



Genesis Adult Basketball


Every Thursday night in the Great Hall, any adults are invited to join us for basketball. It is a great time of exercise and fellowship. We play from 7-8:30pm.

Genesis Mission Opportunities

Alcoholics Anonymous

Alcoholics Anonymous is an international fellowship of men and women who have had a drinking problem. It is nonprofessional, self-supporting, multiracial, apolitical, and available almost everywhere. There are no age or education requirements. Membership is open to anyone who wants to take steps in overcoming addiction. Genesis UMC offers a site for meetings every week.

Alliance for Children

Alliance For Children is the children's advocacy center serving all of Tarrant County. Since 1992, over 50,000 children have benefited from Alliance For Children's teamed investigations and coordinated approach. Alliance For Children is a nonprofit organization that operates child friendly centers located in Arlington, Ft. Worth, Hurst and Lakeside. Its mission is to protect Tarrant County children from child abuse through teamed investigations, healing services and community education. Alliance For Children is a fully accredited member of the National Children's Alliance, a membership association of over 700 children's advocacy centers, and is a founding member of Children's Advocacy Centers™ of Texas.

Bell Choir

This group of fun people aged 13 to Methuselah enjoys making music together. We meet on Tuesday evenings from 7:30 to about 8:30, September through May. In December we go to a local nursing home for a short concert during our regular practice time. Every other year we have a retreat where we learn new techniques and get better acquainted. CarePortal

CarePortal calls attention to the needs of hurting children and families in the community. Child welfare workers uncover the needs. CarePortal makes local churches aware, giving them a real-time opportunity to respond. Genesis UMC often responds by providing beds for children who are placed in foster situations.

Carter BloodCare

Genesis UMC hosts several blood drives throughout the year for Carter BloodCare. Carter BloodCare and Genesis members are dedicated to giving life to the community by providing life-saving blood components and transfusion services that give hope to people in need.

Center for Transforming Lives

Formerly known as the YWCA, the Center's mission is to help homeless and impoverished women, children and families by offering an emergency shelter for women and housing assistance for families; free or low cost quality early childhood education for impoverished or homeless families; and individual financial coaching and other programs to promote financial self-sufficiency. Genesis UMC partners with them in various ways such as assisting with holiday meals, etc.

Chancel Choir

Led by renowned choir director Robyn Hollimon, this dedicated group of singers graces the 10:30 traditional worship with anthems and leads us in hymns. They also provide special music for offertories and preludes. The Chancel Choir's Christmas Cantata is an annual highlight. They meet for rehearsal at 7:30 on Wednesdays.

Community Connections

Community Connections utilizes Genesis facilities on a weekly basis to provide programs serving individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. They help individuals to become involved in their communities with quality supports and services to meet their needs.

Congregational Care Team

This lay ministry works with our pastors to meet the caregiving needs of those in our congregation. Each person is trained to make visits to hospitals, homes, and lead people in prayer through this powerful ministry. Cookies for the Troops

Genesis UMC along with the Central Texas Conference participates in the Cookies for the Troops program. Home baked cookies are packaged and distributed to troops serving overseas at Christmas time. Crowley House of Hope and Medical Clinic

The Crowley House of Hope is an emergency assistance organization for residents of the 76036 zip code area and the Crowley ISD. They provide financial assistance including food, water, school supplies, medical aid and a friendly face for community citizens. CHH and Genesis UMC collaborate on several mission projects serving our community. They serve 76036 and the Crowley ISD. Located at 200 N. Magnolia St, Crowley, TX 76036. Their free Medical Clinic accepts calls by leaving a message to arrange appointments at 817-297-6495. They provide healthcare for the whole uninsured family.

Don't Forget to Feed Me

The mission of DF2FM is to supply pet food to local agencies in support of pet owners. They provide pet food for those in need during challenging financial times and offer options to surrendering or abandoning a family pet. Genesis UMC collects pet food each year during the Blessing of the Animals to donate to this organization.

