A Brief History of Our Lady of the Holy Souls Catholic Church

In 1926, His Excellence, The Most Reverend John B. Morris, D.D., endorsed a plan to erect a church which would care for the spiritual needs of his people who lived in Pulaski Heights of Little Rock. On June 1, 1926, a most desirable location was purchased. It was two blocks from Mount Saint Mary Academy and the Pulaski Heights street car line on a knoll overlooking the valley beneath it. In October 1926, construction began on a small, Spanish-Mission style chapel with a 30-foot bell tower.

On Sunday, January 2, 1927, the two hundred seat chapel was dedicated. Bishop Morris chose to make the new mission a memorial to his lifelong devotion to the Holy Souls in Purgatory and to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He named it Our Lady of the Holy Souls (in Purgatory). During the week, the chapel became Holy Souls School. In 1932, the original School of Our Lady of the Holy Souls, a small two-room building, was erected.

On August 22, 1947, the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, now the Feast of the Queenship of Mary, the Parish of Our Lady of the Holy Souls was formally erected by Bishop Albert L. Fletcher, D.D. Msgr. Francis A. Allen was appointed pastor and Rev. Francis J. Janesko, assistant.

In 1953 a convent was built for the Olivetan Benedictine Sisters from Holy Angels Convent in Jonesboro, Arkansas, who were teaching at Holy Souls School. It included individual rooms for fourteen sisters. It was later renamed the Benedict House.

In observance of the Marion Year (1954), a shrine was dedicated in honor of Our Lady of Confidence (also known as Our Lady of Good Hope), a devotion dear to the heart of Msgr. Allen. The shrine contained a duplicate in oil of the original "Madonna dellaFiducia"—Our Lady of Confidence—a famous painting which is preserved in the chapel in the Pontifical Roman Seminary, where Msgr. Allen studied and was ordained in 1931.

On September 6, 1970, Bishop Albert Fletcher dedicated the new church, which was located across "I" Street, between Harrison & Tyler Streets. The rectory, built to the north of the church, was completed with living and office space. The old church was converted to a school library, cafeteria, and meeting room. In 1981 the Parish Hall and Allen Center was blessed by Bishop Andrew McDonald. At that time the old church was remodeled to house an art room, music room, office, and workshop.

The old Mission/Parish Church was demolished in 1991, but the bell tower was saved. An enlarged and refurbished Holy Souls School was dedicated in 1993.







The Church was rededicated in 2000 after weekend Masses were offered in the Allen Center for 10 months. A Columbarium in the rectory courtyard was added in 2002; and it was expanded with 2 additional sections in 2007. The Bell Tower, which is the only remaining part of the original church, was restored in 2008. Schulmerich Carillon bells were installed in the Bell Tower.

Our Lady of the Holy Souls Shrine was dedicated on November 1, 2014. It is located on the north side of the church in the area that was formerly the Eucharistic Chapel. The original sculpture of Our Lady of the Holy Souls, created by George Hoelzeman, is a unique image of Mary as protector and advocate for those who have died. The shrine has niches where the photos of our deceased loved ones are placed. This chapel is a place of prayer for our loved ones, uniting our prayers as a community with the prayers of Mary our patron and all the saints of heaven.

On All Souls Day, 2020, the Eucharistic Chapel returned to Holy Souls Church. The Exposition Tabernacle allows visitors to expose Jesus during their Adoration time and then repose (close) when they are finished. To allow room for the new tabernacle, the statue of Our Lady of the Holy Souls was relocated to the Reconciliation Room.

Holy Souls School

On January 3, 1927, Our Lady of the Holy Souls School opened in the mission church at Tyler and "I" Streets with four grades and two teachers, Sister M Ursula Straessle and Sister M Gabriel Koechner, Olivetan Benedictine Sisters from Jonesboro. Forty students were registered the first year. The first two grades were taught in the small sacristy, the other grades in the main part of the church. The church was divided lengthwise through the center with an old army curtain to make two classrooms. For four and a half years, school was taught in the church. Six students made their First Communion May 1, 1927. The school had eight grades in 1944 with its first kindergarten. That same year the pastor, Monsignor Francis A. Allen, added three additional classrooms with cloakrooms, a library, kitchen, office and an auditorium that served as the cafeteria. In 1946, Monsignor Allen presented diplomas to the first eighth grade graduates. In 2020, Holy Souls School had 460 students enrolled.

What to do if . . .

