## Ethics and Integrity in Ministry (EIM) Training

Together we are Fulfilling our Commitment to Heal and Protect.

EIM compliance is required of all clergy, religious, seminarians, diocesan employees, parish and Catholic school employees, and adult lay persons who volunteer in ministry with minors or vulnerable adults; or in any ministry, program or organization that serves youth or vulnerable adults in any manner, or functions at a time and place where they are typically present.

- · The EIM application is submitted one-time only.
- The background check is rerun at least every three years during active ministry within the diocese.
- EIM workshop attendance is required at least every three years. If no workshop attendance is completed, the applicant is non-compliant and no longer eligible to serve in ministry requiring EIM compliance.

Parishioners are asked to go online to register and submit an EIM application with the Diocese of Austin. Individuals with no access to the Internet should contact the Parish Office for assistance. Individuals who need to confirm if they have completed and EIM application; check on the status of their application; create a first time application; or verify compliance or update information are to visit the Diocese of Austin website - <a href="https://austindiocese.org/eim-application">https://austindiocese.org/eim-application</a>

## Ministry Descriptions

The St. Luke community provides many services and ministries to help you and your family grow in your faith. Generally, you may sign up for ministries at any time during the year by completing a Ministry Sign-up Form and submitting it to the Parish Office or online at the parish web site - <a href="http://slparish.org/ministry-stewards-sign-up-form">http://slparish.org/ministry-stewards-sign-up-form</a>.

## Liturgical Ministries

#### Altar Care

- Contributing to the cleanliness and dignity of the parish worship space, volunteers are responsible for cleaning, dusting, straightening and refilling holy water within specific areas of the church, such as the sacristy, chapel, family room, narthex, confessional and sanctuary.
- · Volunteers are scheduled to work individually or in pairs to serve once a week for one month of the year.

#### Altar Servers

- Altar Servers assist the Presider during the liturgy.
- This ministry is open to both male and female, adults and children (4th grade +) who have received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and First Communion.
- Servers are scheduled 1-2 times monthly, according to the Mass times preferred.

#### Art & Environment

- · Responsible for decorating the worship space to enhance the church's liturgical seasons.
- The time commitment is dictated by the changes in the liturgical seasons.

#### Columbarium

- The Columbarium serves as a final resting place for registered members of St. Luke, according to policy.
- Immediate family members may be inurned in the same niche regardless of their religion.
- Currently there are 96 double niches with the urns included in the price of the niche. The cost of the engraving is separate and can be paid in advance.
- Reservation of a niche is possible by meeting with a committee member, completing the registration forms
  and fulfilling the financial cost of either a single or double niche.

#### Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs)

- These ministers assist the Presider in the distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ during liturgies, as well
  as to parishioners who are homebound, hospitalized or residing in nursing homes.
- All EMHCs must have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation) and have no impediments to receive Eucharist.

#### Host Ministry (Greeters & Ushers)

- Members of this vital ministry strive to serve and greet all who enter St. Luke with a friendly smile, warm
  welcome and a great attitude as they offer seating assistance and help parishioners in need to the best of their
  ability.
- They also collect offerings, direct the procession of those receiving Communion, distribute bulletins at the
  conclusion of Mass, and assist in straightening the Church following the service.
- Training is scheduled in conjunction with meetings, which are held twice yearly. Training is also available
  as needed.

#### Lector Ministry

- Members of this ministry, proclaim God's Word from the Ambo by serving at the liturgy.
- Ongoing education & support is offered throughout the year, with one major training session each year followed by Commissioning.

### Liturgical Ministries - Continued

#### Music Ministry

- The Music Ministry strives to encourage deeper prayer and participation in the Liturgy throughout the year by singing, playing and joyously leading the congregation in song during Mass.
- Rehearsals are held every Tuesday and Thursday, 6:00 p.m. 7:00 p.m. for the choir members, and 1 hour before each Mass. Rehearsal for instrumentalists are held every Tuesday, 7:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m. Additional rehearsals are scheduled on an "as needed" basis, depending on the liturgical season.
- There are numerous areas in this ministry that one may choose to become involved in:
  - ♦ Cantors to lead the choir & congregation. Training is provided.
  - ♦ Instrumentalists Piano, Guitar, Oboe, Flute, etc....ALL instruments are welcome!
  - Special Choirs for those who wish to only sing 1-2 times yearly, such as The Christmas Mass Choirs, and the Triduum/Easter Choirs.

