Parish Mission Statement

Our Lady of Victory Parish is a part of the Roman Catholic Church, which we believe is the institutional continuation of the Church founded by our Lord Jesus Christ when he sent out his apostles after his resurrection with these instructions: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to carry out all that I have commanded of you, and know that I am with you always, until the end of the world." By the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist, members of the Church are promised eternal life and are equipped to serve God and their neighbor, according to the gifts and talents which each of them have received. In this way, we worship God in Spirit and Truth and welcome his Kingdom into our hearts and into the world.

Parish Vision Statement

We, the people of Our Lady of Victory Parish, are a Christian community of the one true Church founded by Jesus Himself and built on the Rock of Peter.

As disciples of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on a pilgrimage to eternal happiness in Communion with the Holy Trinity, we commit ourselves to following Him and entering into a closer relationship with Him in this life through our prayer, worship, sacraments, ongoing faith formation, and a dedication to corporal and spiritual works of mercy to serve those in need.

We seek to proclaim the Gospel in our lives, and we recognize the Godgiven dignity of every man, woman, and child, created in His image and likeness, at all ages and stages of their existence, from conception until natural death. Specifically:

Worship: We recognize the central importance of the Sunday celebration of the Holy Eucharist, the source and summit of the Church's life.

Faith Formation: We commit ourselves to learning and understanding what Christ reveals in the Sacred Scriptures and Tradition of the Church, guided and instructed by our Holy Father and the Archbishop of Cincinnati. We take seriously our sacred mission to hand this faith on to all our parish children.

Works of Mercy: As followers of Jesus Christ, called to be known by our love for one another, we strive to bring the presence of Christ and a true hope to those who may otherwise despair for lack of faith, food, shelter, clothing, Christian friendship, companionship, and treatment not in keeping with their human dignity.

Liturgical & Sacramental Information

Eucharistic Adoration:

Come and encounter Jesus fully present in the Eucharist. Adoration is held in the chapel every Monday immediately following 8:30am Mass. The Eucharist is exposed from 9:00am -4:00pm.

Private Prayer:

Our Lady of the Rosary Eucharistic Chapel is open all day every day for private prayer and devotions. Doors remain open until 9:00pm.

Anointing:

Anyone who is in the hospital, preparing for/recovering from surgery, or has any other illness or ailment is qualified to receive the Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you or someone you know is interested in receiving this sacrament.

Communion Visits:

Do you know someone who is sick or homebound who would like to receive Holy Communion at home or in the hospital? Arrangements can be made for either one-time or recurring needs. Please call the parish office for more information.

Weddings:

Parishioners may schedule their wedding through the parish office six months to one year in advance. Fees include \$300 for the church plus at least a suggested \$15 per altar server (if provided by the parish). It is recommended to reserve a date with the parish before booking any other details for the wedding. Please contact the parish office if you are interested in getting married at Our Lady of Victory.

Baptisms:

Please call parish office to make arrangements for baptism and orientation. Orientation meetings are offered on the first Sunday of every other month. Godparents are welcome to attend.

Funerals: (see "Parish Office Business" for cemetery information)

All funeral Masses are held at 11:00am. If a different time is preferred, the family should work with the funeral home to secure a priest and organist for the funeral. Please contact the parish office for funeral and Convocation Center rates.



Family Masses:

Family Masses were established as a way for young families to come together and participate in the Sunday liturgy as a part of the community. It also gives our young parishioners the opportunity to participate in some of the minor ministries at Sunday Mass. Students serve as lectors, ushers/greeters, musicians, and a parish family brings up the offertory gifts. Family Masses occur once per month during the school year. Safe Environment Training

The Archdiocese of Cincinnati seeks to do all it can to protect our youth. Therefore, we require all volunteers and employees, especially those who have contact with the children of Our Lady of Victory to:

- 1. Attend a VIRTUS Awareness Training Session
- 2. Receive a Selection.com Background Check
- 3. Complete monthly training bulletins provided through VIRTUS
- 4. Be familiar with the Archdiocesan Decree on Child Protection

Our first and foremost concern is for the safety of our children, and we cannot allow anyone who has not been through these processes to work with our children.

Need something published in the bulletin? Written notices can be emailed to olvbulletin@olv.org, or delivered to the parish office in person. **Articles** must be submitted by 9am on the Monday before it is to be published.