Everman UMC's After School 'Hangin Out' Program

Genesis UMC helps support Everman UMC's program to feed students a peanut butter and jelly sandwich and lemonade on Tuesday and Thursday after school. Genesis conducts a Peanut Butter and Jelly drive each February-March and September-October to help with their outreach to some 300 high school students. Faith Community Nursing

Our Genesis group works through the Texas Health Harris-Methodist Southwest, Faith Community Nursing location. The mission and goal of Faith Community Nursing at Texas Health is the intentional integration of the practice of faith with the practice of professional nursing to care for the whole person — body, mind and spirit — to improve the health of the communities they serve. Faith Community Nurses practice with an understanding of the spiritual and religious beliefs that underlie health. All nurses in the program are Registered Nurses. Loretta Mahaffey is the Genesis Faith Community Nurse Coordinator helping promote health and healthy choices by educating the faith community about health services, wellness and disease prevention through classes and Health Fairs. Each year this program promotes and provides flu shots at Genesis.

Food Bank Collection

This ongoing collection of non-perishable food items allows us to connect and bless the clients of Crowley House of Hope, Neighborhood Needs and St. Bartholomew Catholic Church food pantries. We focus on specific basic items, which are needed on an ongoing basis to provide the greatest help. We have volunteers providing help to all these food pantries throughout the month. A wooden collection container is set up in the Commons area for this ongoing ministry. All of these food banks work with the Tarrant Area Food Bank.

Fusion Band

Genesis Quilt Ministry

This Quilting Ministry provides opportunities to learn the basic quilting skills to becoming a master quilter. Each Thursday evening 7-9pm, they have a great time building relationships, as they learn and work together. Faith Newcomb is the leader of this ministry. Individuals joining this group do need sewing skills with some beginner quilter skills and a sewing machine. Each year they each donate a comfort quit for our shut-ins and participate in a larger quilt or item for the Mission Auctions. Individuals, as they learn, provide items to the church, nursing homes and hospitals. Many patterns and tools are provided by the leader for each class. For information to get started quilting, it's between \$75-100, to put a basic quilting kit together with cutting mat, rulers, rotary cutter etc.

Greeters

Greeters are those people who help us offer welcome and hospitality to all that come to Genesis on Sunday mornings. Each greeter is responsible for greeting everyone at a specific door.

Grief Support

Genesis UMC provides support to those who experience the loss of a loved one in various ways. Working with the Widowed Persons Services, sessions are provided to those seeking support and guidance. Support is also offered in various ways throughout the year, including a Service of Prayer for Healing and Wholeness.

Holy Grounds Coffee House

Volunteers in this ministry learn how to make all of the drinks served at this Starbucks-type facility. All the funds raised in the Coffee House go to support different specific mission programs each month. For more information, contact Ignacio Padilla.



Homework Help

Every Wednesday at 6:30-7:30pm, we offer tutoring and reading for kids in our children's area. Come volunteer and assist with the educational growth of children. Some of our ESL students bring their children.

Justice For Our Neighbors Clinic - JFON

On the third Wednesday of each month, Genesis holds a JFON-DFW Immigration Clinic offers free and affordable legal services for those struggling with immigration services, provides education to the public, and engages in advocacy with our immigrant neighbors. Appointments with the Staff Attorney are handled and scheduled through the JFON-DFW in Grapevine office by calling 817-310-3820. Members of Genesis assist with hosting, set-up of the rooms for the clinic, interpretation, client information intake, and childcare.

Legal services are provided by a licensed immigration attorney who remains with their case until relief is granted or all avenues are exhausted. Intake Clinics are held once each month at First United Methodist Church in Grapevine, Arapaho United Methodist Church in Richardson, and Genesis United Methodist Church in Ft. Worth. At these clinics, immigrant neighbors are welcomed and meet with the JFON DFW attorney to learn if they have a claim to the legal status they seek. Volunteers and staff are privileged to hear the real stories of real people and see the issue of immigration in a much clearer light.

McCurdy Ministries

Genesis collects Box Tops for this ministry, which is a National Mission Institute of The UMC in Espanola, New Mexico. Through Box Tops for Education, we have been able to support McCurdy Ministries and help them to earn minivans to transport students and other equipment for the school. A Box Tops collection box is located in the Commons Mission collection area.

Neighborhood Needs

As an outreach of Altamesa Church of Christ, Neighborhood Need's mission is to provide food, clothing, technology access and mentor/counseling to those in need with God's help and in God's way. Genesis UMC partners with them on several missions, such as providing food to insecure individuals and families, helping with their clothes closet, Thanksgiving Baskets, and etc. Located at 6717 S. Hulen St., 76133.

