## Mass Schedule

### Daily Mass

Monday through Thursday 9:00 a.m. If a funeral should happen to occur on one of these days, the daily Eucharist is normally canceled and parishioners are encouraged to attend and participate in the Funeral Mass to pray for the deceased and his/her family.

Please note: on Tuesdays during the school year, when school is in session, Mass will be held in the chapel at Villa Angela-St. Joseph High School at 8:45 a.m. If there is a school closing for weather, Mass will be held in the church, also at 8:45 a.m.

### Weekend Mass Schedule

### Holy Days

Holy Days of Obligation occur several times throughout the course of the liturgical year. More often than not these celebrations occur on weekdays. There is no fixed schedule for these celebrations, but the most common schedule is: Vigil (day before) 5:00 p.m. and the Holy Day (actual day) 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

## Sacramental Life

**Baptism:** Infant & Child baptisms are normally celebrated in the context of weekend Masses. Arrangements and preparations are made with the Pastor in face-to-face meetings. Since Lent is a season of preparation for baptism, there are normally no baptisms during the season of Lent. (Medical emergencies are an exception.)

**Confirmation:** The sacrament of Confirmation is normally celebrated in eighth grade during a Sunday Liturgy with the Bishop or his assigned designee. We welcome adults and older teens to participate as well. Following diocesan guidelines, preparation is a two-year process which begins in grade 7. Formation consists of both online and large group gatherings. For more information, contact Shawn Witmer x14 or [shawn@olleucid.org](mailto:shawn@olleucid.org).

**Reconciliation:** The sacrament of reconciliation (confession) is celebrated on Saturday afternoon from 3:00-3:30 p.m. in the chapel of reconciliation, immediately adjacent to the chapel of Eucharistic reservation in the church. It may also be celebrated by appointment with the pastor. During the season of Lent there are communal celebrations of reconciliation which include a more extensive Liturgy of the Word and participation of several guest confessors.

**First Reconciliation and First Eucharist:** Preparation for both Sacraments begins in fall of the 2nd grade year, and includes monthly family sessions for these “children of light.” We also welcome older children and adults who may wish to participate in these Sacraments, and will design an individual preparation program for each candidate.

**Matrimony:** Arrangements for a Church wedding should not be made without first meeting with the Pastor. Normally preparations should begin at least six months in advance of the hoped for wedding, and earlier if one of the partners has been involved in a previous marriage. Preparation utilizes the instrument Prepare/Enrich, an online survey tool, as the basis of several conversations between the couple and the pastor.

**Annulments:** Anyone who has been previously married, but divorced, and hopes to marry again in the Church must petition for a declaration of invalidity (annulment) of the previous marriage. Since grounds for annulments vary, the time and preparation of the petition and the process of ruling on it differ from case to case. The appropriate first step is to meet with the Pastor to help assess the situation.

**Marriage Validation:** Anyone who has been married outside the Church and wishes to have their marriage “blessed” or “validated” by the Church should arrange to meet with the Pastor to assess their situation, to determine appropriate preparations, and to plan when and how the validation will take place.

**Eucharist for the Homebound:** Those that are unable to come to church because of physical ability, illness or age are encouraged to call the rectory to arrange for weekly Sunday visits from one of our Eucharistic Ministers.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Those who are seriously ill or experiencing the effects of old age are encouraged to request the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Contrary to popular opinion, this anointing is not best understood as the “last rites.” Rather, it can and should be celebrated when a person begins to be seriously ill. The sacrament can be celebrated at home, in church or in an institutional setting such as a hospital or nursing home. Those wishing to be anointed (or their family agent) should contact the Pastor to make arrangements. Twice a year, usually in the Spring and in the Fall, Anointing of the Sick is celebrated at all weekend Masses.

## Faith Formation

**OLL Preschool:** Our Lady of the Lake School has a Preschool program for four and five year olds. We offer a half day program and a full day program with the option of sending your child 3, 4 or 5 days per week. Families will have the option of an extended day or after care program which will run until 6:00 p.m.

Our program is fully licensed through the Ohio Department of Education. We follow the Pre-Kindergarten Curriculum and Academic Guidelines set forth by the Diocese of Cleveland in accordance with the State of Ohio. Our Preschoolers are an integral part of our school and make use of all of our facilities and classes. They take part in music, art, and physical education.

At Our Lady of the Lake School, you will find that we are like a family. Your child will learn good habits and attitudes in our loving Catholic community. Through patient and respectful methods, our earliest learners develop a positive sense of themselves, which will make a difference throughout their lives.



Each session begins with proclamation of the Gospel for that Sunday of the church year, and children then gather within their class groups to further explore the meaning of that Gospel for the church and for them as children of God. **The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** is available throughout the year for anyone considering joining the Catholic Church or simply wanting more information about what it means to be Catholic. If someone comes to the Catholic Church already baptized we honor that gift of grace in the person's life, as we believe that one is forever marked by baptism as an adopted son and daughter of God. An unbaptized adult is prepared, supported and encouraged in his or her conversion to Christ while also coming to understand what it means to become a Catholic Christian. We will meet you where you are. Contact Shawn Witmer at x14 or shawn@ollecucld.org for more information.

