## Council of Ministries

The Sacred Heart Council of Ministers is made up of representatives from the five Commissions: **Administrative, Community Life, Social Outreach, Spiritual Life & Worship** which provide ministry opportunities in the parish. These representatives coordinate the activity of the various commissions and meet monthly to provide input to the pastor on parish vision and goals. Their mission is to evaluate and modify the goals and objectives of the parish and provide advice to the Pastor on various issues. Two people from each Commission, along with the Pastor, School Principal, and a representative of the parish staff, make up the Council of Ministries. 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## **Administrative Commission**

### **ARCHIVES**

Catalogs and conserves documents, photographs, and other items that tell the story of our parish.

### **FACILITIES MANAGEMENT**

Volunteers appointed by the Pastor, who have experience in facilities management and meet monthly to ensure all Sacred Heart buildings are maintained in the best possible manner. They provide expertise to the staff and monitor contractors to assure compliance with good management practices and provide the Parish with the optimum professional services that are competitively bid with no partiality or discrimination.

### **FINANCE—PARISH**

A consultative group of parishioners appointed by the Pastor to be good stewards of all financial resources entrusted to our parish. The Board recognizes the confidence and trust placed in them and vow to prudently utilize all financial gifts for the good of Christ and our beloved parish. By preparing and operating within an annual budget, monitoring monthly expenditures, planning for capital projects and initiating any necessary capital campaigns, the board strives to ensure the success of Sacred Heart Parish.

### **FINANCE—SCHOOL**

A consultative group of school parents appointed by the Pastor who provide advice to the Pastor, Principal, and School Advisory Board regarding all major financial decisions relating to the school. All recommendations are made with the goal of balancing a fair cost for a quality Catholic education with a fair wage for school employees.

## **Administrative Commission**

### **LANDSCAPE TEAM**

Plans and implements the landscape for all parish buildings, including semi-annual plantings and planning of future projects. Commitment involves a few organized work days in the spring and fall but volunteers may also “adopt” a bed or portion of the grounds and work at their convenience.

### **OFFICE VOLUNTEERS**

Provides office assistance to the parish staff, such as answering the phone, data entry, stuffing envelopes, etc. Volunteers contacted as needed. Adults and older teens are welcome.

### **OFFERTORY COUNTERS**

Tabulators sort, count, and prepare deposits. Involves about two hours at an assigned time on a rotating basis.

### **STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE**

Members plan and coordinate the timing, vision, and programs of the three phases of stewardship: Stewardship of Ministry, Stewardship of Offering, and Stewardship of Prayer.

### **WELCOME COMMITTEE**

Members provide hospitality to new parishioners with phone calls, cards, visits, etc. Volunteers offer to visit with new families and bring a welcome packet and answer questions about Sacred Heart Parish. Commitment involves about one hour per month on a rotating basis.

## Community Life Commission

### **BAKING TEAM**

Members prepare baked items for parish events such as receptions and welcoming new parishioners. Members participate on a rotating basis as needed for events.

### **BOY SCOUTS**

Boys, in grades first through twelfth, and adult volunteers\* who desire to be a part of the Boy Scouts of America organization. The purpose of scouting is “to promote, through cooperation with other agencies, the ability of youth to do things for themselves and others, and to teach youth patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues.”

### **GIRL SCOUTS**

Girls, in grades kindergarten through twelfth, and adult volunteers\* who desire to be a part of the Audubon Girl Scout Council, a member of Girl Scouts of the USA. The mission statement of the Girl Scouts is “To inspire girls with the highest ideals of character, conduct, patriotism, and service that they may become happy and resourceful citizens.”

### **HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE**

Members prepare for fellowship events throughout the year. They help with planning, decorating, providing refreshments, serving, and clean-up. Sometimes this committee is asked to help with socials for other ministries. Commitment involves 4-5 hours, two or three times per year.