You want to go to Confession:

This sacrament is available on Saturdays from 2:30 to 3:30 p.m. and on Wednesdays from 4:30 to 5:00 p.m., or by calling the church office for an appointment.

You want to have your baby baptized:

Baptisms are scheduled on an individual basis. Parents should call the church office to register for an evening of baptism preparation.

You want to make your First Communion or be Confirmed:

Holy Communion is received by children in the second grade or older in the spring. Confirmation is bestowed on youth in January for eighth graders and older teens. Children/teens are expected to have attended their Catholic school or religious education classes the year of the sacramental reception and the year previous to reception. Contact the Director of Children Faith Formation for more information about First Communion. Contact the Youth Minister for more information about youth Confirmation. Adults receive the sacrament after having gone through R.C.I.A. process. Call the Church Office and ask to speak to the Director of Faith Formation for more information.

You want to get married:

Couples should contact the Pastoral Secretary in the church office a minimum of six months in advance to begin the marriage preparation process.

You would like a parish priest to visit someone who is sick:

Please call the church office if there is an emergency or if you or a loved one are about to have surgery, are in the hospital or nursing home, or have become homebound. The Anointing of the Sick is a healing sacrament for young and old, the chronically or terminally ill, also offered prior to surgery.

For after-office hours emergencies, please call 373-8600 and a priest will be contacted. Please provide the following information:

Call Holy Souls School at 663-4513.

Your child does not go to a Catholic school:

Call the Director of Children's Faith Formation in the church office and register him/her in our parish's Children's Faith Formation Program. The program meets on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:15 a.m. during the school year.

You are not sure about taking your small children to Mass:

The Nursery is available in the Parish Hall for your young children (age 5 and younger) for all regular weekend Masses. However, children are always welcome in church. (Due to COVID-19, the Nursery is currently closed.)

On Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday, the church is open for visits from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please use the door near the piano on the Harrison St. side to enter the church after 9:00 a.m. On Wednesday, the church is open from 7:00 a.m. till after the 5:30 p.m. Mass.

You want to return to the Catholic Church:

If you are interested in returning to the Catholic Church, please call the church office.

Contact the Bulletin Editor. The deadline to submit information is 10 days before the publication date.

You are hard of hearing:

Directory of Ministries & Organizations Liturgy

Eucharistic Ministers at Mass

Eucharistic Ministers at Mass participate at Sunday and daily Masses assisting the Priest with Holy Communion. Special training is given. You must be at least 18 years old, a Catholic in good standing, and approved by the pastor.

Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick

Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick take Holy Communion to the homebound and the sick in hospitals and nursing homes. Special training is given. You must be at least 18 years old, a Catholic in good standing, and approved by the pastor.

Altar Servers

Boys and girls, 3rd grade and older, assist at weekend Masses, Funerals, Weddings, Stations of the Cross, and other services. They must attend training sessions.

Lectors

Lectors must be a Catholic in good standing and receive an orientation/training session where duties and responsibilities are explained. You may choose which Mass you would like to serve.

Ushers

Ushers' duties include arriving 20 minutes prior to Mass, greeting and seating parishioners, passing collection baskets, distributing bulletins and closing the church.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

The Eucharistic Chapel is open for visits on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday from 7:30 a.m. - 3 p.m., Wednesday from 7:30 a.m. - 5 p.m.; Saturday: 2 p.m. - 6 p.m., and Sunday: 7 a.m. - 1 p.m. & 4:30 p.m. - 7 p.m. No Adoration during Mass times. The Exposition Tabernacle allows visitors to expose Jesus during their Adoration time and then repose (close) when they are finished. Parishioners who would like after-hour access can register with the Church Office for a key card.

Ministry of Praise

Members offer daily prayers in their homes or wherever they choose for the specific needs of the parish noted in the weekly bulletin. Each member is given a daily prayer book. This group does not have meetings.

Adult RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Are you interested in learning more about your faith, your church, the Mass, etc.? Sign up for Adult Religious Education. You will be contacted about the class content and schedule. Contact the Director of Faith Formation for more information.

WALKING WITH PURPOSE

Catholic Bible Study for women only. Thursday mornings or Wednesday evening. Share every day challenges in an atmosphere of honesty and authenticity accepting each other for who we are: beloved daughters of God.

Music Ministry

PARISH CHOIR

The Parish Choir sings regularly for the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass and other principal liturgies of the church. Adults and high school students who love to sing are encouraged to join this group, which rehearses in the church on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. and on Sunday morning before the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

PRAISE AND WORSHIP MINISTRY

On Sunday evenings, we have a Praise and Worship team that leads music at the 5:30 p.m. Mass. This team also includes support volunteers who assist with set-up, sound engineering, and passing out song sheets. An audition is required to join the group where there are openings.

