems in the Claypool Commons and on the second floor, or visit our website at www.saint-lukes.com for specific offerings.

Where do I park? We have spaces reserved for visitors in the back parking lot. Look for the first two spaces on the left in the first aisle of the back lot. There are four official blue handicapped parking spaces in the side lot (on the left when you enter the driveway) and four handicapped parking spaces on Montrose Road in front of the church. The remaining spaces in the side lot are reserved for Senior Adults. We also offer assisted parking (at no charge) for seniors and those who are physically challenged. Simply drive under the porte-cochere to the parking stand. An attendant will greet you and park your car, and return it to you when you are ready to leave the church.

HOW TO BECOME A MEMBER OF SAINT LUKE'S

If I am a member of another Episcopal church? If you are coming to us from an Episcopal background, contact our Parish Secretary, Nancy Cain (802-6200 or ncain@saint-lukes.com), and ask her to contact your previous church to transfer your membership.

If I have been baptized in a church other than an Episcopal Church? Register the date and place of your baptism with our parish secretary, Nancy Cain (802-6200 or ncain@saint-luke.com). You will then be a baptized member of Saint Luke's and able to participate in all programs and ministries. You will not, however, be eligible to serve in or vote on an elected position (Vestry or diocesan committee) until you are Confirmed or Received.

What is Confirmation and how do I become confirmed? Confirmation is a sacramental rite in which persons who have been duly prepared make a mature, public affirmation of their faith and a commitment to the responsibilities of Baptism and receive the laying-on-of-hands by the Bishop. The Inquirers class, a five week adult confirmation class taught by the Rector, will begin on Sunday, October 18, from 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm and will include one evening session with dinner and an Instructed Eucharist. The Rite of Confirmation for adults will take place on Sunday, December 6 at the 10:30 am service. If you would like to attend, please contact Jeanna Speegle (802-6218 or jspeegle@saint-lukes.com).

What if I have been confirmed in another church other than an Episcopal Church? If you have been confirmed in another denomination (Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Orthodox), having received the laying-on-of-hands from a bishop, please speak to any of the clergy. They will arrange for you to be received by the bishop. Persons who wish to be received generally take the adult confirmation class as a refresher of their previous preparation and as an introduction to the Episcopal Church. These classes run for five weeks, beginning Sunday, October 18, from 4:00 pm to 5:00 pm. If you would like to attend, please contact Jeanna Speegle (802-6218 or jspeegle@saint-lukes.com).

Is it possible to speak with a priest? Absolutely. You may make an appointment by calling the church office (871-3583), or contact one of the priests listed in the back of this book.

How can I stay in touch with what is happening at Saint Luke's? If you would like to receive our weekly digital newsletter and other e-mail announcements, please contact Nancy Cain (ncain@saint-lukes.com or 802-6200) with your e-mail address. We will mail a paper copy of our newsletter for those who prefer. We also encourage you to frequently view our website at www.saint-lukes.com. When you are in the building, our announcement totems, on the first and second floors, show information about current happenings.

PASTORAL SERVICES

Baptism - Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body, the Church. The bond which God establishes in Baptism is indissoluble. Baptisms take place during services at various times throughout the year and also on Holy Saturday. Adults are most welcome to be baptized if they have not been baptized previously. To schedule a baptism, contact Johnailla Wright, Assistant to the Rector (jwright@saint-lukes.com or 802-6208). Private baptisms are available.

Confirmation - Confirmation is a public affirmation of one's faith when one chooses to live out their baptismal vows. To become a voting member of Saint Luke's, one must have received the Rite of Confirmation in the Episcopal Church. At Saint Luke's, we will confirm adults on December 6, 2015, and our youth confirmation will take place on Sunday, April 10, 2016 at the 10:30 am service.

Weddings - A wedding is a joyous and holy occasion. Any man and woman sincere in a commitment to the establishment of a Christian marriage and willing to conform to the standards of the Church may be married at Saint Luke's. The following guidelines also apply: (1) At least one member of the couple must be a baptized Christian and a member of the Episcopal Church. One member of the couple should also be a member of Saint Luke's. (2) At least two witnesses must be present at the wedding. (3) The couple must be prepared by a suitable counseling program. (4) The couple must be married in accordance with the Laws of the State of Alabama. (5) The priest acting as officiant requires at least thirty days notice prior to the wedding. Weddings may not take place during Lent, Holy Week, or in the four days prior to Christmas. (6) Weddings of persons who are not members of Saint Luke's may be performed only with the approval of the officiating priest. (7) If either party in the proposed marriage has ever been married previously, the priest may not proceed with the wedding without the written consent of the Bishop of Alabama. Weddings are scheduled through the rector's office. Please contact Johnailla Wright (jwright@saint-lukes.com or 802-6208).

