Altar Servers

Altar servers assist in the celebration of the Mass and other liturgical celebrations. Training is provided to boys and girls, 3rd grade and older, who wish to participate in the altar server program. Contact the church office at 851-2763.

Eucharistic Ministers at Mass

Eucharistic ministers assist the priest with distribution of Holy Communion at weekend and weekday Masses. Volunteers must be 18 years of age or older, a practicing Catholic and approved by the pastor. Training by the Liturgical Training Committee is required. Contact the church office at 851-2763.

Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick

Volunteers assist with distribution of Holy Communion to those hospitalized, homebound or in nursing homes. Volunteers must be 18 years of age or older, a practicing Catholic and approved by the pastor. Training by the Liturgical Training Committee is required. Contact the church office at 851-2763.

Lectors

Lectors proclaim the Word of God through the readings at Mass. Volunteers must be a practicing Catholic and approved by the pastor. Training by the Liturgical Training Committee is required. Contact the church office at 851-2763.

Parish Choir

The parish choir sings regularly at the weekend Masses and other principal liturgies of the church. Cantors are chosen from this group and serve as song leaders. Anyone who loves to sing is encouraged to join the choir. Contact Steven Shook at 870-830-8586.

Catechetical Ministry

Faith Formation

The Faith Formation program provides religious education for kindergarten through high school students who do not attend a Catholic school. These classes are required to receive the sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is designed for both Catholic and non-Catholic adults. For Catholics, this is an opportunity to refresh and rekindle knowledge and understanding of fundamental Catholic teachings and traditions. For non-Catholics, it provides an introduction into Catholic Christianity through scripture study, learning about the Sacraments, the commandments, traditions and laws of the Church. "What to do if"

You want to go to confession:

This sacrament is available on Saturdays from 4:00pm to 4:45pm and on Sundays from 7:30am to 7:45am or by calling the church office for an appointment. During Advent or Lent we may have reconciliation services.

You want to have your baby baptized:

Baptisms are scheduled on individual basis. Parents and godparents must attend a class prior to baptism. Call Dc. Strozyk @ 501-851-2049.

You want to make your First Communion or be Confirmed:

Holy Communion is received by children in the second grade or older in the spring. Confirmation is received by youths who are fourteen years of age by the scheduled date. Children and teens are expected to have attended their Catholic school or religious education classes two years prior to receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. Adults receive the Sacrament after having gone through the RCIA process.

You want to get married:

Those preparing for marriage must be registered active contributing parishioners, living within the parish boundaries for at least six months. They must notify the pastor before setting a wedding date which would be no sooner than six months from the pastor's approved date and then begin their marriage preparation program.

You would like a parish priest to visit someone sick:

Our History

Immaculate Heart of Mary Church had its beginning in 1878, when Polish settlers came into this area. The church was built on the highest point of the hill and is referred to as "Jasna Gora" or Blue Hill, a shrine in Poland. The shrine has deep meaning because of its dedication to the Blessed Mother. This gave the people a feeling of their heritage.

The Parish was originally a mission, served by the Holy Ghost Fathers, a group of Roman Catholic priests. Through the years, twenty-one (21) priests have served as pastor beginning with Father Anthony Jaworski in 1878. Along with the present pastor, Father Rubén Quinteros, each one has had his own special quality that has helped maintain the growth in faith for the people.

In 1887, Fr. Cyrill Augustynski became the first resident pastor. Though the times were not always easy, the people's faith overcame even what seemed to be hopeless situations. The original church was destroyed by fire. A new church and rectory were built in the present location. In 1932, again fire destroyed the church and rectory, which were rebuilt and dedicated in 1933. This was all possible through sacrificing, hard work, and love for their church. With each circumstance their faith and community became stronger. There was always that sense of unity, roll up their sleeves and get the job done, to lend a helping hand whenever anyone needed help, something prevalent still today.

Father Charles Hertel served as pastor from 1907 to 1949, longer than any other priest, a total of 42 years. Many of the old traditions were still kept alive during this time. The church grounds expanded in 1924 to include the Immaculate Heart of Mary School, a home for a small community of Benedictine Sisters from St. Scholastica Convent, and a rectory (built in 1933). The Stations of the Cross were added to the central part of the church in 1944, and a pipe organ was installed in 1947.

In 1960, when Msgr. Thomas Pendergast was pastor, a new school was dedicated to replace the one built in 1924. The convent that was originally built when Father Bartogze was pastor was also remodeled and enlarged at this time. In 1970, Father Edward McCormick became pastor and more changes took place. The church and rectory were renovated and airconditioned. In 1978, the Centennial of our parish was celebrated, bringing people back home.

In 1985, Father Albert Schneider became pastor. The church and rectory underwent extensive restoration. A new addition to the school was dedicated in January 1991. The grounds took on a different look with landscaping, paving and the addition of a canopy to the church. To increase the awareness of our Polish Heritage, the "Karnawal", a major fundraiser for the school, was started and is now an annual parish-wide event.

In 1994, Msgr. Bernard Malone became pastor. Under his direction, in 1996 we underwent a campaign to build a Family Life Center structure, which is large enough for all parishioners to celebrate Mass together, as well as house many other school and parish functions. The Life Center was completed in late 1997 and has been a large addition to the parish community activities as well as the school.

In 2002, Father Robert T. Dienert was assigned as pastor. In preparation for the 125th Anniversary of the founding of the parish, parishioners recovered the foundation stones of the first church building. From those stones a corner stone was erected to create a memorial to the founding Fathers and Mothers of the Parish Community. This monument was placed on a plat on the south entrance of the present church, and was blessed by Bishop J. Peter Sartain on the day of the Jubilee. Immediately behind the memorial is a Time Capsule which remains sealed until the celebration of another Jubilee Day. An addition to the parish office was completed in June 2005. This allowed for Fr. Dienert to have a private office. Restoration and repairs were made to some of the stained glass windows in the church.

In 2011, Father Thomas J. Hart became pastor. The rectory underwent an extensive remodel. In the summer of 2013 the parish office was remodeled and the parish conference room and offices were renovated. The parish celebrated the 80th Anniversary of the dedication of the church on May 3, 2013. In June 2016, Fr. Rubén Quinteros was assigned to our parish, and in December 2017, Fr Nelson Rubio was named associate pastor. Then in June 2019, Fr Nelson was replaced by Fr Joseph de Orbegozo. Under their guidance, plans are underway to build a columbarium in the cemetery and update the Youth House.

We commend our future to the grace of God who has provided for us through all these past years and ask for the continued guidance of the Holy Spirit.
