

We strive to be a vibrant parish unified by our sacramental participation in the Catholic Church. Parish History

Immaculate Conception Parish has a tremendous amount for which to give thanks. Founded in 1845, the parish has continued to flourish and to give a strong witness to the Catholic faith in Montgomery County. Since the early nineteenth century, Immaculate Conception Church has thrived in Clarksville, Tennessee. Initially served by missionary priests from Bardstown, Kentucky, and Nashville, Tennessee, the Parish was originally named St. Mary's. It was administered by Reverend Ivo Schacht, the first pastor. The church bore the name St. Mary's until May 30, 1875, when entries on the parish record books were recorded under the name Immaculate Conception.

On August 12, 1880, Right Rev. Patrick Augustine Feehan, Third Bishop of Nashville (1865-1880), and Father Patrick Gleeson, Pastor (1873-1885), laid the cornerstone of the church that serves as Immaculate Conception's Chapel today. The Chapel is on the National Historical Register.

St. Mary's Center (now our main Church) was completed and dedicated as an educational-activity center on August 17, 1975. The center was refurbished and rededicated as Immaculate Conception Church June 21, 1987, by Most Rev. James Niedergeses, D.D., Bishop of Nashville, and Pastor Robert J. Roeser (1982-1992) and presently serves as Immaculate Conception's Worship Center.

A school existed in Immaculate Conception Parish from 1860-1969. St. Mary's was staffed by the Dominican Sisters from 1887 who taught there until its closing in 1969. It was located at 740 Franklin Street. It was closed in 1969 due to the condition of the building and a decline in enrollment when Ft. Campbell opened its own schools and could no longer bus students to the Catholic school. Our Pre-School has been on parish grounds since 1976.

A Town Hall meeting was held in February 1999 to address growing interest among parish members of Immaculate Conception to revive a Catholic elementary school for the education and faith formation of their children. In June of 1999, the parish purchased our current school site.

The Jubilee Year (2000) marked the return of St. Mary's Catholic School after a thirty year absence. After considerable renovation, St. Mary's School, including a chapel and gym, opened its doors at 1901 Madison Street on August 15, 2000 serving grades Kindergarten through Fourth. A grade was added each year through Eighth. Currently, it is a parochial K-8 elementary school. A Before and After Care Program for students began in August 2002. In 2011 the name was changed to Immaculate Conception School.

Parish FAQs

(Frequently Asked Questions)

- **How do I join the Parish?** Visit our Welcome Booth located in the main church narthex after any of the weekend Masses, visit our website at www.immaconception.org, or call or email the parish secretary (931-645-6275 ext. 104, icsecretary@immaconception.org)
- **How do I become a Catholic?** Call the parish office. You will receive information from a member of our education/formation program who will invite you to our formation classes. If you have questions about joining and wish some direction, call one of our clergymen.
- How do I register my child/children for a religious education class? Visit our website at www.immaconception.org to print the registration form, pick one up in the main church narthex after any of the weekend Masses, or stop by the parish office. Totus Tuus and Vacation Bible School registration forms can be picked up in the church narthex or parish office several weeks prior to the event.
- How do I register my child/children at Immaculate Conception School? Call or stop by the school during school hours to schedule tours, ask questions, and pick up the registration materials. You can also find all the forms and many answers to your questions on the school website at www.icschooltn.org/admissionsenrollment.
- How do I register my child/children at Immaculate Conception Pre School? Registration is scheduled in February of each year. Current ICP families receive early notice and have exclusive registration privileges the first day. The second day of registration is open to parishioners of Immaculate Conception Church. Remaining spaces are then available to the community. Registration dates are posted on the school website at www.icschooltn.org/admissionsenrollment.
- **How do I schedule a Mass?** Call or visit the parish office and ask the receptionist to schedule a Mass (Intention) for the living or the deceased.
- How do I get information into the Bulletin or make a Bulletin Notice? Call or email the parish secretary at the parish office (931-645-6275 ext. 104, icsecretary@immaconception.org). The deadline is Thursday at noon (eleven working days in advance of the date you wish the notice to appear).
- **How do I volunteer?** Contact one of the many people listed in this guidebook or call Mary Obringer in the parish office.
- **How do I retrieve a lost item?** Visit our Welcome Booth located in the main church narthex after any of the weekend Masses or call the parish office. Lost and Found items will only be held for 90 days. If not picked up, they will be donated to charity.
- How do I make arrangements for a Catholic Funeral or Burial? When a loved one has died, the funeral home will usually contact the office (931-645-6275) to schedule the funeral. The emergency number is on the parish phone message. The parish is happy to host the Visitation when either the Main Church or the Old Chapel is available.

Priests and Deacons

Fr. Jacob Dio, MSFS

Fr. Jacob is a missionary priest of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales (MSFS), popularly known as Fransalians. He did all his schooling and seminary studies in India. He was ordained a priest on January 13, 2002. At the invitation of the Late Bishop David Choby, his superior from India sent him to work in the diocese of Nashville in 2009. While in India, he has worked in two schools and two parishes as associate priest, and parish priest. In the diocese of Nashville, he has served at Holy Trinity Parish, Hohenwald, St. Rose Catholic Church at Murfreesboro, and St. Luke Catholic at Smyrna, prior to coming to Immaculate Conception Church.