#### Sacristan Ministry

- Before each Mass, the mission of a Sacristan is to set up the sacred vessels. Following Mass, the Sacristan
  moves the vessels to the sacristy. The priest or deacon will purify the sacred vessels (ciborium, chalice, cups,
  carafe and cruet), which contain the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ.
- Sacristans (1-2 per Mass) may be scheduled once monthly at the liturgy they normally attend; however, members are welcome to serve anytime they are available.
- Training is provided.

## Sacramental Preparation Ministries

#### Adult Confirmation

- Adult Confirmation preparation is designed to support Catholic adults who have been baptized and have received Communion in preparing for the anointing of the Holy Spirit received in Confirmation.
- Catechists guide the group in learning the teachings of the Church and fully living the Catholic faith.

#### Baptism

- The Baptism Preparation Ministry educates parents and godparents about the meaning of the Sacrament of Baptism and helps them to reflect on their responsibility to support the baptized child in fully living the gifts received in Baptism. They are required to attend a class prior to scheduling the baptism.
- When seeking Baptism, contact the Parish Office.

#### Confirmation for Youth

- The goal of Confirmation preparation at St. Luke is to lead the candidate toward a more intimate union with Christ and a more lively familiarity with the Holy Spirit.
- Students are eligible for Confirmation if they are in 10th grade or older, their families are registered in the
  parish, and they are enrolled in a weekly religious education program, like Keysis or Holy Trinity Catholic
  High School.
- Students must also fulfill their attendance requirement for the previous year. Confirmation details along with
  registration forms may be found on the Keysis website: <a href="https://www.keysisym.org">www.keysisym.org</a>.


#### First Reconciliation/First Holy Communion for Children

- The Religious Education Program prepares children in the 2nd grade to receive their Sacrament of Reconciliation and Sacrament of First Holy Communion. It is necessary that students are registered in the Religious Education Program.
- Catechists begin preparing students when the new school year begins.

#### Rite of Christian Initiation for Children-Youth

- RCIC is for children over the age of 7 who have not been baptized or have received any religious education.
- This class will educate the youth of the Catholic faith in order to help them understand the Bible and begin
  applying the Sacred Scripture to their daily life.
- The children will receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil.
- The classes meet on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. in the Religious Education Building.





## Sacramental Preparation Ministries - Continued

#### Symbolon RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)

- Symbolon RCIA is for non-Catholics who are interested in the Catholic faith and think they might like to become Catholic.
- This class helps catechumens and candidates discover what it means to believe in and live the Catholic Faith
  as well as helping catechumens more deeply understand the Sacred Scriptures and begin applying them to
  their daily life.
- RCIA meets on Thursday evenings from 7:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m.in the Parish Hall.

## Catechetical Formation Ministries

#### Keysis Youth Ministry

- Keysis is our high school youth ministry program for grades 9th through 12th, designed to strengthen and
  encourage young people and their families in their life with Jesus and His Church.
- Keysis is held in the Upper Room on Sundays, immediately following the 5:00 p.m. Mass. At every Keysis, young people will enjoy food, fellowship, games, music, a talk, and small group discussion. Each session is designed with the goal of forming intentional disciples, and drawing young people into a relationship with Christ and His church.
- Adult leaders are integral in the success of the Keysis Ministry and are encouraged to participate. Please
  contact the Youth Minister to learn more about how to be involved in this vital ministry.

#### EKO (Early Keysis Outreach) Youth Ministry

- EKO is our middle school youth ministry for all 6th through 8th graders, designed to lead young people and their families into community, and to a closer relationship with Christ.
- EKO meets on Wednesday nights and /or Sunday mornings and focuses on fellowship, service, social activities and participation in the sacraments.
- Volunteers interested in being involved in this dynamic ministry, as a catechist or chaperone, please contact

#### Elementary Faith Formation

- This faith formation ministry is for all Pre-K through 5th graders, with the focus on Jesus, the teaching of prayers, Scripture, the Church, service and much more.
- This is accomplished through fun, interactive hands-on sessions designed to awaken the faith in our young people and to introduce them to an abundant life with Christ.
- Children have an opportunity to meet on Sunday mornings or on Wednesday evenings, in the Religious Education Building.
- St. Luke welcomes all adults who are interested in serving as catechists and helpers with our faith formation ministry.

#### Vacation Bible School (VBS)

- Vacation Bible School is a fun, faith-filled program that is held during one week of the summer, 9:00 a.m. –
  12:00 noon. VBS is designed for preschool (age 4) thru 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Volunteer and service opportunities are for 6<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grade students.
- Interested adult volunteers are asked to contact the EFF Coordinator, Jordanna Richesin, to assist with the scheduling, organization and implementation of a successful VBS program.