RESURRECTION CHORALE

The Resurrection Chorale is comprised of people who have availability to participate during the work day. The group ministers to grieving families by leading music at parish funerals. Members are notified by a phone tree of upcoming funerals. No rehearsals are required.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR

The Holy Souls Children's Choir, which rehearses on Tuesdays from 3:05 to 4:05 p.m. in the School Music Room, is open to Fifth through Eighth Graders. The Choir leads all school Masses and leads one weekend Mass per month.

CANTORS

Cantors serve as song leaders for parish and school liturgies, including weddings and funerals.

Catechetical Ministry

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

RCIA is the formal process of welcoming adults into the Catholic Church. To prepare we have weekly classes to help educate and form our hearts so that we may be disciples of Jesus. All people are welcome, whether you are thinking about joining the church, have a spouse and just want to learn more, or are Catholic and want to dive deeper into your faith. Contact the Director of Faith Formation for more information.

RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children)

RCIC is the formal process of welcoming children into the Catholic Church who are seven years old or older. RCIC can be done in conjunction with RCIA, or if a parent is already a practicing Catholic we will meet to discuss a faith formation plan for your youth. Each plan will be tailored to the needs of the individual family. Contact the Director of Faith Formation for more information.

YOUTH FAITH FORMATION

Youth Faith Formation is for all children Kindergarten through 8th grade who are parishioners at Holy Souls. There are many aspects of our Youth Faith Formation program, including tools to help with encountering Jesus in the Mass, Sunday classes, holy hours and family formation events. Contact the Director of Children's Faith Formation for more information.

Confirmation

Confirmation classes guide a young person into full membership by answering their questions and giving them a chance to discuss and share their faith. The classes are for young men and women who are in the 8th grade or older and who feel ready to be confirmed into the Catholic faith. We need volunteers for the instructional team and to help plan liturgies, receptions, and retreats. (All adults must participate in the program CMG Connect. Youth Ministry

CYM (Junior and Senior)

The Holy Souls Catholic Youth Ministry provides social, service, and spiritual activities for the junior (7th and 8th graders) and senior (9th through 12th grades) high school youth of our parish. Parish Life

Altar Society

Membership is open to every woman in the parish. The primary purpose of this organization is the care of the physical church. The Sacristy Committee organizes members to clean the church. Through the profits from their annual fundraiser, they fund decorations and improvements to the church and Parish Hall. The Meals for New Moms Committee takes meals to parishioners after the birth of a child.

Men's Club

The Men's Club promotes fellowship and provides gifts and services to the parish. All men of the parish (Protestant spouses too!) are invited to join. The Men's Club sponsors many parish events and functions including an annual Shrimp & Oyster Dinner and Lenten Fish Fries. They also provide a meal for the family of parishioners who have died. Meetings are the second Monday of each month and begin with a Social Hour at 6:30 p.m. followed by Rosary and a business meeting followed by refreshments and fellowship.

Senior's Group

This group is a very active group of parishioners ages 55 and older who meet the second Monday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in the Parish Hall. They begin with a brief business meeting followed by fellowship, cards and games. Lunch is provided. The group takes several trips a year. Joining the Seniors Group is a great opportunity to relax, have fun and meet other parishioners.

Card Party

The Card Party Group meets the third Tuesday of each month from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Members normally bring a sack lunch; drinks are provided. They play bridge, poker and other kinds of card games. Anyone is welcome to play!

SPECIAL EVENTS VOLUNTEER

Volunteers are needed to help with setting up, serving and cleaning up at parish events when they are available. It's lots of fun and a good way to meet people!

Funeral LUNCHEON Ministry groups

There are four groups that alternate between funerals; the leaders of the group contact the members and ask them to bring a dish of something they like to cook. Members serve the meal and clean up after. Sometimes members are asked to housesit during a funeral.

Hospitality & Support Ministry

There are different groups within this ministry; you can choose to: welcome newcomers to the parish, visit the sick, send get well cards, make telephone calls or personal visits to parishioners, and/or prepare meals for recuperating parishioners.

ELDER SUPPORT MINISTRY

There are different ways to volunteer within this ministry to help the homebound and/or elder parishioners; you can choose to volunteer to do yard work, grocery shopping, light housecleaning, and/or give rides to church or appointments.

