



We owe our Brotherhood and its leaders an enormous debt of gratitude. Emanu El would not be the welcoming community that it is without Brotherhood.


Thank you for all the blessings you bring us!

Over the years, particularly on New Member Shabbat, I would try to answer the question as to why it was important for people, and particularly Jews to belong to a congregation. This is not the time and the place to go through all my reasoning over the years. However, recently the Brotherhood Book Group read Rabbi Jonathan Sack's new book, *Morality: Restoring the Common Good in Divided Times*, in which he makes the case that "religious Americans are simply more likely to give of their time and money to others, not only within but also beyond their communities."

(p. 287) He goes on, "there is something about the tenor of relationships within a religious congregation that makes it the best tutorial in citizenship and good neighborliness." (p. 288) In other words congregational life brings out the best in us. It leads us to be the type of person we deep down desire to be: loving, caring, respectful, patient, and one who cares about the other as much as one cares for him/herself. Membership moves us from thinking about the 'I' to thoughts about the 'We.'

Belonging to a Temple, such as Temple Emanu El, gives meaning to one's life for we become aware that we are entrusted with the stories and the memories of Judaism to be passed on to the next generation. Stories that remind us of loving the stranger, that all people are created in God's image, that there has to be Justice in the world in order to counter the natural tendencies of revenge, and also that we are in a covenantal relationship (Brit) with God and with others in the community.

Your name in this directory signifies so much about the type of person you are and want to be. Your name in this directory says you are a proud Jew with a mission to bring the next generation to the teachings and morals of Judaism. Your name in this directory signifies that you are dedicated to leaving this world a little better off than how you found it.