**Children's Catechumenate:** The RCIA is adapted for the child's age and offered throughout the year. Younger children may be baptized at any time with the consent of the parents. Children who have reached age seven or older will participate in an RCIA preparation program adapted to their developmental level.

**LECTIO Reflection Group:** A group that meets remotely on Saturday morning for one hour to reflect on the Sunday readings as a way to prepare for the liturgy of the word each week. Contact the office for log-in information.

**Adult Faith Formation:** The parish regularly offers adult faith formation opportunities that include but are not limited to scripture study, small-group faith sharing, and presentations/seminars on issues or topics of current interest. Also, the parish customarily offers retreat experiences during Advent and/or Lent, including retreats and parish missions.

**Children's Liturgy of the Word:** Adult parish catechists offer Children's Liturgy of the Word during the 11am Mass on Sundays during the school year for children in grades K thru 4.

**Scripture Study:** Periodic fall and winter study sessions include topics that are determined by the participants themselves. There is a small fee to purchase materials, and the group typically meets for one hour on a weekday evening.

**Vacation Bible School:** One week each summer is set aside for this exciting blend of sharing faith, storytelling, activities, art projects, singing and all-around fun for children ages 4 years to grade 4. Each year's theme focuses on an aspect of Christian life and correlated Bible stories. Adults and teen volunteers share their time, talent, and enthusiasm with the youth of our parish and surrounding areas. To volunteer or register, contact the rectory.

# Worship

**Minister Scheduler:** Please send schedule requests or information changes to the Scheduler at [ollscheduler@gmail.com](mailto:ollscheduler@gmail.com). Paper copies of the schedule and contact lists can be picked-up in the South Sacristy and the Rectory.

**Servers:** Any baptized parishioner from grade four through adulthood can be an altar server. Typically, servers are recruited once or twice a year through Our Lady of the Lake School or PSR, but anyone interested should contact the Pastor at any time. Training is easy and will be provided.

**Art and Environment:** A small but dedicated group of parishioners meet monthly to plan and then carry out appropriate ways to prepare the Church for the various liturgical seasons of the year. Anyone with a bit of artistic ability who also has a love and sensibility for liturgy are most welcome to join this group. Contact person is Coletta Bauer.

**Funerals:** When a loved one dies, the Church seeks to respond with compassion and flexibility. The process usually includes a meeting between the pastor and loved ones, a wake service at the funeral home before the funeral, a funeral Mass and committal at the cemetery. Since every family situation is different, the meeting between the pastor and loved ones is particularly important.

**Livestream:** The Saturday 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass is livestreamed every week starting with the prelude around 3:55 p.m. The livestream video can be accessed from a link on the website ([olleuclid.org](http://olleuclid.org)) or by going to our youtube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/c/olleuclid>).

The Livestream Mass is made possible by our Livestream Ministry who is trained to control either the video camera or the livestream software. If you are interested in this ministry, please contact Nicole Hufford at [nicole@olleuclid.org](mailto:nicole@olleuclid.org).

**Virtual Evening Prayer:** This group meets remotely via ZOOM on a weekly basis for 30 minutes to read and reflect on the readings for the day. Contact the office for log-in information.

**Advent and Lenten Evening Prayers:** Evening Prayer, based on the Liturgy of the Hours is celebrated on Sunday evenings in the Church at 6:30 p.m. This simple, lay-led service is a beautiful and prayerful way to bring a Sunday in Advent or Lent to a prayerful conclusion.

## Music Ministry:

### Parish Choir

Members [as young as 4th grade students] enhance the liturgy, usually one Mass per weekend. Occasionally, the choir will participate in outreach programs. Members must have the ability to match pitch, but the ability to read music is not necessary. Rehearsals are generally Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m.-8:00 p.m. during the school year or Saturdays every other week from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. according to the monthly schedule.

### **Instrumentalists**

Members enhance the liturgy according to skill level and availability. Rehearsals take place when parish choir meets or when the director and instrumentalist can meet.

### **The Cantor Ministry**

Cantors must possess good ministerial, leadership, ear-training, and vocal skills. Rehearsals are scheduled individually or with a group. The ability to read music is desired, but not necessary. Cantors sing at designated Masses. Acceptance into this ministry is at the discretion of the music director. Youth welcome!

### **OLL School Youth Choir**

Children grades 4-8 sing at designated OLL School Masses during the year. Rehearsals are Wednesdays from 2:35-3:15 p.m.

### **Friends with God, a youth music ministry**

Children grades K-3 sing at designated outreach events within the community and parish during the year. Rehearsals are TBA as needed.

**Sacristans:** There is a small group of dedicated “behind the scenes” parishioners who help to open the church, prepare the worship space for Mass or other celebrations, assist in keeping the church building clean, and who help to coordinate the actual celebration of the liturgy. This important and unheralded ministry is open to all parishioners aged sixteen or older. Contact person is Cy Selan.