Needle Arts Projects

The Needle Arts Group consists of women who create clothing articles for charity. They crochet, knit, sew and quilt. Articles made include prayer shawls and blankets that are given freely to comfort anyone in need. Hats and scarves: DRC-Solutions FTW for the homeless, chemo therapy groups, both men and women, FWISD school children, Restoration Training Center for individuals suffering with Aids and Cancer. Handmade household items for women at the Presbyterian Night Shelter being placed in affordable housing. Operation Gratitude which sends items to First Responders, Deployed Troops and Veterans. Hats are made for hospitals for Neonatal (NICU) wards for preemies. Some of the yarn is donated by friends and members of the church. The group has an "inventory" so the need can be filled as it arises. Their donations approximate up to \$500 yearly serving these individuals.

Pathfinders of Tarrant County

The mission of Pathfinders is to empower individuals and families to find their path from poverty to self-sufficiency. They strive to support a thriving community where individuals and families are self-sufficient. Their programs include mentoring and financial capability education. Prison Entrepreneurs Program

The Prison Entrepreneurship Program offers men in prison a chance at transformation by unlocking their God-given potential through entrepreneurial passion, education and mentoring. They provide unparalleled resources and real-world values-based business skills to inmates so that once they are back in society they have the tools, skills and support structure to pursue healthy, fulfilling and productive lives. PEP clients are immersed in a proven program comprised of one-on-one training with executive volunteers, business plan mentoring with seasoned professionals and a highly competitive business plan competition. Project-44

Project-44 accepts vehicle donations and repairs them to good running order and then given away. Genesis allows Project-44 to park cars on the parking lot until they are ready to be given away. Project-44's counseling ministry seeks to provide counseling to those in need that cannot typically pay for the counseling themselves. They also worked with Dr. Chris Henna in Liberia to purchase 100 acres of land to build a trade school for the people of that area. The hope is that by providing a trade school, we can help teach people skills that will enable them to have jobs to support and feed their families. Project 44 also implements a feeding ministry called Family 2 Family. This ministry connects two families together through the delivery of a 30 pound box of food every week and through fellowship meals every month, This not a food pantry, but an intentional building of community and providing nourishment for our minds, bodies and souls.

Restoration Training Centers

Led by Tim and Mary Ann Laughlin, the RTC works with at-risk folks with various needs. Many people slip through the cracks when seeking help and continue to suffer with cancer and aids. The Genesis UMC partnership with them is a give-and-take process. They provide Genesis UMC with things when they have a surplus and Genesis UMC partners to fill their needs as we can. Their clients are a part of our annual Angel Tree giving.

Room in the Inn

Genesis UMC partners with several area churches under the direction of the Room In The Inn Advisory Council and clients are coordinated by DRC-Solutions. Once a week during the hottest (July/August) and coldest (December – February) months of the year, GUMC provides a safe place offering



hospitality, housing, relaxation and two good meals to 8 homeless men. Members can serve as drivers, cooks, housekeepers, washing linens, and more.

Salvation Army

The Salvation Army provides a range of services to both children and adults. This includes, but is not limited to, adult rehabilitation, prison ministry, veteran's affairs services, elderly services, human trafficking and homeless services. Genesis UMC and United Methodist Women partner each year to provide Christmas stockings for children.

Sewing Hope

This group works outside of the church doing a variety of sewing projects for mission outreach. Over the years, the group has made many items including Patriotic Heart pillows for Veterans, Bear Pillows and Teddy Bears for Vitas Hospice Care. The School Supply Bags for UMCOR, Pillow Cases for Cook's Children's Hospital. Under the leadership of Mickey Franks, the Ladies of "Sewing Hope" stay busy in their spare time making all sorts of great things for outreach ministries of caring to serve others throughout the community.

Snack Sacks

The Snack Sacks program helps to provide nutritious weekend food to children who qualify in the southwest Ft. Worth and Crowley area. Genesis UMC partners with Crowley House of Hope and the Crowley school district in providing these weekly Snack Sacks by purchasing the pre-packaged food and assembling the sacks. Items provided include juice, macn-cheese, cereal, granola/breakfast bar, fruit cup, 100% fruit item, pudding cup, crackers packed in a resealable bag.