Mass Offerings:

If you would like to honor a loved one (either living or deceased) by having the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered for them, please stop by the parish office to schedule a date. There is a \$5 minimum donation required for each offering. You may also enroll a deceased person in the Memorial Society (\$5 minimum) to have one Mass per month offered for them for one year and have their name included in the Memorial Book on display for All Souls Day in November. Donations can also be made in honor of a loved one for the Tuition Assistance Fund, the OLV Food Pantry, St. Vincent de Paul, etc.

Booking the Convocation Center:

Convocation Center privileges are limited to OLV parishioners only. A \$75 security deposit is required to book the meeting room or conference room (up to 42 occupants), and a \$200 security deposit is required for the Main Hall (43-300+ occupants). Security deposits are due upon reservation and are refunded after the event provided there are no damages. A \$1 million liability policy is required to book an event - through your homeowner's policy or application through the Archdiocese (more information is available through the parish office). An F-Permit is also required for alcohol sales.

Special Dates for the Parish

Parish Feast Day:

Our Lady of Victory celebrates our patronal feast day on the weekend closest to October 7 – also known as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This memorial, established by Pope Pius V in thanksgiving for the victory at Lepanto on October 7, 1571, recalls the rosary and its meditation on the mysteries of Christ and our salvation.

Parish Festival:

The Our Lady of Victory Festival takes place every year on the weekend before Memorial Day weekend. Festival hours typically run Friday 6-11pm, Saturday 5-11pm, and Sunday 3-10pm with a chicken dinner in the Convocation Center on Sunday evening. Games, rides, and entertainment always promise a good time! This year the festival will take place the weekend of October 1-3, 2021 (due to the Covid-19).

Parish Picnic:

The parish holds a picnic at the end of the summer each year starting with an outdoor Mass in the afternoon and a grill out/potluck afterwards. There are also games and activities for the kids and an annual corn hole tournament! The picnic usually takes place the Saturday after school begins in August.

Holy Smokes:

Holy Smokes is a professional BBQ competition sanctioned by the Kansas City Barbecue Society that is held at Our Lady of Victory every year during the first full weekend in August. Holy Smokes is designed to bring people together... those already within the Parish, as well as folks outside of the Victory community. Holy Smokes is one of only a few competitions held in the Cincinnati area throughout the year. It is a family-friendly event with games, activities for all ages, music and of course... more BBQ than you can eat!

Fr. Benedict was born in Dublin, Ireland, 1964. His parents are Gerry and Martha, siblings, David, Gerard, Deborah, and Stephanie all living in Dublin. His sisters are identical twins. He has 11 nieces and nephews and two grand nephews. He is a graduate of Scoil Fursa (Catholic Elementary School, Dublin) and Belcamp College (Catholic High School, Dublin) as well as All Hallows College (Dublin), The University of St. Thomas Aquinas (Angelicum, Rome), and the International Marian Research Institute, University of Dayton (Ohio).

He was ordained to the priesthood in Ireland in 1993 and has a Doctorate in Theology. In 2011 he was appointed first recipient of the Daniel E. Pilarczyk Chair of Systematic Theology at the Athenaeum of Ohio. Fr. Benedict arrived in the United States in 1993 and became a citizen of the United States in 2000. After serving at St. Albert the Great Parish, Kettering, Ohio and Holy Angels Parish, Sidney, Ohio, he was appointed by Archbishop Pilarczyk to the Athenaeum of Ohio and Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology in 2000, where he taught theology at the Seminary, Theology School and was director of the Permanent Deacon Formation Program. He was appointed President and Rector of Mount St. Mary's Seminary and School of Theology in 2011. Fr. Benedict has a Border Collie, Blathene (Irish for Little Flower) and three cats named Gail, Maggie, and BoBo. Fr. Benedict was appointed pastor of Our Lady of Victory in July 2018.



Drew Breiner, Maintenance



Religious Education

"The primary goal of the Religious Education Programs of Our Lady of Victory Parish is to continue the mission of Jesus by proclaiming the Word of God, celebrating the sacred mysteries and serving the people of the world." - OLV Handbook

Religious Education School

The Religious Education Program (grades one through eight) meets on Monday evenings September through May from 6:45 - 8p.m., learning about God's love in various ways. There are many special activities and events planned. The catechists, aides and tutors are committed to quality education. Registration is required.

Adult Religious Education

"The purpose of the Adult Religious Education Team is to meet the needs of the parish community by providing learning opportunities that strengthen our relationship with God and with each other." - Mission Statement

The Adult Education Team works with the Director of Religious Education to plan, execute and evaluate adult learning opportunities that respond to the needs of the parish community.

