





Our History

Originally part of St. Dominic Parish as a "Worship Center," St. Francis was created to accommodate ongoing growth and new boundaries in the Bolingbrook community. It was decided that the new parish would be named after St. Francis of Assisi, a close friend and contemporary of St. Dominic.

St. Francis of Assisi Parish of Bolingbrook was established by the Most Reverend Joseph L. Imesch on July 1, 1980. Reverend James Dougherty was assigned to be the founding Pastor.

At that time there were approximately 312 registered families and 1,000 children from grades K-12 in the Religious Education Program. The site of the original church was at Whitewater Drive and Boughton Road, which is now St. Francis Park and a Walgreens store.

The church interior was designed so the structure could be used as a parish center as well as a house of worship. Consequently, there were no permanent pews installed. Parishioners sat on folding chairs during Mass and devotions. Both sides of the church could be partitioned off to form smaller rooms. The rooms were utilized for the Religious Education Program, Nursery and Parish meetings.

Over the years, our Faith Community has come together to plan a number of social events. Our members have enjoyed themselves at events such as the St. Francis of Assisi Corn Roast, Spaghetti Dinners, Pancake Breakfasts, Bingo, St. Francis Fest, the annual Easter Egg Hunt, Flea Market and various dances.

The church facility served the parish well for 26 years. However, due to the growth of the parish and community it became clear that a larger church with classroom/meeting facilities was needed. By October 2004, plans from the architectural firm of Healy, Snyder, Bender & Associates, Inc. were chosen. With the sale of the first church and the new building fundraising campaign, the necessary funds were collected.

Groundbreaking was celebrated with the Most Reverend Roger L. Kaffer on September 19, 2004. Construction began in February 2005. The new church building was finished in time for the Mass of Dedication on March 11, 2006 with the Most Reverend Joseph L. Imesch and Reverend David J. Hankus, Pastor. A number of community dignitaries, including Mayor Roger C. Claar, Deputy Mayor Leroy Brown and Village Trustees attended, along with many of the Parish's former Pastors, Parochial Vicars, Permanent Deacons and founding families. As of 2020, the parishioners of St. Francis will celebrate 40 Years as a Parish Family in Bolingbrook! Saints Francis and Clare of Assisi, pray for us!

General Information

Parish Registration

There are multiple ways you may register with the Parish. Registration Forms are available in the Narthex pamphlet rack. You can stop in the Parish Office (Monday through Friday) to fill out a registration form or call us and we will mail one out to you. Finally, if you prefer, you can also register online at the parish website: stfrancisbb.org. Once you are registered, you will receive your offering envelopes as well as relevant information from the Parish and the Diocese. For your convenience, you may also join the Parish Online Giving Program (OLG). Registration for OLG is also available through the parish website.

Mass for Shut-Ins

St. Francis of Assisi televised Mass can be seen on Sundays at 1:00 pm on Comcast Channel 6 (BCT) and on AT&T U-Verse Channel 99. The service is re-aired every Wednesday at noon. (Please note that the Mass shown is from the previous weekend.)

Sacraments

Baptism

Infant Baptisms for registered parishioners' children under the age of 7 typically occur every Sunday of the month at 1:30 pm. Baptisms for infants are not scheduled on certain days, such as: Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday, Mother's Day or Father's Day. If you have not yet registered as a parishioner, you may do so at the required Pre-Baptism meeting.

There can be at most two Godparents. It is possible, however, to have your baby baptized with one Godparent. This Godparent may be either a man or a woman. Typically there are two Godparents; one man and one woman. At least one of the Godparents must be at least 16 years old, and have received all the Sacraments of Initiation, including Confirmation.

A required Pre-Baptism meeting for the parents is held on the first Saturday of each month (some exceptions are noted on the parish calendar) at 10:30 am. No registration is required for the meeting. If it has been less than two years since you last attended a Pre-Baptism meeting, you do not need to attend another one. You will need to call the Parish Office and let us know when you attended your last PB meeting.

During the meeting, you will fill out a Baptism Registration Form. On this form, you will request your baptismal date. Please remember that a maximum of six infants are scheduled on a given day, so you may not be able to have your first choice. In order to avoid disappointment and unnecessary expense, please do not schedule parties, reception halls, airline tickets, etc. until your date has been confirmed with the Parish Office.

Marriage

Couples should contact Fr. Herb Essig at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date to make arrangements and explore guidelines.

Anointing of the Sick

Please contact Fr. Herb or Fr. Pat if you or a family member needs to be anointed due to serious illness or a hospital procedure.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA is a community of faith in Jesus Christ that journeys together toward a sharing of the gifts of faith, hope and love. RCIA program participants meet year-round to prepare adults who would like to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church through Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation.

Teen Sacramental Preparation

Typically, by the time a teenager reaches high school, he or she has already received the four Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Reconciliation, Communion and Confirmation). Situations can interfere with the "typical" progression of a teen through a religious education program. This is a two-year program that will prepare a teen interested in receiving any of the four abovementioned Sacraments.

The Religious Education Program is for students in Grades 1 through 8. We instruct the children in the Catholic faith and being disciples of Jesus. We prepare students to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. Students who are 7 years or older who have not been baptized can also receive instruction and preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation.

Students are required to have two consecutive years of religious education before receiving a sacrament. There are parent meetings for those students receiving the sacraments with a home component to be worked on by parents and students.

Classes are held on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Saturdays. St. Francis of Assisi has almost 700 students in the program, with 60-70 volunteers. The programs used are: the We Believe series from Sadlier for Grades 1 through 6 and Be My Disciples from RCL Benziger for Grades 7 and 8. Volunteers are needed as Catechists and Aides. They must be Baptized and Confirmed Roman Catholic.