### Catechetical Formation Ministries - Continued

#### Continuing Adult Faith Formation & Evangelization (CAFFE)

- CAFFE offers a variety of dynamic adult faith formation programs that foster and promote a lifelong understanding of Catholicism, oriented toward embracing a full, vibrant and active faith.
- The St Luke CAFFE Team helps individuals to respond generously to this call to grow in faith with scripture studies, lessons on doctrine, book and movie discussions, guest speakers on a variety of spiritual and theological subjects, and resources for small faith groups.
- CAFFE welcomes new members who desire to help plan, organize and implement programs that nurture the heart and mind of adult Catholics. Continuing education for adults focuses on enhancing the understanding of the timeless teachings of the Church where various formats will be employed, including DVD series, guest speakers and discussions.
- The St. Luke website has a current listing of what classes are available. For more information about the CAFFE programs and/or to register for the classes email the CAFFE Team at caffe@slparish.org. Classes are offered between Masses on Sunday, Wednesday evening while the children are in class, and most every day of the week.
- St. Luke Parish has subscribed to FORMED, an online Catholic Bookstore, full of materials for adults, children, small faith groups, and families.

#### Men's Bible Study

#### Friday Scripture Study

- Parishioners are invited to join this informal group to discuss the upcoming Sunday readings. The focus of the group is to read and analyze the Scriptures and how to apply them to daily, personal and community
- The scripture study group meets every Friday, 9:30 a.m.-10:45 a.m. in the Upper Room of the Pastoral Center building.

#### Children's Liturgy

- Parents of young children are offered an opportunity to participate more fully in the Liturgy while also providing young children an opportunity to participate in a way that is developmentally appropriate and spiritually significant (this is not babysitting!)
- Children ages 2-5 and adult caregivers participate in the Liturgy of the Word using the Children's Lectionary, a symbol to remind us of what we're reading about, discussion of the readings, and coloring pictures of the symbol to be offered during the offertory.

  We leave at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Word and return during the Offertory at 11:00 Mass on
- Sundays.
- Adult volunteers are needed to help deliver the scripture message and help the young children to better understand what God is calling them to do.

#### Outreach Ministries

#### ACTS (Adoration, Community, Theology, and Service)

- ACTS is an international mission founded in a parish near San Antonio. Women and men are introduced
  to ACTS through a Spirit filled weekend retreat where adoration, community, theology and service are
  experienced by the retreatants. The events are inspired by the Holy Spirit.
- St. Luke ACTS Core Team is the governing body of St. Luke ACTS. They are responsible for the decisions governing the ACTS Ministry within the parish, in keeping with the directives, guidelines and provisions of the Charter and of ACTS Missions.
- Core meetings are held on the 3rd Monday of the Month at 6:30 pm in the Holy Family Room in the Parish Hall and are open to the St. Luke Parish community. Your concerns may be made a part of the agenda by contacting the Facilitator.

#### Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to Hospital/Homebound

- Members of this ministry bring the Eucharist to those who are unable to attend Mass due to illness, injury
  or who are in nursing homes or retirement communities. This ministry is provided immediately following
  the Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass. Ministers are generally scheduled one Sunday each month.
- All Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC's) must have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation) and have no impediments to receive the holy Eucharist.
- One major training session (scheduled in the Fall and Spring, or as needed) is required.

#### Family Promise

- St. Luke parishioners involved in this ministry host families at our parish approximately every eight
  weeks. These families are in need of a place to stay and meals (which we provide) while the adults look
  for employment.
- Ministry opportunities include assisting as meal hosts, evening hosts, overnight hosts or as drivers.

#### Kairos Prison Ministry

- The people of Kairos are called by God to share the love of Christ with those impacted by incarceration
  where they address the spiritual needs of inmates as well as their families and those who work in the prison environment.
- Kairos sprang from the Cursillo movement and is supported by Christian volunteers including those from Cursillo and those other movements that consider Cursillo as their root.

#### Prison Ministry

- The mission of this ministry is to make a difference in the lives of inmates by sharing their faith and showing compassion and love as instruments of God's love and forgiveness.
- Members of this ministry meet with a consistent small group and facilitate a Bible study using the Catholic Bible, and then facilitate discussions on how the Scriptures apply to everyday life situations.
- A volunteer's application must be submitted to the Texas Department of Corrections: a criminal background check is completed by the TDC. Attendance at a 3-hour training course with the TDC is mandatory prior to beginning this ministry. These sessions are held throughout the state.

