### *Mission Statement*

Aware of our call by the Holy Spirit, we the Parish of St. Alban Roe Roman Catholic Church are gathered in the name of Jesus to be nourished by His word and the Eucharist. ### *Vision Statement for Faith Formation*

## St. Alban Roe

(Bartholomew Roe 1583-1642)



The Primary Patron Saint of our Parish is one of the Forty English martyrs canonized by the Church. Bartholomew Roe, Patron Saint of St. Alban Roe, was born at Suffolk, England in 1583 during the reign of Queen Elizabeth. He was reared in a good Anglican home and later attended Cambridge University. While at university, he visited the Abbey of St. Alban, a prison for Catholics.

At the Abbey, Bartholomew attempted to convert an imprisoned Catholic to Protestantism but was defeated in argument. He became uneasy about his religion and after reading and consulting with Catholic priests, he was convinced of his errors and decided to join the Catholic Church. He and his brother James became Benedictine monks. He was not typically monastic but had an explosive and unpredictable temperament. Even so, his outstanding characteristics were cheerfulness, tenacity, and sanctity.

He went to France to study for the priesthood and was ordained in 1615. He joined the missions and went to London where he was arrested shortly after arriving. He was deported but returned to London and was imprisoned in the Fleet prison for 17 years. He remained zealous for the conversion of souls and was allowed to leave prison to minister to souls during the day as long as he was back in his cell at night. Lacking a church to minister from, he frequented ale houses, playing cards with the customers. The stakes were not monetary, but short prayers. He was allowed visitors in his cell and taught them prayers and made many converts.

The Puritans were scandalized by his continued ministry success in converting people and he was eventually transferred to the strict Newgate prison. He was tried for treason and convicted. Bartholomew, along with fellow priest Thomas Reynolds were taken to the place of execution where he preached to the crowd about the meaning of his death declaring "see then what the crime is for which I am to die and whether religion be not my only treason?"

Bartholomew was declared venerable and beatified by Pope Pius XI in 1929 and canonized on October 25, 1970, by Pope Paul VI as one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales with a common feast day of October 25.

The Benedictine Monks at the Priory are from the same community as St. Alban Roe.







Through our partnership with AMIGA, parishioners are able to work alongside teams of medical and non-medical professionals to provide hope and humanitarian aid through the delivery of basic health care, education, and resources for the underprivileged and underserved in areas of west/northwestern Honduras. Our mission affiliation allows you to serve others by sharing your individual talents, time and resources. ### BASEMENT SALE

Established in 1984, the St. Alban Roe Basement Sale is one of the oldest and largest ministries in the parish. The Basement Sale touches the lives of people outside of U.S. borders and locally, with a focus on service to the poor. As the name suggests, the Basement Sale is a giant sale held annually, generally the weekend after Memorial Day. It is considered by many of our patrons to be the largest and best organized sale of its kind in the region. Parishioners donate items such as gently used clothing, shoes, household items, baby items, toys, books, jewelry, sports equipment, small electronics, and lawn and garden items that are sold at bargain prices during the Sale weekend. Most of the monetary proceeds from the Sale are donated to international charitable organizations, including our mission partner, AMIGA, and Unbound. About 10% of the Sale proceeds are allocated to our St. Alban Roe Adult Mission ministry to help defray a small portion of the cost of travel for the mission team participants with valid financial need and to purchase supplies.

Beyond financial support, the Basement Sale supports local charities with in-kind donations. Post-sale, all remaining unsold items are donated to local charities. In turn, these charities use them to support their ministries and the people they serve. In recent years the Basement Sale has donated items to The Salvation Army, Habitat for Humanity, St. Anthony's Food Pantry, SVDP and others. We also work with Remains, Inc., a recycling center in St. Louis that will reimburse for select items to be recycled or repurposed. Any cash reimbursement received from Remains is donated back to the Basement Sale fund.

Nearly 300 volunteers help during Basement Sale week to set up, sort, organize, label, price, sell, cleanup and to assist with the local charity pickups. Volunteering is a great opportunity to use your time and talents to serve those in need and build community within our Parish.

*Due to Covid-19 restrictions, the Basement Sale is on hold. Updates on future Sale dates will be communicated in the bulletin. In the interim, please consider donating your gently used items to St. Vincent DePaul. 