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## **Community Life Commission**

### **SACRED HEART OF JESUS SCHOOL (SHS)**

Sacred Heart is a community of faith that shares in the teaching mission of Christ as proclaimed by the Catholic Church. Its primary purpose is to create an environment permeated with the Gospel spirit of love and freedom. Sacred Heart School provides a holistic approach to the development of each child's potential for Pre-K through 8th grades. The prominence of a religious atmosphere provides for the development of faith that is living, conscious, and active.

### **SHS—SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD**

A consultative group serving with the Pastor and Principal for the good of the school community. Board Members cannot act apart from the Pastor and/or the Principal and cannot make decisions which are binding on Sacred Heart School without the approval of the Pastor and the Principal. The Advisory Board meets monthly during the school year and has several committees which assist the administration and school in areas such as finance, planning, policy development and formulation, communication, and health and wellness. Board Members meet monthly during the school year, serve a three-year term, and are elected by school families.

### **SHS—HOME & SCHOOL ASSOCIATION**

A parent organization whose primary mission is to work with the teachers and administration to make SHS the best school it can be for our children. We strive to foster communication, provide information, and promote goodwill and cooperation between and among parents, faculty and administration. Home & School is responsible for several fund raisers which benefit the school. Members are invited to participate in these events as well as serve on committees including cafeteria volunteers, hospitality, and teacher appreciation week.

### **SHS—MEN'S CLUB**

Parishioners and school fathers who sponsor various socials, fundraisers, and service projects for the church and school. Members meet monthly and plan one service project per quarter. Dues are required. Visit our website to learn more: [SacredHeartMensClub.org](http://SacredHeartMensClub.org).

## Community Life Commission

### **YOUTH GROUP ADULT PLANNING TEAM**

Adult volunteers\* who plan and implement the program and events for the High School and Junior High Youth Groups.

### **YOUTH GROUP—HIGH SCHOOL**

Ninth through twelfth graders who meet regularly for fellowship, spiritual growth, service, and fun under the leadership of adult volunteers\*. Activities include youth nights, service projects, retreats, assisting with the junior high youth group, and more.

### **YOUTH GROUP—JUNIOR HIGH**

Sixth, seventh, and eighth graders who meet regularly for fellowship, faith-sharing, service, and fun under the leadership of adult volunteers\*. Activities include retreats, service projects, helping with the parish Easter egg hunt and Halloween carnival.

## Social Outreach Commission

**ADVENT GIVING TREE** Members design & create a Christmas tree decorated with names of needy individuals who would benefit from gifts at Christmas. Gifts are collected and distributed by the committee.

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

This newly created ministry is recruiting volunteers to become more involved in our local community. Suggestions about how Sacred Heart Parish can benefit our local neighborhoods are welcome.

### **DISASTER RELIEF**

Volunteers help with planning, preparation, and education for times of disaster and the aftermath of disasters, such as hurricanes, floods, chemical spills, etc.

## **Social Outreach Commission**

### **FOOD PANTRY**

Teams of volunteers shelve donated food and pack bags of food for distribution into the surrounding community. Volunteers must be able to lift 10 to 15 pounds. Volunteers also help load the SVdP team member vehicles with the packed bags of food for distribution every other Saturday morning.

### **HOSPITAL VISITATION**

Ministers visit and pray with parishioners who are hospitalized at Our Lady of the Lake Medical Center and Baton Rouge General Hospital. Minimum age is 18. Commitment involves one hour per week on a rotating basis according to a schedule issued semi-annually.

### **KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**

A national Catholic fraternal organization for men 18 and older, dedicated to promoting the virtues of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Msgr. Dominic Blasco Council #3298 members are involved in service projects and other activities, such as vocations, youth camp, handicapped citizens, etc. They sponsor the monthly Coffee & Doughnuts Social for the parish. Commitment involves monthly meetings in the Parish Hall and quarterly Mass. Dues are required.

### **NURSING HOME VISITATION**

Volunteers help with monthly Masses at local nursing homes by setting up for Mass, reading, and administering Holy Communion.