#### Sanctity of Life

- This ministry is committed to the preservation of human life and the human spirit through prayer, education and raising awareness on respect life issues, material and spiritual support, advocacy through community and legislative action that promotes respect life and programs regarding all life issues from conception to natural death.
- Programs and activities are offered in the following four areas: Pastoral, Spiritual, Educational, and Public Policy.
- The Committee of Pro Life Activities includes volunteers and "angels" for the Gabriel Project who devote
  many hours a month to training, counseling, and good Samaritan efforts for women in crisis pregnancies.
- Parishioners who can only offer a few hours per month to promote a greater awareness among all about life issues. There is a suggested diocesan calendar of events that includes activities every few months and St Luke Parish tries to promote all the suggested efforts.

#### Outreach Ministries - Continued

#### St. Vincent De Paul

- St. Vincent de Paul of Greater Temple, Inc. is a registered non-profit corporation that is dedicated to assisting the needy within our community in many different ways by providing assistance to needy men, women and families, regardless of race, creed, country of origin or age. Assistance takes the form of food, clothing, and referral services.
- The St. Vincent Thrift Store (106 West Avenue D, Temple, TX) which provides a source of affordable clothing, appliances, furniture and other items, as well as office space, storage buildings and a classroom accommodating 25-30 people. Store hours are Mon.-Fri., 9:00 a.m.-3:300 p.m.
- Ministry opportunities include sorting, displaying clothing, furniture and appliances; unloading food items and packing grocery bags; aiding in food distribution to clients; sweeping, mopping, maintenance and minor repairs to the facilities.

## Small Faith Groups (SFG)

- The main emphasis of a small faith group is to enhance awareness and improve one's spiritual life.
- A SFG is not a scripture study, adult religious study or a fellowship group. It is small group that consists of 6-10 people, and is faith-based.
- New groups may take a while to strongly form and become fruitful; however, it all depends on the commitment, sincerity, faithfulness and the amount of involvement of its members. Groups become fully formed once they have had the time to get to know one another and to share their life experiences.
- Small faith groups are not an alternative to going to church or prayer. Rather, they are meant to enhance a person's church and worship experience, personal and prayer life.

  The time and place of meetings will depend on the mutual agreement of group members. Ideally, groups
- meet at least once or twice monthly.
- If interested in learning more or becoming a part of a small faith group, please contact one of the coordina-
- The SFG Coordinator will assist in getting started in a small faith group, and will provide valuable insight and ideas of materials to use to help new members of groups become comfortable with one another in the early stages of formation.

#### Prayer Ministries

#### Prayer Blanket Ministry

- The Prayer Blanket Ministry began at St. Luke in 2004 and symbolizes a faith sharing community's covering of prayer for the individual who receives one of the lap-size blankets.
- Blankets are handmade by volunteers in this ministry and are blessed by parish clergy. A blanket is given to people who are either sick or going through a difficult time in their life, along with a message of commitment that the ministry members will be lifting the recipient up in prayer each week.
- This ministry is supported by the generosity of the many people in the St. Luke community.
- Members in this ministry may be involved in one or more ways: (1) Cutting and/or sewing the fabric.; (2) Washing, ironing, folding and tagging the blankets; (3) Delivering the blankets.

#### Prayer Chain

- This ministry provides an opportunity to reach out to others who are suffering or have any spiritual or worldly requests, or need of prayer.
- When a call for prayer is requested the prayer chain is activated immediately. The prayers begin and are lifted up to God as the members of this ministry immediately intercede for these individuals with prayers for his/her special intention(s) with the hope of giving them strength in body, courage in spirit and patience in
- Training is not required other than the commitment to be faithful in daily prayer.

#### Rosary Ministry

- The Rosary is prayed each day at St. Luke, prior to Masses. Everyone is encouraged to participate in this beautiful and special devotion.
- Volunteers who are interested in leading the Rosary before Masses may contact the coordinators.

#### Mission Ministries

#### Honduras Mission

- Members of the Hospitality ministry strive to provide a welcoming and caring atmosphere for all parishioners and visitors to St. Luke, as well as supporting other ministries when additional help is needed at gatherings/parish functions.
- This ministry reaches out to our visitors and parishioners and hosts a quarterly "Newcomer's Social" for new members.
- Training is not required, however a friendly and welcoming nature is a plus.
- The Hospitality ministry meets the first Thursday of each month (Sept.—May) at 6:00 p.m. in the Holy Family Room of the Parish Hall.

