Atrium, Friends all Gather Round. **All Welcoming.** Singing the


parts of the Mass. **Blessing the gardens and forests as a parish community.** Holy Communion not only in bread and wine but in

Be a Disciple

We welcome your involvement in any group or ministry listed below as well as any you might like to start. We call our volunteers 'disciples' because that is what they truly are—fellow Catholic Christians living out their baptismal call. Please call the rectory and find out how you can be a disciple. For all inquiries, leave a message for the person in charge at the parish office, 216-671-5890.

Sacramental Preparation

Sacraments by their nature are not personal events. They are events in the life of the church in general and of the parish in particular. While Catholic school or PSR may supplement the knowledge your child receives at home, special parish meetings incorporate what happens at home and in class with parish life. All sacraments are celebrated within Sunday Eucharist.

Baptism. Parents are required to attend a pre-baptism class before the baptism of their first child. There is a special process for adults who need to be baptized called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Contact the parish office for details.

First Communion. Children eligible for this sacrament participate in the parish Children of Light Program. This is in addition to attendance at a Catholic school or PSR classes. Sunday worship is expected throughout the year. Adults who have not made their First Communion attend the RCIA process. Contact Katie Corbett for more information.

Confirmation. The parish Confirmation program is for youth in grades 8-10. Weekly Sunday Mass attendance is expected. Adults who have not been confirmed attend the RCIA process. Contact Katie Corbett for more information.

First Reconciliation. Children learn about this sacrament in preparation for First Communion. Adults learn about reconciliation during the RCIA process.

Matrimony. Those seeking to marry at Blessed Trinity must be parishioners. Arrangements must be made at least six months in advance. Marriage preparation includes the PREPare/Enrich assessment, couple to couple ministry and liturgy preparation.

Anointing of the Sick is celebrated once a year at Mass and any time by request. Although some people may be shy about their illness or upcoming surgery and wish to be anointed privately, it is encouraged that the individual allow us to announce that they will be anointed after Mass so that their faith community can stay and join in prayerful support for their healing.

Priesthood. Young men age thirteen and over can call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 696-6525. Married men and women of any age will have to keep praying.

Adaptive Sacramental Preparation. This program is designed for individuals with special needs to prepare for and celebrate Reconciliation, First Eucharist, or Confirmation. Contact Katie Corbett for more information.

Administration

Parish Finance Council

The Finance Council provides expertise and consultation through financial analysis, planning and policy development to aid the pastor in the administration of parish financial resources, buildings and grounds. Council members are appointed based on their skills in finance, administration, law and interest in parish life. They serve at the pastor's request.

Youth and Adult Education

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

This is a Montessori based approach to children's faith formation for children ages 3-12+. It incorporates and supplements the diocesan guidelines. Contact Katie Corbett for more information.

Couples Ministry

Trained team couples meet privately with engaged couples to assist them in preparing for marriage.

PSR

PSR stands for Parish School of Religion and is a program that supplements faith formation your child receives at home. Our church recognizes parents as the primary educators of their children. PSR is offered to assist parents. Sessions are held on Sundays, 9:00-10:45 a.m. for first through eighth grades. The *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies* are the primary catechetical resources used for the PSR program. This resource is approved by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops. Contact Katie Corbett for information.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The RCIA is the sacramental formation process for persons wanting to learn more about the Catholic faith with the goal of joining our parish. This includes those who are not baptized, those baptized into another Christian faith, and those Catholics seeking to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. Social Concerns

Bountiful Basement

This hunger center feeds over 400 families a month on average. It is located in the basement of the Joseph Center at 4370 W. 140 St. The Bountiful Basement is open Tuesday and Thursday from 9:30 a.m.-noon and Wednesday from 5:00-6:45 p.m.

Community Garden

Our garden bears fruit throughout the year. Over the summer of 2018, 1,900 pounds of food were harvested from the Community Garden and the Edible Forest. Over the summers of 2019 and 2021 plots were offered to parishioners and members of the community for their own use.

Edible Forest and Apiary

A 110' x 140' area developed in the spring of 2015 and planted with 50+ fruit and nut trees, purchased by parishioners in honor or memory of loved ones. As the trees mature they produce larger quantities of fresh fruit to be shared with the poor and needy in our neighborhood. Four bee hives were added in 2017. Vegetable plots were added in 2018. Disciples are needed to work on weed control and picking fruits and vegetables as they ripen. Contact Katie Corbett.

