You FINISHED, now How to Score it!

For each set of three questions, fill in the number on the lines below, either 1, 2, 3, 4, or 0 that you answered for each question. Then add them together and fill that number in on the last line.

Your strongest Gift(s) will generally have a total score of "7" or more. If you have more than one Gift with a total of 7 or more, then all those Gifts can be referred to as your "Gift cluster". Notice how each Gift within a Cluster has the potential to complement and support another.

Example: if you circled 2 for question 1, circled 4 for question 21, and circled 3 for 41. You would have a total of 9 for Administration. This would be one of your Strongest Gifts.

This is NOT a scientific study, but an inventory designed to assist you to begin YOUR journey toward Spiritual Gift discovery. Your perceptions will be validated by others and confirmed through prayer and by their use over time.

The project provides parishioners with the opportunity to assist with gifts, toys, clothing and many other necessary personal items for people served by a variety of ministries and agencies in our area. Meetings are seasonal, and day of volunteers are always needed.

Bereavement

The Bereavement group's mission is to serve all people who have experienced the death of a loved one. The goal is to offer spiritual support and the healing comfort of God to all who mourn a loss through death. The vision is to offer this support by a staff member meeting with families to plan the funeral liturgy, through support the wake service by the attendance of members from the parish, through the church rituals of the wake service and funeral mass or service assisted by a funeral choir. Ongoing support includes follow ups with family members through mailings or telephone calls, a six-week support group, and a Mass of Remembrance to be held in November.

Emergency Assistance

The Parish Emergency Assistance helps the poor and needy of our community. This includes Twinsburg, Twinsburg Township, and part of Reminderville. We help with emergency food from our well stocked pantry, meat and juice from our freezer, plus gift cards as needed. Financial assistance is available for utility payments, rent, etc. Information about government programs and agency services is given to clients for outside help. Emergency Assistance is made possible through the charitable contributions of others. This includes four envelope collections annually, food baskets in the church and the post office food drive each year in May. Members are required to attend the two planning meetings each month, and to work directly with the Emergency Assistance line, for one week every other month.

Baptism

The first Sacrament of Initiation. Baptisms are celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 12:30 pm. Per diocesan requirements, a preparation class must be attended by the couple before the baptism of their first child. The preparation class is held on the 3rd Tuesday every other month 7:00-8:00 pm in the Parish Center.

Preparation for this Sacrament of Healing and Eucharist engages parents and children who are 7 years old and in the second year of faith formation, to celebrate and receive the sacraments not just once but as a lifelong faith practice. Preparation takes place outside of school and other faith formation events, happening in a parish and family-based setting. First Reconciliations is typically celebrated in the winter season. First Eucharist is celebrated on a Sunday after Easter.

Children who are of the age of 7 and not baptized should be accompanied by a parent as they are welcomed into the faith.

A Teaching People -

Activities designed to form our FAITH

All parishes in the Diocese of Cleveland are expected to offer a comprehensive and systematic catechetical program for elementary age children (grades 1 through 8) as well as lifelong catechesis for adults. This is crucial because of the fundamental importance of catechesis in the life of the parish, as leadership and all adult members strive to pass on a knowledge of and appreciation for the Catholic faith. This is what Ss. Cosmas & Damian offers:

Pre-K/Kindergarten Faith Formation

Children ages 4 through Kindergarten discover and experience the wonders of God and God's love through stories, lessons, activities, songs, crafts and prayers. Through the weekly faith themes the children discover God's love and what it means to live a life of faith. Classes are held Sunday Mornings, September through May, 9:30-10:45. Pre-registration is required as class size is limited.

The primary right and responsibility for the religious education and spiritual formation of children is that of the parents (*Council of Vatican II*). In addition to intergenerational events and parental instruction of their children in the faith, all youth from grades 1-12, should be either participating in the parish Faith Formation program or attending a Catholic school. Faith Formation classes (*formally known as PSR*), meet weekly on either Saturday or Sunday mornings, from September through May.

As the primary teachers of the faith for their children (National Directory of Catechesis, p. 234) parents provide catechesis for their children in their home. The Diocese of Cleveland instructs that the parents meet regularly with their children for a systematic and comprehensive study of Catholic beliefs and traditions. A grade level text series chosen by the parish form the United States Catholic Conference of Bishop's approved listing of parish student texts is used to determine the curriculum and incorporation of instruction on Scripture and Tradition, liturgy and the liturgical year, creed, sacraments, commandments, moral life and prayer. Catechetical leaders support this model by providing orientation and training for parents. At prescribed intervals, parents meet with the Pastor and/or Catechetical leader to monitor the progress the family is making in catechizing their child/children. As parents continue to seek formation and growth in their personal faith and in their knowledge of Church doctrine and Scripture, the Office of Catechetical Services and this parish will offer programs and workshops in order to assist them. Families are strongly encouraged to attend the parish Generations of Faith sessions.

Youth Ministry, **F**aith **I**n **A**ction **T**eens, engages teens in their faith by helping them grow in their understanding of God, of themselves and their world, using catechesis, social and community-building events, retreats, field trips, service opportunities, prayer experiences and more. By learning and practicing discipleship, our young people become leaders themselves, helping to nourish the life of the parish and community through their faith and actions. This is open to students in grade 6-12.