#### Library

- The Parish Library (open every day) is available to parishioners to relax, read or check out a book, video or
  great movie. The Library is located in the far left corner of the Parish Hall.
- Donations of quality books and movies along with monetary donations are greatly appreciated and used to improve and enhance our area.

## Fellowship Ministries

#### Blessed Women

- Women of St. Luke as well as women throughout the community are invited to attend this spiritually enlightened gathering where participants share in prayer, music, food and fellowship.
- The Blessed Women gatherings are held the fourth Saturday of each month beginning at 8:00 a.m. in The Holy Family Room in the Parish Hall.

#### Catholic Singles

- This ministry facilitates individual and communal spiritual growth while also providing a forum in which
  friendships can flourish in a Catholic/Christian environment all while enjoying the fellowship of other single Catholics and non-Catholic friends.
- Members of Catholic Singles are 30 years of age and older who have never married, were previously married or are widowed.
- Monthly events are posted on the parish website as well as the church bulletin.

#### Fellowship Café & Outreach

- This ministry serves members of our parish by providing breakfast and a place for community fellowship
  after the Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass in an atmosphere that encourages the development of new friendships
  and the solidification of old friendships.
- Each month, the ministry also provides a hot breakfast and a sack lunch for the Feed My Sheep program
  that feeds the homeless in Temple.
- Members usually serve 2-3 hours per month, with members needed each week for the breakfasts and members needed for the Feed My Sheep meals.

#### Knights of Columbus—Council #7197

- Knights of Columbus Council #7197 was established November 13, 1978, to serve the St. Luke parish
  community and its families through charitable works. The KC's give aide financially and physically to
  Catholic education, to support the Office of Pro Life and Our Lady Of Angels Maternity Shelter, in addition to supporting diocesan seminarians and several other worthwhile causes, including the annual "Jack
  Skyles Christmas Presence".
- The St. Luke KC's are actively involved in supporting (and sometimes 'hosting') many events at St. Luke, which include: (1) The Annual basketball Free Throw Competition; (2) Easter Egg Hung; (3) Swim/Cookout Appreciate Party to honor alter servers with the entire parish invited to attend; (4) Soup Suppers; and the Friday Fish Fry which is hosted and prepared every Friday during Lent, including many Fridays
- A Knight may contribute as much or as little time as desired but is encouraged to be an active member through attendance of meetings and volunteering for the council's projects.
- A KC candidate must be a Catholic gentleman in good standing with the Catholic Church and be at least 18 years old. He will be exemplified as a 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Knight and then will have the opportunity to get his 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> degrees.
- The KC's meet on the 1st Tuesday of the month beginning with a fellowship meal at 6:00 p.m., followed
  by praying of the Rosary at 7:00 p.m. and the general meeting. The gathering is held in the Holy Family
  Room in the Parish Hall on the 1st Tuesday of each month.

## Fellowship Ministries - Continued

#### Men's Group

- All men of the parish are invited to attend the Men's Group for a meal and fellowship in the parish hall.
- The Men's Group provides a meal three to four times throughout the year.

#### Mom's Group

- All mom<sup>5</sup>s with young children are encouraged to join this group for prayer, food, and fellowship on the second Saturday of the month at 10 a.m.
- The women meet in the RE Building monthly while the children spend time with each other.

#### Roncalli

- Roncalli is a gathering of women from our parish who meet once a month, at a member's home, to enjoy
  a light brunch, share in fellowship and gain knowledge through guest speakers or programs they have arranged. Also referred to as a type of "study club", this ministry has been active at St. Luke for 40 years.
- Roncalli gathers the first Wednesday of every month during the months of September thru May.

#### Separated & Divorced

- This ministry offers support to separated and divorced persons of all faiths by sharing experiences, feelings and special problems in order to bring each other to the road of healing.
- Programs include "Divorced and Beyond" and "Catholic Divorce Survival Guide," led by trained facilitators. Study guides encourage discussions regarding the emotions of anger, self-image, guilt, loneliness, and forgiveness.
- Participants will be notified of the dates, time and meeting room.

#### Women's Society

- The Women's Society of St. Luke work in conjunction with other parish organizations and ministries to
  create unity and strength by providing for the needs of the Church, it's parishioners and the community by
  involving themselves in a variety of activities which foster fellowship, spirituality and charitable service.
- This ministry is actively involved in several areas: (1) Sewing Baptismal Garments; (2) Clerical Endowment Cards; (3) Bereavement meals; (4) Participants in Church Women of Temple and the Austin Diocese Council of Catholic Women; (5) Offering assistance at all parish events and ministries needing additional help; and, (6) The annual Arts & Crafts Show held the first Saturday in November.