Sacramental Preparation

Baptism Program

The Baptismal Program is set up to assist parents in realizing their commitment to their child and to assist the Priests and Deacons in baptizing the children. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Orientation class, presented by members of the Baptism Team. To schedule a baptism please call Sara Gonnella at 513-347-8810.

First Reconciliation/First Eucharist

Students in grade two of the Day School and Monday Evening Program are prepared in partnership with their parents to celebrate these sacraments. First Reconciliation is celebrated at the Parish Penance Service during Lent.

Confirmation

Students begin this formation in their eighth-grade year. Preparation includes service projects, spirit evenings, classroom instructions and a retreat. Students must be enrolled in Day School or in Monday Evening Program. (Note: Arrangements are made for students who have special needs or request preparation at other times.)

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process that supports and encourages those who are inquiring about or seeking membership into the Catholic faith community. It welcomes new members and tries to provide an appropriate spiritual and practical formation according to each person's needs.

The RCIA is a journey of faith in which candidates learn Catholic teachings, come to accept Christian values, develop a life of prayer, and become members of the local faith community. As a sacramental process, it consists of several rituals that mark the spiritual growth of the candidates as well as express the community's joy and concern for them.

Our parish RCIA Team consists of the Priests, Deacons and many volunteers who serve as catechists, hospitality ministers, sponsors, and liturgists.

Parish Organizations and Commissions

Pastoral Council

The purpose of Pastoral Council is to help meet the pastoral needs of the parish. Pastoral Council is primarily a consultative group representing the wisdom of the parish community at large and dealing with broad directions and goals. This contrasts with the various missions, activities and associations which represent a specific service function and deal mainly with specific means and strategies. These various commission, activities, and associations report to the Pastoral Council, thereby maintaining proper direction and leadership. Pastoral Council consists of nine members elected at large.

If you have an item you would like to present to Pastoral Council, please contact the Chairman or other member of Pastoral Council to be placed on the agenda.

Worship Commission

The Worship Commission develops policies for the application of the guidelines of the Archdiocesan Worship Commission and is responsible for all policies under which parish liturgical worship is conducted. Included in its responsibilities is the recruiting and training of liturgical ministers, preparing liturgical celebrations, determining parish policy on liturgical matters and liturgical education of the parish. Its membership consists of competent, interested, and responsible persons from our parish community who share in the responsibility of promoting good worship on an ongoing basis in our parish.

Peace & Justice Commission

The purpose of the Peace and Justice Commission is to establish, facilitate and review activities and educational programs that promote the principles set forth in the Mission Statement: "to educate, inform, and call all members of our parish community to a responsible and Christ-like action regarding social, economic, political, environmental, or any other issue that concerns human dignity and the quality of human life worldwide."

Some of the programs include: Care Barrels/Food Pantry, sale of Fair-Trade products, The Giving Tree, Christmas in July, Tender Mercies, letter writing for Legislative Advocacy, Medical Missions overseas, and other important issues.

The meetings are always open, and we welcome everyone to come, listen and learn. One person can make a difference! Can you?

Education Commission

The purpose of the Education Commission is to recommend policy which shall govern parish educational programs, subject to the approval of the pastor. The Education Commission will serve as a vital link in assisting the pastor and parish administrators in the development of a long-range plan for parish educational programs in compliance with Archdiocesan Standards and Policies and to offer counsel and advice to the pastor and parish administrators in the operation of these programs.

Finance Commission

The purpose of the Finance Commission is to serve the Pastor and Pastoral Council regarding financial issues of the parish as needed. This will be accomplished through the research and analysis of the facts surrounding the issues. Once formulated, the financial plans and the budgets developed will be implemented through the Pastor and the Pastoral Council.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs)

Extraordinary Ministers assist the priest and deacons in distributing Holy Communion to the congregation at Mass. A devout reverence for the Eucharist and a deep understanding of the true presence of Christ's Body and Blood under the guise of bread and wine is a requirement for this ministry. EMHCs are assigned to quarterly schedules through Ministry Scheduler Pro. If you are interested in becoming an EMHC, please contact the parish office or speak with Deacon Mark Machuga.