Funerals - The end of our physical life in death is a reality we all must face. Our hope in everlasting life is based on our trust in Jesus' resurrection and the words, "nothing can separate us from the love of Christ." Please contact our clergy as soon as possible in times of sickness or death of a loved one. We want to be present for you whenever you face loss or grief. If you need to reach a priest after office hours, call our emergency number (999-9867). We have two resources, *Christian Burial at Saint Luke's* and the *G.I.F.T. Guide*. *G.I.F.T.* stands for Gaining Information for Tomorrow, and the Guide gives guidance on putting one's affairs in order and planning for end of life choices. To download a copy of the *G.I.F.T. Guide*, go to www.saint-lukes.com, click on Ministries, click on Health Ministries, and look for the download button. A copy of *Christian Burial at Saint Luke's* is available at the Church office, or contact Sandy Porter: 802-6207 or sporter@saint-lukes.com. A columbarium within the Chapel and a garden columbarium provide niches for burial at Saint Luke's. We also have a scattering garden. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is an approach to religious education rooted in the Bible and the liturgy, with consideration given to the developmental stage of the child. The aim is for each child to deepen their innate relationship with God and connect the prayers of the Liturgy to the words of the Bible. In order for us to keep your children as safe and happy as we can, we ask that you sign your child in and out each week.

3rd Graders - At the beginning of the Sunday School year, each third-grader is presented with a Bible from the church. The entire Sunday School year is devoted to teaching basic Bible concepts to create a firm foundation for them. We strongly encourage students to attend every Sunday as each lesson builds on the one before. During the 2nd semester of Sunday school, 3rd graders will also take part in a 6 week retreat as they learn more about the Sacrament of Reconciliation and prepare for their first Solemn Communion. *Room 211. **This year's Bible Presentation will be held on Sunday, September 13, 2015.***

4th Graders, Club 4:9 - This year will continue the focus on foundational stories and basic Bible concepts to help create a firm foundation for our fourth grade children. We strongly encourage these students to attend each Sunday, as the lessons build on each other. *Room 214*

5th & 6th Graders - Preteen Class - The preteen years are so special and we want to acknowledge that here at church. Our hope is that they spend a year together to learn and grow in the Lord while also having fellowship and outreach projects together. Each Sunday morning they will attend Sunday School in a fun and upbeat manner while learning life application lessons from the Bible. *Room 212*

Sunday Morning Children's Worship

Children's Chapel is offered at the 10:30 am service, year round, for children *4K through 2nd grade*. Children who come to Sunday School will be escorted to Chapel by the adult leaders. Children who do not come to Sunday School will follow the cross at the designated time to the Children's Chapel. All children will return to the Nave to have Eucharist with their parents. Besides our annual contribution to the Diocese for local work, Saint Luke's funds a number of local organizations providing needed services and outreach to our community. The agencies we supported this year through grants include: The Abbey, The Bell Center, Bridge Ministries, Camp McDowell, Community Furniture Bank, Community Grief Support, Community Kitchens, Episcopal Place, Family Promise, Firehouse Shelter, The Foundry, Greater Birmingham Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, King's Home, Magic City Harvest, M-Power Ministries, Norwood Resource Center, Oasis Women's Counseling Center, Pathways, PreSchool Partners, Sawyerville Day Camp, and STAIR. In addition to these grants we provide volunteers and collect needed resources to many other agencies and groups.