## **Consultative Groups**

**Parish Finance Council:** This council gives direction and advises the pastor in the area of finances and parish stewardship to ensure the parish completes its mission. Four to 12 members are chosen by the pastor and asked to serve for a time amenable to all and meet as needed. Members typically commit to a three year term.

**Parish Pastoral Council:** The Parish Pastoral Council serves as a consultative council for the Pastor to enrich the pastoral mission of Our Lady of the Lake Parish. Members serve a three year term and commit to investigating, considering and suggesting action to the pastor on topics determined by him to be of primary pastoral interest at any given time. Beginning in the Fall of 2019, the Council will be attending to the following two issues: (1) Identifying and engaging young adults in the ministry and life of the parish; and (2) Identifying and reaching out to those who may have lost touch with the parish after the merge between Holy Cross and Saint Christine Parishes.

**Endowment Board:** The Endowment Board is a subcommittee of the Parish Finance Council. It meets semi-annually to review parish investments in accordance with an investment policy approved by the Diocese. Parishioners with appropriate competency in finance and investment who are interested should contact Fr. Joe.

## Outreach to Those in Need

**Neighbor to Neighbor Ministry:** Neighbor to Neighbor Ministry serves those in need within our parish boundaries. This organization manages the food pantry as well as baskets at Thanksgiving, the Giving Tree during the Christmas Season and helps at the Frederick Ozanam Center on the St. Philomena Campus. In addition to temporal assistance, we attempt to create relationships with those we help, getting to know them better in order to provide more comprehensive service and support to them.

**The Baby Corner:** Have you ever wondered what to do with all of those bulky baby items that are monopolizing your valuable storage space? Donate them to the Our Lady of the Lake Baby Corner. We collect gently used baby items and clothing and distribute them to those in need. We also share them with clients contacting the Euclid/Hillcrest Collaborative and others are given to Birthright and similar charities that support families. If you have gently used items to donate, you can call the rectory to contact the baby corner personnel who will return your call and let you know if the items you have are needed. If so, you can make an appointment to drop them off at the rectory during business hours. We also accept financial donations which help to provide formula and diapers.

**Prayer Shawl Ministry:** This ministry reaches out to those in need of comfort and compassion. Thoughts and prayers go into the making of each shawl. The needle worker begins each shawl with the hope that the recipient feels the concern and warmth of the parish community. These intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. Once the shawl is completed, a final prayer is offered over the shawl at one of our monthly meetings on the 4th Monday of the month before it is given to the recipient. The blessings of many caring hands are worked into each and every shawl!

Our Lady of the Lake Prayer Shawl Ministry welcomes donations of yarn and/or needles and crochet hooks, as well as monetary donations for our yarn purchases to make prayer shawls. Donations can be dropped off at the rectory during regular office hours. We are grateful for all donations. To request a shawl, please call the Our Lady of the Lake Rectory at 216-486-0850.

**Operation Rice Bowl:** Our parish and school participate in the Rice Bowl campaign each year during Lent, in support of Catholic Relief Services work overseas. Twenty-five cents of every dollar we collect stays in our local area and serves those in need through Catholic Charities.

## School Related Groups

**Booster Club:** The Booster Club is dedicated to helping children in our parish learn about sports, grow in their abilities, develop skills particular to sports, as well as the values of fairness, acceptance, honesty and respect. Coaches, team representatives and parental support are needed throughout the year. The Booster Club meets on the first Thursday of the month. Information can be found in the bulletin.

**PTO.:** The Our Lady of the Lake PTO is a strong organization that plans family-friendly events and fundraising events to support the school throughout the year. We welcome students back in the fall with an ice cream social, host Parents & Pastries, a mother/son and father/daughter event, Trunk or Treat, and Family Movie Night, to name a few. We have many other fun and/or informative events throughout the year. Our goal is to make every family feel that they are a welcome part of the Our Lady of the Lake community. We also do as much as we can for our wonderful teachers and faculty. We provide teachers with a mini grant each year, a free field trip for each class, faculty gifts at Christmas and a small gift for their birthdays.

**Life on the Lake Committee:** Each year, Life on the Lake raises valuable funds to support technology and enrichment programs at Our Lady of the Lake School. To volunteer, sponsor or donate, call the School office at 216-481-6824.

## Community and Ecumenical Activities

**Faith in the City:** Our Lady of the Lake belongs to an association of churches in the city of Euclid that is called Faith in the City. This group sponsors various events throughout the year including a Dr. Martin Luther King Celebration, National Day of Prayer, a Thanksgiving Prayer Service and a St. Francis Pet Blessing.

**Martin Luther King Celebration:** Each year we participate in a celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King. This event consists of songs, prayers and other activities acknowledging what has changed and what still needs to change in our society regarding racial equality and is celebrated at Lake Shore Christian Church.

**Memorial Day Parade:** Each year a group of parishioners gather to walk in the Memorial Day Parade to express our appreciation for the many sacrifices made by our veterans. If you're not up to walking, sit along the route and encourage all of the walkers!

**East 200th Street Stroll:** The Saturday after Memorial Day there is a wonderful street party down on 200th Street. This event celebrates all of the wonderful businesses on East 200th Street.