### **ST. VINCENT de PAUL SOCIETY, SACRED HEART CONFERENCE (SVdP)**

Members meet every other Wednesday and provide emergency assistance to the needy in our area. These volunteers maintain our Food Pantry and engage in other forms of outreach to the poor. Help is needed in several areas including taking calls from people requesting assistance and visiting in teams of two to interview the families in their home to determine their needs. Minimum age is 16.

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## **Spiritual Life Commission**

### **BAPTISMAL PREPARATION**

Members assist with Baptismal Seminars and Baptisms scheduled every other month. Training is provided.

### **PRAYER LINE**

Members spend time praying daily for special intentions. Involvement requires members to call two or three other members to relay requests for prayer. All calls are done from their own home.

### **PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION (PSR)**

Teachers and volunteers\* provide religious education during one week in the summer for non-parochial school students in first through tenth grade. Training is provided for various tasks, such as teaching, copying materials, speaking to classes, etc. Teachers must be 18 or older and confirmed Catholics.

### **RCIA CATECHUMENATE SPONSORS**

Sponsors serve as a friend and guide to those preparing for membership in the Church through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Sponsors commit themselves to accompany one Catechumen (candidate) throughout his/her journey and to attend Sunday morning sessions from 9:00-12:00, including Mass. Formation is provided. Must be a confirmed adult Catholic.

### **RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE**

Members strive to raise the consciousness of the parish on life issues that impact the Christian community. Through prayer, education and political action, the committee encourages personal involvement in restoring the respect for all life.

### **VOCATIONS**

Individuals who work toward increasing awareness of the need for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

## **Worship Commission**

### **ALTAR SERVERS**

Boys and girls in fifth grade and older who assist at liturgical celebrations. Servers are scheduled on a rotating basis and as needed for special occasions. This ministry is also available to high school students and adults. Requirements include: Baptized Catholic; willingness to serve weddings and funerals on occasion; practicing faith (i.e., Sunday Mass attendance, yearly Confession, daily prayer); must attend and pass training class, and have parental consent.

### **ALTAR SOCIETY**

Men and women of the parish who take care of the church and help with general cleaning, caring for the linens, cleaning candlesticks, holy water fonts, etc. The group is divided into teams and each team meets approximately once per month.

### **CHILDREN'S CHOIR**

Children in grades third through eighth who sing for the first Sunday of every month at the 9:00 a.m. Mass and for special occasions. Rehearsal schedule is announced by the director.

### **CHURCH CHOIR**

Music ministry at the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass and for seasonal celebrations. Minimum age is 9th grade.

### **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION**

Parishioners who administer Holy Communion at Masses and bring the Sacrament to homebound parishioners. Training is required. Ministers are scheduled on a rotating basis. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

## **Worship Commission**

### **GREETERS**

Volunteers are a welcoming face for those who enter our church. Greeters help pass out materials and may also be asked to assist in other ways for special liturgies, feasts or special programs held in the church. The only requirement is a friendly smile and a desire to make parishioners and visitors feel welcome at Sacred Heart. Greeter assignments are on a rotating basis; no scheduled meetings for this ministry.

### **READERS**

Parishioners who proclaim the Word of God at Masses and other services. Readers are scheduled on a rotating basis. Training is required. Please call the Parish Office for more information.

### **SEASONAL LITURGICAL DÉCOR**

Volunteers design and prepare the seasonal decor of the church. Commitments usually involve Christmas decorating, building the crib scene, making floral arrangements, and other tasks as needed.

### **SUNDAY NURSERY**

Volunteers provide a safe environment of Christian love for young children, six months to five years of age, during the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. Must work well with young children and be 14 or older. Volunteers 18 years and older must complete Safe in Place training and background check requirements. **Commitment involves 1-1/2 hours per week on a rotating basis.**

### **USHER SOCIETY**

Women and men at weekend liturgies who greet parishioners, coordinate offertory processions, collect offerings, etc. You may serve at the Mass of your choice. Minimum age is 14.