Edible Forest II

A 200' x 96' area of fruit trees and raised beds, begun in the fall of 2019 has come to fruition. Trees are available as memorials in honor of or in memory of a loved one. As trees mature they will provide a variety of fruit. In this area we are experimenting with new varieties not found in the original Edible Forest. These include persimmons, paw paws, and apricots. Disciples are needed for weeding. Areas for growing vegetables are available to parishioners.

Haiti Committee

Meets monthly to pray for and help our mission in Baraderes, Haiti. The mission consists of a school for women who are learning sewing, cooking and hospitality. Many of the Haiti Committee have been to Baraderes. We look forward to inviting more folks to join us.

Mobile Pantry

A monthly fresh produce giveaway is offered outside in the back parking lot on the first Wednesday of every month, 4:30-6:30 p.m. Government low-income guidelines apply. Disciples are needed before, during, and after the distribution time. Contact Katie Corbett.

Peace and Justice Commission

Explores ways to impact our neighborhood and our world by reflecting on the teachings of Jesus and the Catholic Church in light of today's news. Meetings are on the third Monday of the month.

Peace & Justice Hot Meal

Various churches take turns preparing a hot community meal at St. Patrick Church on Bridge Ave. Members of Blessed Trinity cook and serve the dinner on the 4th Wednesday of each even-numbered month. Cooks arrive at 2:30 p.m., and servers at 5:15 p.m. All disciples, from grade school through retirees are welcome to help. Contact Diane Vertal 216-265-0609.

St. Vincent de Paul Society

Members meet twice a month on the first and third Monday of the month for prayer and discussion. They assist in meeting the emergency needs of parishioners by visiting them in their homes and doing an assessment. Contact Eileen Hamblen to join.

Liturgical Ministries

Altar Care

Individuals wash and iron altar cloths and care for the vestments.

Art and Environment

Individuals perform a variety of tasks involved in decorating the church for seasonal holidays and for special liturgies. They sew, design, make banners and decorations and buy supplies.

Bereavement Ministry

This group assists in the ministry of consolation by providing a warm and welcoming environment for the bereaved family. They serve as greeters, choir members, congregants and in other liturgical ministries as necessary.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children ages 5-10 are invited to have their own celebration of the Word while the rest of the congregation remains in church. Children rejoin the congregation during the Preparation of the Gifts. High school age youth and adults are needed to lead prayer and reflection. Youth grades 3-8 can be trained to lector. Contact Katie Corbett.

Eucharistic Ministers

Individuals who are seniors in high school or older distribute Holy Communion at all Masses and take the Eucharist to the homebound and the sick. One must attend diocesan training prior to being trained and commissioned. See Fr. Doug.

Greeters

These friendly parishioners greet and welcome everyone as they enter our church for liturgies.

Lectors

Lectors read the readings of the day at all Sunday and Holy Day Masses. Normally there are two readers for each Mass. Lectors are also needed for daily Mass.

Money Counters

It is the goal of all properly trained volunteer money counters to accurately count and deposit all parish collections. Each individual envelope is opened, verified, and the dollar amount recorded on the envelope (for posting to each individual's record.) In addition, money counters keep track of loose cash, tabulate special collections and deliver things like surveys and envelopes to the appropriate person or persons. All information is kept confidential. The aim of the ministry is to have four or five teams of four volunteers who alternate weeks.

Ushers


Ushers are needed for weekend and Holy Day services to assist with seating, taking up the collection, and cleaning up any disorder left in the church.

Other Notable Things About Our Parish

The September 11 Memorial. Found on the South wall of the main entrance of our church, this memorial recalls those who died on 9/11. Each person's name is engraved on the memorial. A memory book containing pictures and a short biography of each victim is available to read. This memorial is not just for those who died on 9/11, but also for all those who, throughout the world, die innocently and needlessly each day.

Cleveland Martyrs Memorial. This memorial found on the north wall of the church has engraved images of Sr. Dorothy Kazel and Jean Donovan, who were martyred in El Salvador on December 2, 1980, and Ralph Delaney, a servant of the poor and homeless in Cleveland's East side who was brutally attacked and murdered while bringing hot meals to the homebound.