Fr. Javier Suarez, Associate Pastor

Fr. Javier was born in Bogota, Colombia in South America. He grew up Catholic, but was never close to the faith and only occasionally went to mass. When he was 19, a friend invited him to visit a seminary and Fr. Javier experienced the presence of God in his life for the first time. That same year, he began his discernment to the priesthood. After two years of seminary, he returned home and worked in his family business in Bogota. The vocation to the priesthood was something that remained in his heart while he was working, and after two years he came to America to discern his vocation with the Archdiocese of Atlanta. In 2010 he began his studies of ESL and philosophy at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus Ohio and in May of 2014, he graduated with a bachelor's of Arts in philosophy. In August of 2014 he began his theological studies at Notre Dame seminary in New Orleans, but in April of 2016 he stepped out of formation and returned to Colombia to attend some family issues; however, God continued to be an important part in his life, so after talking with his spiritual director and the rector at Notre Dame seminary he began to discern his vocation with the Diocese of Nashville. In November of 2017 he was assigned to Our Lady of the Lake in Hendersonville TN, where Fr. Erik Fowlkes and Fr. Thomas Kalam gave him a good example of what was expected from a priest in the diocese of Nashville. In 2018 he returned to Notre Dame seminary and finished his theological studies in May of 2020. After graduation, he was assigned to Immaculate Conception to be the new associate pastor and will be helping father Jacob in ministering to the people of the parish.

Deacon Dominick Azzara

Deacon Dominick, a native of Brooklyn, came to Clarksville as an Army officer in 1967. After the military, he earned a B.S. degree at Austin Peay State University. He worked in management and administration at social service agencies in Clarksville prior to joining the Immaculate Conception staff in 1988. He was commissioned a Lay Pastoral Minister in 1988. He has served the parish in Religious Education, Parish Council, and Liturgical Ministries. He was ordained to the diaconate in May 1999 and assigned to the parish by Bishop Kmiec. In 2002, Bishop Kmiec assigned additional duties as Co-Chaplain for Catholic Scouting. He and his wife, Regina, have three sons.

Deacon Timothy Winters

Deacon Tim was born in Portland, Oregon and raised in Arizona. A Greek and Latin scholar, he studied at the University of Arizona and at Ohio State University where he earned a Ph.D. He has taught high school and at universities in Utah and Pennsylvania. In 1994, he moved to Nashville where he taught at Vanderbilt before coming to the parish and his present work at Austin Peay State University (APSU). He was ordained to the diaconate in 1999.

Deacon Tim is the Catholic Campus Ministry Advisor for the Newman Club at APSU and also serves as president and spiritual advisor for the IC Haiti Mission. He and his wife, Mary, have four daughters.

Deacon Robert (Bob) Berberich

Deacon Bob was raised and educated in Milwaukee, WI. After ROTC (Reserve Officers Training Corp) he was assigned to Ft. Campbell and in 1970 became a member of Immaculate Conception parish. He served as a clinician at the Mental Health Center and earned a Masters in Psychology from APSU in 1972. Relocating to Nashville, he earned a Doctorate in Psychology from Vanderbilt University's Peabody College. He and his wife, Pat, returned to Clarksville in 1980 and were active in Cursillo and Ecumenical Family Enrichment Programs until her death in 1986. Deacon Bob has served as Co-Chairman of the Parish Council and in Religious Education Programs. He was ordained to the diaconate and assigned to the parish in 1999. He is the Chaplain at Immaculate Conception School. Deacon Bob is a clinical psychologist in private practice. His son, daughter-in-law, two grandsons and one granddaughter live with him here in Clarksville.

Deacon Juan Garza

Deacon Juan, a native of Monterrey, Mexico, lived in Houston, TX until he joined the Army. He came to Clarksville in 1996 and after the military, worked in management at Dell Computers for 10 years. After four years as a small business entrepreneur he sold his business prior to joining the Immaculate Conception staff in 2014 as the Director of Religious Education. He has served the Hispanic Ministry and the parish in Adult Religious Education and Formation, Parish Council, and Liturgical Ministries since 1999. He was ordained to the diaconate in June 2014 and assigned to the parish by Bishop Choby. He and his wife, Nancy, have a daughter and a son.

Deacon Juan Manuel Martinez

Deacon Manuel, a native of Jalisco, Mexico, lived in Fayetteville, TN before moving to Clarksville in 2004. He has been a restaurateur for 10 years. He was in the Seminary for the Diocese of San Juan de los Lagos in Jalisco, Mexico for six years before discerning his vocation to matrimony. There he received a Licenciature in Philosophy from the Pontifical College of Mexico. He has served the Hispanic Ministry in Adult Religious Education and Formation, Hispanic Ministry Council, and Liturgical Ministries since 2005. He was ordained to the diaconate in June 2014 and assigned to the parish by Bishop Choby. He and his wife, Martha Leticia, have a daughter and a son.

