

SACRAMENTS

Baptisms can be performed *during* Masses, *after* the Saturday evening Mass, or *after* the 10:30 Mass on Sunday. Other times may be scheduled with the permission of a priest. For *the first child* baptized at Immaculate Conception Church, two classes are required and may be taken in any order. The first class is on the sacrament of Baptism and is offered the second Tuesday of the odd-numbered months (January, March, May, July, September, November). The second class, *Creating a Catholic Environment in Your Home*, must be taken for *every child* who is baptized at IC. This class is offered on the second Tuesday of even-numbered months (February, April, June, August, October, and December). Parents should call the parish office to sign up for the classes.

Wedding

The first step in planning a wedding is to contact a priest. Available dates may be checked on but the wedding can only be scheduled after approval by a priest and should be at least 6 months prior to the wedding. Any Catholic being married must be confirmed. A pre-marital assessment (*FOCCUS*) and a Pre-Cana class or Engaged Encounter must be taken. A parish wedding coordinator must be hired.

Funeral

Please contact the rectory at the time of a death. The funeral home will contact the rectory with the day and time of the funeral. Funeral luncheons are provided by a funeral ministry committee (meat provided by the family) and donations are accepted to cover the costs of paper goods, etc.

PARISH FINANCES 2021-2022

Immaculate Conception’s 2021-2022 annual parish budget is over \$3.4 million and employs 70 full-time and part-time school and parish employees paid bi-weekly.

As an alternative or in addition to tithing using the envelopes provided via the mail, below are a couple of additional easy ways to support our parish.

Online Giving

Visit our website which processes your gift through Abundant, our dedicated site for safe and secure transactions. You can donate using major credit and debit cards (or through ACH). Submit a one-time gift or donate on a recurring basis. Signing in with an account is not required. You can also choose to add the processing fee to your contribution, stretching your gift even further.

Don’t have a computer? **Give via Text** Just text “icangels” to 73256 and you’ll be sent a link to this page on our website.

This option delivers near \$127,500 from 66 families annually.

ACH Giving

By signing up for Electronic Contributions, you can ensure your gift is automatically covered without writing checks *and at no additional processing cost to you or the parish*. This type of contribution is also called an ACH transaction, which stands for Automated Clearing House.

SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD

The parish Catholic school board is an advisory board established to assist the pastor, school administrator/principal, parish council, and finance council in fostering the education mission, goals and objectives of the Catholic school. It helps formulate and recommend policy and is consultative to both the pastor and the school administrator/principal. The Immaculate Conception School Board consists of the pastor, principal, assistant principal, home & school association president, and six members elected from the home & school association and the parish council. It is a policy-forming body for the school, functioning in an advisory capacity. Meetings are held monthly.

A NOTE FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD: We are YOUR School Board. Help us to be effective. Let us know what you think! Keep the lines of communication open! Participate at monthly School Board meetings. All meetings are open.

HOME AND SCHOOL ASSOCIATION

The Home & School Association is a supporting organization of parents and teachers for Immaculate Conception School. Members work to raise funds for the improvement of the school and provide assistance in many needed ways.

As the parent of an Immaculate Conception student, you will be supported in your responsibilities through continuous and systematic communication from school to family. Likewise, your involvement in the Home and School Association is essential if our school community is to achieve its goals.

FACTS AND FIGURES

- To enter Kindergarten, a child must be 5 years of age before August 1.
- Children entering Kindergarten and those entering the school for the first time must have a complete physical exam. All students must have a current immunization record on file.
- Teacher to Student Ratio: 1:17

ENROLLMENT FEES 2021-2202:

Parishioners:

Registration Fee: \$50 per family (Fee to be paid by March 1st)
Enrollment Fee: \$525 for first child, \$475 for second child, \$315 for third child; no fee for fourth child

Technology/Security Fee: \$100 for first child, \$85 for second child, \$75 for third child; no fee for fourth child
In addition to the above fees, each family is asked to tithe 5% of their annual income to the parish.

Non-Parishioner:

Registration Fee:..... \$50 per family

- Tuition: \$473 per month (August through May) for each child plus the \$525 enrollment fee per child. Tuition is to be paid by the 10th of each month.
- Technology/Security Fee: \$100 for first child, \$85 for second child, \$75 for third child; no fee for fourth child.

Lunch Fee \$47 per month/child (\$423 yearly)

Preschool Tuition \$460 per month (September thru May)

Registration Fee	\$50
Misc/Activity Fee	\$25
Preschool Lunch Fee	\$32 per month (\$288 yearly)

Any student older than 7th grade desiring to be Confirmed will be prepared separately.

Middle School Youth Group

- Open to all **6th - 8th grade students** in parish and public schools.
- Meets monthly on the second Monday from 3:15-4:30 in Pleus Hall.
- Meetings include fun, food, prayer, and discussion.

IN THE DIOCESE

Camp Maccabee

- A fun week with the aim of helping **young men entering their freshman through senior years of high school** become leaders, the men God has called them to be.
- It is led by priests, seminarians and lay men.
- There are several weeks in June and July from which to choose.
- The week includes retreat activities learning about heroes and role models in the Catholic Church; learning to live lives of virtue; living a masculine spirituality; celebrating daily Mass and having opportunities for reconciliation.
- During the week there are a lot of fun-filled hours outdoors doing “manly things” such as rock climbing, going on a float trip and hiking in the woods.
- The cost is \$150.

Camp Sienna

- It is an exciting time for **young women entering their freshman through senior years of high school** to grow in feminine spirituality, becoming the women God has called them to be through the lives of heroic saints in the Church’s past.
- Takes place one week during July.
- It is led by religious sisters and lay women with the aim to help with Retreat activities that include Celebrating daily Mass and having opportunities for Reconciliation, free time and personal prayer time.
- There are lots of fun-filled hours doing “fun-filled hours of girl time” such as spending the day on a boat at the Lake of the Ozarks, swimming, tubing, and water skiing, cooking classes and philanthropy excursions.
- The cost is \$150.

CHRISTpower

- CHRISTpower is a weeklong service retreat that takes place in the Jefferson City area for young people who have completed **9th grade as a minimum, through 12th grade.**
- Takes place the second full week of July.
- The week-long experience is designed to make students more aware of the importance of service to those in our community as part of our Christian life and to help them discern the future God has planned for them.
- Helias Catholic High School is the host site for the retreat. The high school facilities are used for showers and overnight accommodations.
- During the day, teens work at various service sites in the Jefferson City area.
- The evenings allow time for discussion of daily experiences and focus on the week's theme.
- The cost is \$150.

National Catholic Youth Conference

- The National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) is an exciting, biennial three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for **Catholic teenagers** and their adult chaperones.
- The schedule includes general sessions and workshops addressing a wide variety of topics as well as opportunities for reconciliation, daily liturgy, and special activities such as concerts, a dance, and comedy club.
- The thematic park is a unique venue incorporating traditional exhibits with interactive educational and recreational activities.

Teens Encounter Christ

- A Teens Encounter Christ (TEC) is an exciting retreat weekend in which **young adults** meet other young Christians from the Jefferson City diocese. It is for the young and not-so-young to gather together. The majority of participants are candidates (high school and college-aged young adults), but observers (those older than college age) lend a wonderful perspective to the weekend.
- It is a three-day retreat that provides an experience in Christian living. There is time for reflection as well as time to share feelings and thoughts with others in a non-judgmental atmosphere.
- TEC week-ends are typically held in January, February, and July. They occur over the Martin Luther King holiday in January and the President's Day holiday in February so students do not have to miss school.