Southwest Nursing and Rehabilitation Center

Located at 5300 Altamesa Blvd., Southwest Nursing and Rehabilitation Center provides skilled nursing care for those who are recovering from surgery, injury or illness. They offer skilled nursing, long-term care, dining services and social services.

Stephen Ministry

When someone faces a life change, illness, or grief, they may need someone to walk with them through their difficult time. Our Stephen Ministers are trained lay people who provide emotional and spiritual support to people going through tough times. Consider getting trained in this ministry or refer someone you know that might need care.

Tarrant Churches Together

Tarrant Churches Together offers various volunteer opportunities to unify the community to bring resources, educational support and empowerment to all God's children. They support Ready, Set, Go! centers to provide resources, educational support and encouragement at no cost to help students succeed in school and prepare and plan for college; the MLK Day of Service where people of all walks of life come together to serve at more than 30 service sites; the Children's Defense Fund Freedom Schools for girls entering into 1st to 6th grade; the Sack Lunch Chuck Wagon program to provide more than 6,000 sack lunches of non-perishable foods for homeless day laborers at the Ft. Worth Stock Show and Rodeo; and Home for the Holidays which offers a holiday meal in December to individuals and family who have recently moved off the streets into transitional supportive housing. Genesis UMC participates in the MLK Day of Service, Sack Lunch Chuck Wagon programs and Home for the Holidays.

Texas Health Hughley's Mobile Health Services

The Texas Mobile Health Services bus provides services to those unable to access healthcare due to a lack of transportation or adequate financial resources. Overseen by a physician, the Mobile Health Services Bus is staffed by a Family Practice Nurse Practitioner, a licensed paramedic, varied allied health professionals and volunteers. They park here at Genesis UMC on the first Tuesday of every month.

Texas Christian University's Wesley Center

The Wesley Center is a Christian campus ministry supporting a community of students seeking to follow Jesus and help others know and follow Jesus. The United Methodist Women of Genesis UMC provide a meal for their weekly meetings.

Trinity Habitat for Humanity

Trinity Habitat for Humanity partners with people in our community to help them build or improve a place they can call home. Habitat homeowners help build their own homes alongside volunteers and pay an affordable mortgage. With support, Habitat homeowners achieve the strength, stability, and independence they need to build a better life for themselves and for their families. Genesis UMC members help with building the houses, arranging HabiTours, attending BuildStrong luncheons and through their small group by offering financial support.

United Community Centers

An outreach of United Methodist Women, the three Community Centers in Ft. Worth provide services for women and children. Some of their projects include after-school and summer childcare, parenting classes, clothes closet, food insecurity, tax preparation, etc. Genesis UMC assists with Christmas Angel Tree requests, Thanksgiving baskets, etc.

UMCOR

The United Methodist Committee on Relief ("UMCOR") exists to assist United Methodists and churches to become involved globally in direct ministry to persons in need through programs of relief, rehabilitation, and service, including issues of displaced persons, hunger and poverty, disaster response, and disaster risk reduction; and to assist organizations, institutions, and programs related to annual conferences and other units of The United Methodist Church in their involvement in direct service to such persons in need. Genesis UMC responds to the many needs of UMCOR with financial support and by assembling various relief supply kits (cleaning, hygiene and school kits) as needed.

United Methodist Men

This fellowship of GUMC men gathers regularly for fun and discipleship and engages in many mission projects here at church and beyond. They meet on the 2nd Saturday of each month at 7:30am in the Dining Room for a monthly meeting with breakfast and a program.

United Methodist Women

United Methodist Women at Genesis is a community of women whose purpose is to know God, and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship, and to expand concepts of mission through participation through the global ministries



of the church. Women meet in "circles" to get to know one another better as they study missional materials and carry out a wide variety of mission projects in the church. At Genesis, two circles meet on a monthly basis for programs on topics of leadership development, social action, spiritual growth and mission. Joyful Agape Circle meets on the third Tuesday at 10am in the Dining Room. The Wesleyan Circle meets at 6:30 pm in the Commons Library on the same day. Membership is extended to any woman who commits herself to our purpose and chooses to participate in meetings, prayer, study and service. Church membership is not required.

Ushers

Ushers greet those coming into the sanctuary, chapel or Great Hall for our different worship services. They distribute worship bulletins and/or special handouts and receive the offering.

Weekday Office Volunteer