But outreach ministry is not only about allocating money or collecting needed items, it is about making connections with God's people in need. There are many opportunities to do that here. PRAYING, SERVING, AND GIVING TOGETHER AS A VILLAGE CHURCH 2015 NARRATIVE BUDGET

VILLAGE WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Whether ancient or modern, music is the heart of our worship at Saint Luke's. Blessed with the finest musicians and choirs during both morning and evening services, our song brings us together as a family. Saint Luke's is known far and wide as having one of the finest music programs in the region. New offerings, such as God & Jazz alongside our soaring Anglican choral Evensongs and instrumental settings of the Mass, are bringing new interest and new visitors. It takes many hands to lead worship. In addition to our clergy, some 300 people serve as Lay Eucharist Ministers, acolytes, ushers, altar guild, and choirs. These volunteers span the generations, and offer important opportunities for service in God's house. Beginning this calendar year we introduced a "modern" service, combining new music to our ancient liturgy, concurrent with our 10:30 service. Titled "The Word" and including worship and communion at one Altar upstairs, the results have been remarkable. We have seen new faces joining us for worship, and approximately 100 more people join us in prayer each Sunday. The amount of \$665,114 has been allocated for Worship and Music, or 19.9% of the budget.

VILLAGE EDUCATION: Saint Luke's is a thinking church, a searching church, an inquiring church. We offer Adult Sunday school classes to suit most every need, as well as mid week offerings and programs for groups, both large and small. For children, we offer learning that is both experiential (with our Montessori based atrium), and classic (with our third and fourth grade Bible Years). We offer Vacation Bible School in the summer and education for all ages on Wednesday nights. Our Youth learn both in study and worship, with service opportunities scheduled throughout the year. Much of what we do here is "in house," with our clergy and lay staff both writing and leading the finest Christian education opportunities in our city. Education leadership and materials for our Adults, Children, and Youth will cost \$360,176 or 10.8% of the budget.

VILLAGE CARE: Saint Luke's is a caring church, and our love for each other grows as we realize our need for each other. Our Pastoral Care team includes a Senior Ministries Coordinator, a Parish Nurse, trained Stephen Ministers, a Lay Visitors team, and clergy available to visit hospitals each day. Our Pastoral Care Team visits the home-bound, schedules activities and programs, and promotes general wellness, including exercise classes, blood pressure screenings, counseling, and grief support. Pastoral Care support will cost \$379,633, or 11.3% of the budget.

VILLAGE OUTREACH: Saint Luke's has a proud legacy of Outreach. Today more than fifty agencies benefit from grants, volunteers, or in-kind services from Saint Luke's. Outreach connects us to the larger village of Birmingham and beyond. Outreach makes our faith tactile, tangible, and helps us to grow as disciples of Jesus. These days our Outreach dollars have focused toward some aspect of addressing hunger, both at home and abroad. Our participation in the annual "Stop Hunger Now" draws hundreds of volunteers from our church as we join with other Christians from our community to stuff food bags for transport. Local agencies are considered as they address hunger issues in our city. This year Saint Luke's committed \$645,981 to local outreach, or 19.3% of the budget. In addition to direct cash distributions in the amount of \$600,000, Saint Luke's pays salary and expenses for Katie Rengers as Vicar of the Abbey.

VILLAGE FACILITIES: A Village Church belongs to the neighborhood and not only our members. We are generous with our space here, and from early morning until late most evenings, Saint Luke's serves as host to reunion groups, Bible studies, AA, support groups, and folks just stopping by for a sip of water or a trip to the restroom. We are a voting precinct and also proudly sponsor a Boy Scout Troop. We are a vibrant place in the heart of a vibrant village. Buildings and grounds upkeep costs approximately \$666,367 or 19.9% of the budget. After a needs assessment, we will launch a Capital Campaign in 2016.

VILLAGE COMMUNICATIONS: In a world where technology becomes ever more vital as well as ever changing, we seek to provide the most current and effective means of communicating to our parish. Our website and targeted advertisements in local publications such as *Village Living* offer welcome to newcomers and help to promote upcoming events. In-house publications such as our Lenten devotional showcase the talent and spirituality of our congregation. Sunday bulletins are user friendly and facilitate our worship. Plans are underway to upgrade our current website in the coming year. This year our communications budget is \$94,382, or 2.8% of the budget.

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATION: The remaining \$535,840 or, 16%, includes administration costs, supplies, and the personnel who make daily operations happen.

VILLAGE REVENUE: 93% of our General Fund Budget is received in the form of a pledge. The other 7% is from gifts, loose plate offerings, and other small categories. Currently we need additional pledges in the amount of \$57,169 to reach our budgeted goal of \$3,100,000.