Distribution of Holy Communion to the Sick

The clergy (pastor and/or deacon) make regular visits to nursing homes and the homebound as requested. Lay persons who are commissioned as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may visit and bring Holy Communion to the homebound and nursing homes on a weekly basis if interested. Contact Deacon Charley Jenkins for more details. If you wish to receive Holy Communion through this ministry, please call the parish office.

Lectors

Lectors proclaim the Scripture readings at all Masses. Lectors are scheduled for weekend Masses so they may prepare in advance for weekly readings. Some lectors are simply listed as subs to fill in when needed. If interested, please contact the parish office.

Music Ministry

Music makes up an important ministry for any parish. Our music department includes: the Adult Choir, the Contemporary Music Group, solo cantors, and the Victory Youth Choir, comprised of students in grades 2-8. Mrs. Elaina McCormick is our Music Director and Mrs. Kathy Lynn leads the youth choir through the school. If interested in getting involved with Music Ministry, please contact the parish office.

Altar Servers

The servers assist the priest during the celebration of all liturgies. Their ministry involves preparations before, during, and after the liturgy. This ministry is currently open to both boys and girls who have begun the sixth grade and up. Information about getting involved is sent out through the school and Religious Education classes each year.

Ushers

Ushers perform many duties, including assisting people at Mass to make them comfortable, finding available seating, directing Communion, and/or taking up the collection. An usher coordinator is responsible for assigning a captain at each Mass who is assisted by four to six additional ushers to oversee all functions. They also greet parishioners as they arrive and pass out bulletins at the end of the Mass.

Other Ministries

Marriage Ministry

The Marriage Ministry is a group of married couples who prepare engaged couples for the sacrament of Matrimony. This preparation consists of a series of one-on-one meetings with each couple to administer the new *Fully Engaged* Inventory and then review the results with the engaged couple. The goal of *Fully Engaged* is to help couples learn more about themselves by identifying and working through key issues before marriage. Marriage Ministry helps couples to realize the significance of the commitment they are making to each other and enriches their relationship with God and the Church.

St. Vincent de Paul Society

The St. Vincent de Paul Society helps the needy families of the parish and community materially and spiritually, usually, on a temporary basis. If you are interested in helping with this important ministry, please call the parish office.

Social Groups and Organizations

Athletic Association

The Athletic Association is a great way to get involved at OIV and meet new people. It provides the opportunity for our grade school and high school students to participate in sporting activities including soccer, baseball, softball, basketball, football, lacrosse, golf, and volleyball. The Athletic Association provides many of the capital improvements that are necessary to insure first-class facilities for all sports participants. Athletic Association members also volunteer to help coach or coordinate various sports and help with the festival each year. Our monthly meetings are held on the first Thursday of each month starting at 8:30pm. We meet at the concession stand by the upper fields or in the cafeteria, depending on weather.

Ladies of Victory (LOV)

Ladies of Victory is a social organization open to all women of the parish which offers service, promotes unity, and provides for social activities. No dues are charged and every woman in the parish is considered a member if she chooses. Annual events include the Ladies Night Out, Mystery Trip, Anniversary Brunch, Chicken Dinner at the parish festival, Bunny Brunch. Proceeds from the above events are used for various church and parish improvements.

Holy Smokes

Holy Smokes is a differentiator for the OLV parish, delivering faith and fellowship through...food. Named some of Cincinnati's best BBQ by Cincinnati Magazine in 2019, the Holy Smokes Organization is woven throughout the parish, supporting food-based events throughout the year. Holy Smokes cooks for events such as: the big game, fish fries, graduation, Thanksgiving, and other pop-up events. Additionally, OLV is proud to host the only Cincinnati-based Kansas City BBQ Society Competition, held in early August. The Competition hosts professional BBQ teams from all over the world to compete for various prizes and bragging rights! Holy Smokes is a great way to get involved at OLV! Whether you are interested in becoming a BBQ Pitmaster or joining the Rockstar serve/community team, there is a place for you! Our proceeds stay in the OLV community and are used for various church, school, and parish needs.

Boy Scouts

The aims of scouting are to build character, to instill citizenship, and to promote physical fitness. The ideals of scouting, as shown through the scout oath and law and a vigorous outdoor program build strong bodies, instill an awareness of community life and needs, and allow for the practice of leadership skills. Weekly meetings are devoted to learning scout skills and crafts and there is at least one outdoor program each month. The boys become aware of needs of everyday life and practice leadership the first-hand way. There is at least one outdoor program each month. Boy Scouts is open to boys 11 to 18 years old. Boys can join anytime of the year through registration and active involvement.
