When are Mass times and Confessions?

There are seven weekend Masses and two each weekday, so plenty to choose from! The schedule is as follows:

Saturday Vigil: 5:00 p.m. & 6:30 p.m.

Sunday: 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 12:00 p.m. & 5:00 p.m.

Weekdays: Monday-Thursday, 8:15 a.m. & 5:30 p.m.; Friday, 6:20 a.m. and 8:15 a.m.

Saturday, 8:15 a.m. (Communion Service)

Confessions are offered on Saturdays from 3:30-4:30 p.m., Monday-Thursday from 5:00-5:20 p.m., and anytime by appointment at the Parish Office.

Speaking of the Parish Office, where is that?

It's the gray house just east of the church, open Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., and we love visitors!

Who is St. Columbkille, anyway?

St. Columbkille was one of the great saints of Ireland, and a missionary to Scotland. Born in 521, he spent his life writing poetry and music, establishing churches and monasteries, preaching the gospel, and painting manuscripts. By the time he was 25, he had founded 27 monasteries and 40 churches. His name means "Dove of the Church" in Gaelic. St. Columbkille lived, with every ounce of his energy, the commission of Jesus to "go and make disciples". In short, he was a pretty cool guy.

Hospitality – Welcoming all, with Christian kindness Prayer – A heart-to-heart with God Formation – Continuous conversion Service - Love in action





LECTORS