NURSERY

Parents are welcome to volunteer in our Church Nursery which is located in the Parish Hall and open during all weekend Masses for children 5 months to 6 years. The nursery is staffed with paid staff but volunteers are always welcome.

GARDEN ANGELS

Garden areas are assigned to volunteers who then take care of these areas by planting, trimming and maintaining them year round.

SNOW ANGELS

On snowy days, these volunteers come to the church and school and shovel the ice and snow so that walkways and the parking lots are clear for parishioners, school children and employees attending Mass and school.

CMG Connect

All volunteers who work around children are required to participate in the program, "CMG Connect" This program is sponsored by the Diocese of Little Rock. Go online to www.cmgconnect.org to register.

Outreach

ANGEL TREE

Before Christmas we have Angel Trees in the church vestibule. Ornaments on the trees provide gift ideas for families in need and organizations that support them. Parishioners take ornaments and return them with a gift to be given to the family or organization.

BIRTHRIGHT

The focus of Birthright is on the distressed mother and her baby. Their responsibility is to provide the mother with the help she needs to bring her baby to birth. Volunteers are needed to be a Friendship Counselor, collect maternity and baby clothes as well as other necessities, help with fundraising; and, most importantly, pray for the women and babies.

Blood Drives

We have a blood drive approximately every 56 days. Please give the gift of life. Watch the bulletin for more information.

THE C.A.L.L.

The C.A.L.L. is a non-profit organization dedicated to providing a future and hope to foster children in Arkansas. At any given time there are approximately 3,500 children in the Arkansas State Foster Care System through no fault of their own. In Pulaski County alone there are approximately 1,100 children in foster care, with only 233 families to care for them. The C.A.L.L. involves an unprecedented collaboration between the Department of Human Services and Arkansas Christian Churches. Are you Called?

CORPUS CHRISTI FOOD DRIVE

In honor of the Feast of Corpus Christi, Holy Souls parishioners are asked to donate nonperishable foods. The food will be distributed by local charities to those in need in our community.

DIVORCE SUPPORT GROUP

We offer a Support Group for those experiencing the pain of divorce. It is a 12 week session of DVD's that feature the powerful and inspiring real-life stories of civilly divorced Catholic men and women who DID find help in the Church. This program is not a substitute for necessary professional, legal, or therapeutic needs, but we do offer the truth about love, marriage, divorce, and recovery from a faithfully Catholic perspective.

GRIEF SUPPORT MINISTRY

Mourning the loss of someone you love is never easy, but there is hope. Our Lady of the Holy Souls parish community offers Grief Support Groups throughout the year. The program is rooted in our Catholic tradition, conveys God's consolation through scripture, prayer, reflection, and sharing our faith and our stories. Habitat For Humanity

You can volunteer labor or donations of money or materials. Habitat builds and rehabilitates simple, decent houses alongside their homeowner partner families. The homeowner invests not only their down payment and monthly mortgage payment but also hours of their own labor into building the Habitat house. The homes are sold at no profit and financed with affordable loans.

Helping Hand

Helping Hand is a non-profit, ecumenical ministry financed by private donations and provides emergency service to persons in crisis. It is basically a food and clothing center for those in need. Hours of operation are Mon.-Thurs. 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Baskets are available for donations in the storage room across from the ladies restroom in the church.

Holy Sews Ministry

This ministry meets once a month to cut out and sew beautiful layettes for stillborn babies. You may also help at home. These layettes provide comfort and are a lasting keepsake for the family of a precious baby who came to earth for only a short time.

JERICHO WAY/SETTLED SOULS

The goal of Jericho Way is to offer homeless and disadvantaged people in the Greater Little Rock area the opportunity to fulfill their potential and move towards an independent and positive future. You may donate items or volunteer at the center.

Our House Shelter

Our House is a community initiative to provide to the homeless emergency shelter, housing and children's daycare while job skills are learned, hope is nurtured, and opportunities are found to help the homeless re-enter a productive society. Holy Souls Parish takes dinner to Our House on the 1st Tuesday of each month and the 5th Saturdays.

St. Joseph Helpers

This group ministers to young women, offers free pregnancy tests, peer counseling on abstinence, chastity, infant development, and natural family planning. They give out information on the risks of abortion, post abortion referrals, and sexually transmitted diseases and adoption.

Thanksgiving/Christmas Ministry

This ministry, begun more than 30 years ago by Mrs. Jenny Cia, provides food for people in need at Thanksgiving and Christmas.