Deacon Orin Rovito

Orin Rovito, was born in Richland WA, grew up in Northern California, in Weed. In 1966 at 17, he joined the Army, became a Paratrooper, and spent one year at Fort Campbell KY before deployment, but vowed to return to KY or TN. He worked in a saw mill, was a truck driver, a partner in two businesses, and was a Safety Environmental Manager for Construction industries for twenty years. In 2009 he went back to truck driving to complete his career. He has enjoyed hunting, running, cycling, kayaking, and triathlons, is an alumni of Sacramento City College; has an AA in Criminal Justice; is an alumnus of CSUS, Sacramento with a BA in Political Science, and has a minor in education in Sociology from Pontifical College Josephinum, Columbus OH. In 2008 was Ordained Deacon in the Diocese of Sacramento CA, served at Saint Peters / All Hollows as Deacon, Grief and Pastoral Counseling until April 21, 2019 when he returned to Clarksville TN. He was granted permission from Bishop Mark to assist at Immaculate Conception in June and received facilities in late July 2019.

Sacraments

Baptism - Parishioners are invited to have their children baptized at Immaculate Conception. As Catholics, we traditionally baptize babies within the first few months of birth. A Catholic Sponsor (godparent) is required and must be at least sixteen years old and a confirmed Catholic; there must be one, but can be up to two, with one being male and one female.

English and Spanish speaking classes are normally held the last Monday of each month (except on Holiday weekends) in the St. Joseph's Center from 6:30-9:30 PM. Godparents are welcome to attend. Parents who have attended a Baptism Preparation Class within the past three years do not need to attend again.

If Catholic parents have for some reason missed the occasion of baptizing their infant/child during the years before a child reaches the age of reason, (which is normally age seven), we ask that the child be enrolled in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children of Catechetical Age (RCIC) or provide a letter from their previous parish stating participation in the program there. The child will receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation at one liturgy (The Easter Vigil).

Please call the Church Office to register for a class, schedule a Baptism, discuss the Baptism of children who have reached the age of reason, or to obtain additional information.

First Reconciliation and First Communion - First Holy Communion is usually celebrated in the spring of a child's 2nd grade year, following First Reconciliation. Children are prepared for First Communion by participating in the Sunday Religious Education program, Immaculate Conception School, or the Hispanic Community Religious Education program.

- Confirmation The sacrament of Confirmation is usually celebrated in the spring of a child's eighth grade year within the Diocese of Nashville. Children are prepared through the Sunday Religious Education program, Immaculate Conception School, or the Hispanic Religious Education program. Any adult wishing to receive this sacrament is asked to contact the Parish Office. He/she will be provided with a special program of preparation. Contact: Deacon Juan Garza (Rel. - **Reconciliation** Confessions are available in the Chapel on Saturdays after the 9:00 AM Mass and again from 4:00-5:00 PM or by appointment with a priest.
- Matrimony Engaged couples can be prepared for the Sacrament of Marriage by any of the priests or deacons. The Diocese of Nashville calls for a minimum preparation period of four months. To begin the marriage process, please contact the church office at least 4 months before the expected wedding date.

The *Engaged Couples Retreat* is offered on a Saturday each month by the Diocese of Nashville at the Catholic Pastoral Center on McGayock Pike.

Anointing of the Sick - The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is appropriate for anyone who is seriously ill, aged, infirmed, dealing with a challenging chronic illness, facing surgery, or in danger of death. For an appointment with a priest at a mutually convenient time and place contact the church office:

In an emergency please call the office at: 931-933-0600.

If you or a loved one is anticipating a planned stay in the hospital or health care facility, please notify the parish office so that we may provide Holy Communion and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. HIPPA regulations no longer allow us to get names of the sick at hospitals or nursing homes. It helps to ask the hospital or health care institute to list you as a Catholic.

Holy Orders - Anyone interested in the priesthood, diaconate, or religious life as a brother or sister is encouraged to speak with any of the priests or deacons.

Liturgical Ministries

- **Altar Servers** An Altar server assists the presider at Mass, most importantly with the opening and closing prayers, the preparation of the altar, the lavabo (washing of hands), lighting and carrying candles, and stewardship of wine and water at Mass. If you are a baptized Catholic who has received first communion and would like to discern if you are called to serve in this way, please call the church office. *Contact:* Parish Office: 931-645-6275
- Altar Society Four Teams take turns serving in the Main Church, and a fifth team serves in the Historic Chapel, helping to keep our worship space, furnishings, candles and linens clean, maintained, and prepared for when our Church community gathers together in worship. Others serve in different areas (altar flowers, preparations for funerals, and Adoration) as needed.

CHOIRS: The Ministry consists of six choirs accompanied by organ, piano, guitar, or additional instruments.
